Announcements

Dean Braun opened the meeting and walked attendees through the agenda, he then provided an update on several initiatives underway within the college:

- Faculty Governance Committee The Faculty Governance Committee has been formed and will be led by Daria Kotys-Schwartz, Shelly Miller, and Scott Summers. The next meeting of the Faculty Governance Committee is scheduled for September 17 at 3 pm. If anyone has questions about the Committee and the work they are doing, they should feel free to reach out to any of the committee chairs directly.
- Mental Health and Wellness Over the summer the college completed formation of the Student Mental Health Committee. The committee is open to all college faculty and staff. Rhonda Hoenigman, as the new AD for Undergraduate Education, will support the work of the committee. Dean Braun encouraged all CEAS faculty and staff to review the statement of shared values around mental health that was circulated in August. Discussion and feedback is encouraged. Dean Braun will call for a vote at the end of the semester at a college town hall to adopt the statement part of CEAS's stated goals.
- Aerospace Campaign CEAS has achieved and surpassed its fundraising goal for the new
 aerospace building. Dean Braun expressed his gratitude not only to advancement team but to
 everyone in the college who provided support during the campaign. Fulfilling this financial
 commitment implies that the college will not need to mortgage its future operations budgets to
 accommodate a shortfall. This effort benefited the Departments of Aerospace Engineering
 Sciences, Computer Science, Electrical, Computer and Electrical Engineering, and Mechanical
 Engineering.
- Accommodations Room The engineering center now has a dedicated space for testing
 accommodations. The space is located in ECAE 104 and will be available for use for the entire
 academic year. Instructors needing to reserve space for students can do so via a google doc
 which has been circulated. Any specific questions regarding accommodation qualifications and
 guidelines should always be directed to campus disability services.
- Admin Council members should make it a priority to communicate items discussed in this forum to the faculty and staff in their units.

Benefit Restructuring

Dean Braun welcomed Ann Schmiesing and Carla Ho-a to the meeting to discuss the Fund 10 benefits assessment efforts underway across campus. Carla shared that she and Ann were visiting units across the campus to answer questions and provide an update on where the process is. The assessment process began this past spring and continued thru the summer. Working groups were formed with members from across the campus participating. From CEAS, working group members are – Mike Hannigan, Rory Korpela, Keith Molenaar, Charles Musgrave, Bobby Schnabel and Doug Smith. The campus goal is to have a shared solution in place by November. Any agreed to changes will take effect on or after July 1, 2020.

PhD Student Enrollment

Keith Molenaar and Massimo Ruzzene provided the council with an overview of the current PhD student enrollment and college funding. The number of PhD students graduated declined this past year and the college needs to consider what it can do moving forward. Funds available for TAs and college fellowships is higher than our peers yet we have fewer students. Questions for the departments to consider: is the college using the funds in the most useful way?; how does each department use the funds?; are there ideas to utilize this same funding in a more productive way?

Dean Braun asked the departments to meet with Massimo to discuss how they use the budgeted funds. The goal is to have any policy changes in place before graduate recruiting season begins.

The GEC will hear from Keith and Massimo on this topic at their next meeting.

Staff Council Update

Cherie Summers provided an update on the newly formed Staff Council. The council has been very active in the last month establishing structure, goals and by-laws. Currently there are 17 representatives on the staff council and they will serve a term of two years. The council officers are:
