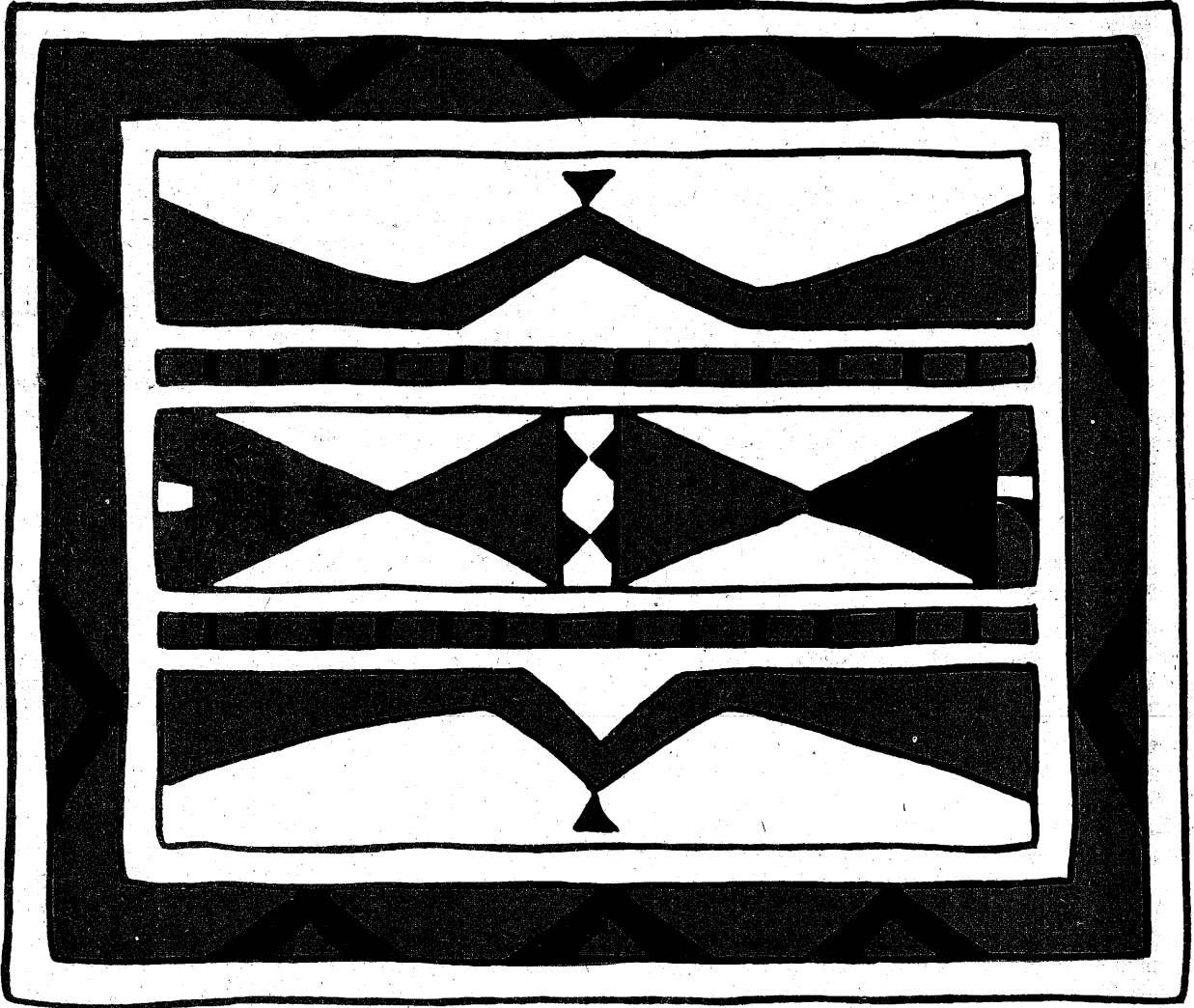

Fall 1990 Academic Calendar

April 2-30 (Monday-Monday)

Fall 1990 confirmed registration for continuing degree students enrolled during spring 1990. All continuing students who plan to enroll for fall 1990, including graduate students, should register at this time.

May 1-July 20 (Tuesday-Friday)

Schedule adjustment for continuing degree students.

Fall 1990 confirmed registration for new graduate and readmitted students.

July 13 (Friday)

Fall 1990 registration deposit due for continuing students (\$100 in-state or \$300 out-of-state), 4:00 p.m.

July 22-August 3 (Sunday-Friday)

Fall 1990 course request registration for eligible new students.

August 5-17 (Sunday-Friday)

Schedule adjustment for all continuing students who have completed confirmed registration.

August 19-22 (Sunday-Wednesday)

Course request registration for eligible new students.

August 22 (Wednesday)

Fall 1990 on-campus course request registration for students who have not registered and who are not required to attend an orientation. This is the last chance to register for fall classes. See page 9.

August 27 (Monday)

Schedule/bill distribution, five locations, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. See page 5.

Schedule adjustment begins for those students with August 27 time assignments.

August 28 (Tuesday)

Schedule adjustment continues. No classes.

Chancellor's convocation for new students, Events/Conference Center, 4:00 p.m.

Faculty and staff registration begins.

August 29 (Wednesday)

Classes begin, 8:00 a.m. Schedule adjustment continues.

August 30-31 (Thursday-Friday)

Registration for space-available voluntary education (SAVE) classes, Events/Conference Center, 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

September 3 (Monday)

Labor Day. No classes.

September 4-5 (Tuesday-Wednesday)

On-campus registration for senior auditors, Koenig Alumni Center (Tuesday, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.; Wednesday, 9:00 a.m. to noon).

September 7 (Friday)

Tuition and fees due (including room and board, etc.) by 4:00 p.m. No grace period.

September 14 (Friday)

Last day to add a course, including independent study and thesis. This deadline will be in effect unless enrollment levels have already been reached.

Last day to drop a course without being assessed the tuition and fees for that course and without a W showing on your transcript.

All transactions must be completed by 4:00 p.m. to be computed for any tuition and fee adjustment. After this date, you must be passing your course to receive approval to drop, and you must have the signature of your instructor.

Last day to change pass/fail and no credit status on courses.

Last day to withdraw from school and be assessed only your registration or confirmation deposit (\$100 in-state or \$300 out-of-state). Refer to page 12.

September 28 (Friday)

Last day to withdraw from school and be assessed only 40 percent of full tuition and fees.

October 9 (Tuesday)

Last day to drop a class without petitioning your dean, 4:00 p.m. Instructor's approval is required.

October 12 (Friday)

Last day to withdraw from school and be assessed only 60 percent of full tuition and fees. After this day, 100 percent of tuition and fees are due.

Last day to pay any unpaid balance, including approved deferred tuition, by 4:00 p.m. No grace period.

October 29-31 (Monday-Wednesday)

On-campus distribution of spring 1991 registration materials, 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., in the UMC Ballroom. On Tuesday, October 30, materials will be available from 4:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. in Regent foyer.

November 12-December 11 (Monday-Tuesday)

Spring 1991 confirmed registration for continuing degree students enrolled during fall 1990.

All transactions must be completed by 4:00 p.m. for any tuition and fee adjustment. After this date, you must be passing your course to receive approval to drop, and you must have the signature of your instructor. Last day to change pass/fail and no credit status on courses.

Last day to withdraw from school and be assessed only your registration or confirmation deposit (\$100 in-state or \$300 out-of-state).

September 28 (Friday)

Last day to withdraw from school and be assessed an amount equal to 40 percent of tuition and mandatory fees.

October 9 (Tuesday)

Last day to drop a class (by 4:00 p.m.) without petitioning your dean. Instructor's approval is required.

October 12 (Friday)

Last day to withdraw from school and be assessed an amount equal to 60 percent of tuition and mandatory fees. After this day, 100 percent of tuition and fees is assessed.

Last day to pay any unpaid balance, including approved deferred tuition, by 4:00 p.m. **No grace period.**

October 29-31 (Monday-Wednesday)

On-campus distribution of spring 1991 registration materials, 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., in the UMC Ballroom. On Tuesday, October 30, materials will be available from 4:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. in the foyer of Regent Administrative Center.

November 12 through December 11

Things to Do Today

Update Your Addresses

Check the addresses on your schedule/bill. Are they current? If you need to make any changes, please pick up a green address form at the address table. Sign your form and drop it in the box labeled "Address Forms."

Your **mailing** address should be the address where you are now living. We will send you financial aid information, bills, registration updates, and other campus mailings to this address through mid-May, 1991. Please keep it current! **NOTE:** Dorm students must be sure to make any address changes with their dorm office as well as with the registrar's office.

Your **permanent** address is considered your "home-base" address. This can be your parents' address, a Boulder address where you reside all year, or the address of someone who knows how to reach you.

During the semester, you'll be able to change your addresses between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., Monday-Friday, in the registrar's office. You can also phone (303) 492-6581 to update your address.

Earlier this year, our new student address locator computer system (AL) became available at terminals located in UMC 165, the financial aid office, and in the lobby of Regent Administrative Center. You can now check your addresses on-line.

Validate Your Student Photo ID

Your CU-Boulder student photo ID will be validated when you pick up your schedule/bill. If you forget your photo ID when you come to pick up your schedule, you will have to validate your ID later. Bring your schedule and your ID to the registrar's office, to UMC 165 (beginning September 4), or to a central drop/add location, and you will receive your validation sticker then. All students should have a validated CU-Boulder photo ID.

Schedule Adjustment—Dropping and Adding Courses via CU Connect

When Can I Call CU Connect?

CU Connect will be available to some groups of students for listing, dropping, and adding courses on August 27, 28, and 29 by time assignment only. Check your schedule to see if you have a CU Connect time assignment. If none appears, you are not eligible to drop or add courses via CU Connect until August 30, when all students may call CU Connect to drop or add courses. Since most students are given group time assignments, some of you may want to call *sometime* during your time assignment period rather than *exactly* at its starting time.

Dropping and Adding via CU Connect

Call CU Connect (938-8110), from any touch-tone telephone. The telephone voice will request the information below. (Press the star [*] or pound [#] keys, as requested.)

- the action code, which is **7003#**
- the fall term code, which is **907#**
- your University student number
_ _ _ _ - _ _ _ - _ _ _ _ #
- your personal identification number (PIN) _ _ _ _ #

To **add** a course, press **2*** before the call number (whether it's a course, lab, or recitation). For example, enter **2*** and the course call number; then, press the **#** key.

To **drop** a course, press **3*** before the call number (whether it's a course, lab, or recitation); then, press the **#** key.

If you are unable to add the course you want, please read the sections "Using the Search Feature" on page 7 of this Guide and "Using Wait Lists" on page 9, in case these options are available.

The deadline for dropping and adding courses for fall semester is **4:00 p.m., Friday, September 14**. Please make your changes well in advance of this date to avoid the deadline rush.

If you need help dropping or adding classes via CU Connect, please call our **help line** at **492-1033** (available 8:30 a.m.-noon and 1:00 p.m.-4:00 p.m., Monday-Friday). Persons from our office are available to give you personal assistance.

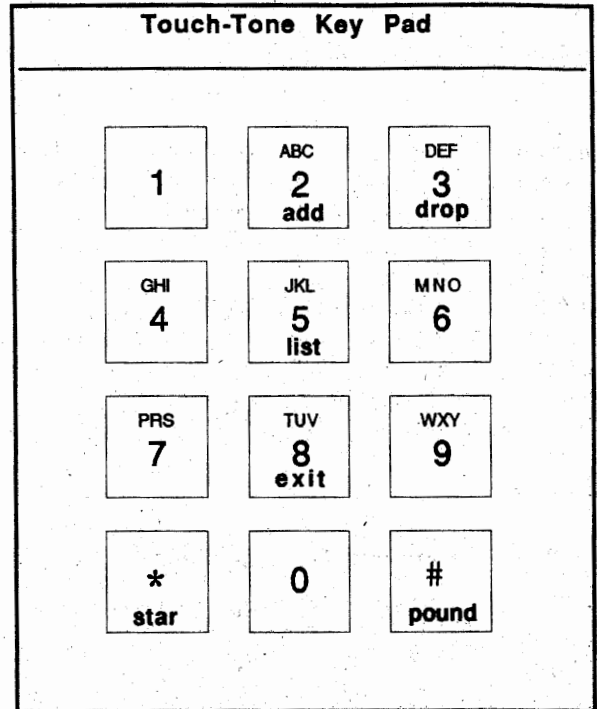
Protecting Your Privacy

Remember to keep your PIN (personal identification number) confidential. Your PIN and student ID number are the keys to your student file, which only you and authorized University offices should have access to. If your PIN is known to someone other than yourself, you can have a new PIN assigned to you. Come to the registrar's office in Regent 125, and we will make the change for you.

CU Connect Function Codes

Following is a list of CU Connect function codes you can use to register, with a brief description of each. (Please refer to the figure of the touch-tone key pad at right as you read the descriptions.)

- * #** Cancels an entry (if you have not already pressed the # key). You may then reenter your request.
- 2 *** Adds a course (if entered before the call number).
- 3 *** Drops a course (if entered before the call number).
- 5 #** Lists your current schedule.
- 8 #** Exits you from the system.
- #** This function code is required at the end of each transaction.



Adjusting Your Schedule

Using the Search Feature

When using CU Connect, if you request a course that has been cancelled or is closed, CU Connect will prompt you to search for another section that is available. CU Connect will first look for another section of the course at the same time. If one is not available, then CU Connect will search for any section that is open, beginning with the first available section that fits into your schedule.

Time Changes

Departments must sometimes make a change in the time a course is offered **after** the *Schedule of Courses* is published. In this case, the original section is cancelled and a new section (reflecting the time change) is added. Should you request a cancelled course, CU Connect will prompt you to search for an open section that will fit in your schedule.

Changing Sections or Changing Pass/Fail, No Credit, and Variable Credit Status

For any of the following activities regarding a course in which *you are already enrolled*, you should go to a terminal and have a drop/add assistant make any of the following adjustments:

- changing grading status to pass/fail, or vice versa
- changing grading status from credit to no credit, or vice versa
- changing the credit load in a variable credit class
- making a section change

In order to make any of these adjustments, a course must be dropped and then immediately added. If you make these changes via CU Connect, there is the possibility you won't be able to add a course once you have dropped it. Therefore, **for your own protection**, please have a drop/add assistant help you at a terminal.

If you are sure you will not lose your class by dropping it via CU Connect, drop your course, and then do the following:

For **pass/fail**—Select the pass/fail grading option by pressing ***2** between the course call number and the #. For example: enter **2*** and the course call number (just as if you were adding a course), and then enter ***2#**. (Information about pass/fail grading restrictions can be found in the catalog.)

For **no credit**—Select a course for no credit by pressing ***1** between the course call number and the #. For example: enter **2*** and the course call number (just as if you were adding a course), and then enter ***1#**. (Information on "no credit" can be found in the catalog.)

NOTE: CU Connect does not indicate if you successfully completed either of these transactions. To be certain these transactions have occurred, have any drop/add assistant at a terminal check your class schedule for you.

Controlled Enrollment and Independent Study Courses

These courses can only be **added** by the department offering the course or by having a special action form filled out. If you use a special action form, take the completed form to a central drop/add location, along with your student photo ID, and have the form processed.

Note, however, that controlled enrollment and independent study courses can be dropped by telephone or at a terminal without getting a special action form.

If you are enrolled in an independent study course, refer to the Catalog and to the *Schedule of Courses* so you are familiar with the drop/add policy of your college or school.

Drop/Add Deadlines

Remember: the drop/add deadline is 4:00 p.m., **Friday, September 14**. After that time, no adds will be permitted, and no tuition adjustments will be made for drops.

After September 14 and through October 9 (4:00 p.m.), you must be passing a course to drop it, and a special action form must be completed by your instructor.

After October 9, you cannot drop a course unless there are circumstances clearly beyond your control (accident, illness, and so on). To drop a class after October 9, you must have your instructor's approval, as well as the approval of your dean. You must have their signatures on your special action form, or it cannot be processed.

The add deadline of September 14 will be in effect (unless enrollment levels have been reached before that date). Do not put off adding or dropping a class! Courses dropped by September 14 will not appear on your University of Colorado transcript. Courses dropped after September 14 will appear on your transcript with a grade of **W**.

In certain classes, you may be administratively dropped for nonattendance. Departments following this policy are listed in the *Schedule of Courses*; students are also advised of this policy on course syllabi. In the absence of such a statement, the policy is not enforced.

Using Wait Lists

What Are Wait Lists

If you try to register for a course but find it is closed, you may be able to put your name on a *wait list*. A wait list is a registration device that allows students to place their names on a list for a course that is currently filled but may have openings later in the registration process. Each department determines if a wait list will be offered for a course and what type of wait list will be used. (There are two types.)

The first type of wait list is based on a first-come, first-served policy. As a vacancy occurs in a class, the person at the top of the list is automatically enrolled.

The second type of wait list uses a priority system to determine who gets to enroll in the course when a space opens up. The priority is established by the department and is usually based on class standing and/or major.

Getting On a Wait List

If a wait list exists for a course that is closed, you can request to be placed on the list, either at a drop/add terminal or by using CU Connect. If you're using CU Connect and you wish to be added to a wait list, press 9# when prompted by the telephone voice and listen for the course verification. Be aware that wait-listed courses are included in the 21 credit-hour-load maximum. Also note that you cannot be enrolled in one section of a course while also being on a wait list for another section of the same course.

Updating Your Schedule

If you are on a wait list for a course you no longer desire, please drop it as soon as possible. You must drop the course by the drop/add deadline of 4:00 p.m., September 14. The procedure is the same to drop your name from a wait list as it is to drop a course: enter 3*, then the course call number, then #.

Verifying Your Enrollment

You are responsible for verifying your enrollment status in courses in which you are on a wait list. It's easy to do! You can check your wait-list status at one of the central drop/add locations. Then, beginning August 30, you can also call CU Connect and use the list function to verify your enrollment.

PLEASE NOTE: If you become enrolled from a wait list in a course you don't want, and you don't drop the course by September 14, **you will be charged additional tuition for that course, if applicable.** Also, **failure to attend a course you are enrolled in will result in a failing grade.** Remember: only *you* are responsible for checking your status on a wait list.

Deadline for Wait Lists: September 11

You will be able to place your name on wait lists through Tuesday, September 11. If you are still on a wait list as of September 12, and you are still interested in taking the class, please see the department offering the course. You must let the department know you are still interested in the course, should an opening occur. **There is no automatic enrollment from a wait list after September 11.** All department wait lists will be cancelled after 4:00 p.m. on September 14, the last day to drop or add classes.

September 14

Through September 14, remember to regularly check your enrollment and wait-list status with CU Connect. Drop any classes you no longer want (including wait-listed classes) by 4:00 p.m. on that day. (Dropping courses sooner may open up spaces for your fellow students.)

If you forget that you are on a wait list and are placed in a class and do not drop it by September 14, please understand that there will be both financial and academic repercussions for you!

Tuition and Fee Information

Understanding Your Tuition and Fee Bill

Your tuition and fee bill is based on the number of credit hours for which you are enrolled at the time the bill is calculated. **This is the only tuition bill you will receive before the September 7 due date.** No duplicates will have been mailed to any other address. Only later, adjusted bills will be sent to the address you indicate as your mailing address. **Failure to receive a tuition and fee bill does not relieve you of your obligation to pay your bill on time.**

Residency Status Change

If you have received notification of a change in your residency status and it is incorrect on your bill, check with the Bursar's Office, Regent 150, for the correct amount of tuition due.

Paying Your Bill

Your full tuition and fee payment is due by **4:00 p.m., Friday, September 7.** If you drop or add courses that cause a change in your financial obligation, a second tuition and fee bill will be sent to your mailing address. This second bill (indicating unpaid or not previously billed amounts), will be due by 4:00 p.m., October 12. **The first bill is still due by September 7.** After September 14, courses added may change your tuition, but courses dropped will not.

It is important for you to understand the penalties created by failing to meet a published payment due-date. Please refer to page 8 in the *Schedule of Courses*.

NOTE: A tuition surcharge is assessed for every credit hour over 18, with the exception of students in the School of Pharmacy, who are assessed for every credit hour over 17. Tuition for a no-credit course is the same as for a course taken for credit. Tuition for a zero (0) credit-hour course is charged at the rate of a one (1) credit-hour class.

To ensure proper recording of your payment, enclose (in an envelope) the bill top and your payment (in the form of a personal check, certified check, or cashier's check), making sure your name and student number are on the check. Make the check payable to the University of Colorado. **Do not mail cash;** cash payments should be made in person at the cashier's window in the lobby of Regent.

Either use the U.S. Postal Service (the Denver P.O. Box address on the bill is correct) or drop your payment in the tuition drop slots in the lobby of Regent Administrative Center. **Do not use campus mail.**

There will also be tuition-payment drop boxes at the deferred tuition area in the Events/Conference Center, August 27-September 7. If you are using the U.S. Postal Service, please mail early. The University does not assume responsibility for late payments due to mail delays. Payments must be **received, not postmarked**, by the published deadlines. For more information, call (303) 492-5381.

Tuition Payment Option: Deferred Tuition

If you have any doubt at all about being able to pay your full bill by September 7, apply for deferred tuition. With this option, payment of one-half of your total tuition and fee bill can be deferred until October 12. To qualify, your total bill at the time of application for deferred tuition must exceed \$100, and you **MUST** be able to pay one-half of the bill by September 7. The deferred balance is subject to a 1 percent per month finance charge.

If you choose to use this option, you must complete an application form at the southeast concession stand at the Events/Conference Center before September 7. Hours are 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., except for Tuesday, August 28, when the hours are 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Financial Disenrollment Policy

University policy requires us to place financial stops on the records of students who fail to meet their entire tuition and fee bill payment by October 12, 1990. This stop will prevent students from registering for any future terms, receiving a diploma, or receiving a transcript of academic work at the University.

Students who do not pay may be withdrawn for all future terms. Students wishing to attend CU Boulder at any time in the future will then need to reapply for admission to the University as former students, once payment of outstanding tuition and fees, plus late and service charges, are paid.

Student Computing Fee

Effective fall 1990, a student computing fee is included on your tuition and fee bill. The purpose of the fee is to enable basic computing and information services for students. Students enrolled for 6 or fewer credit hours will be charged \$5.00; students enrolled for 7 or more credit hours will be charged \$10.00. For further information, call Suzanne Kincaid, 492-8177.

Scholarship and Loan Information

Scholarships and Grants

If you are registered and have signed and returned your award offer, your scholarship or grant will be applied automatically to your tuition and fee bill. Checks for the balance of your scholarship or grant will be available at the Events/Conference Center. (See "Distribution of Scholarship, Loan, and Grant Checks" at right.)

Perkins Loan

If you have officially been awarded and have accepted your Perkins Loan and have signed your promissory note, your Perkins Loan will be applied to your first bill.

You must sign your promissory note in order for the loan to be credited to your bill. Promissory notes will be available at the Events/Conference Center. (See "Distribution of Scholarship, Loan, and Grant Checks.") If you have any questions about your Perkins Loan, please call (303) 492-8921.

Stafford Loans

Because the disbursement of Stafford funds depends upon outside lenders and agencies, students who receive these loans are responsible for any late or service charges incurred if their tuition and fee bills are not paid in full by September 7, 1990. Stafford loan checks that have been received can be picked up in person at the southeast concession stand in the Events/Conference Center. (See "Distribution of Scholarship, Loan, and Grant Checks.")

All students borrowing a Stafford Loan or Supplemental Loan for Students (SLS) for the first time at CU-Boulder are required to attend an entrance interview before their loan check can be released. Please contact the Office of Financial Aid at 492-5091 for further information.

NOTE: If you have violated the satisfactory progress policy, you will not be eligible for financial aid, including Perkins and Stafford loans.

Distribution of Scholarship, Loan, and Grant Checks

Checks can be picked up at the Events/Conference Center, August 27-September 7, 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday-Friday, except for Tuesday, August 28, when the hours are 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Starting September 10, students may pick up their checks at the Bursar's Office. Perkins promissory notes may be signed at the Student Loan Department in Regent 150. Checks for the balance of a loan will not be automatically mailed.

If You're a Veteran, Dependent of a Veteran, Reservist, or National Guard Member . . .

If you are enrolled for VA educational benefits for fall semester 1990, please verify your class schedule and address with the Veterans' Affairs Office to assure continuance of monthly checks. You can do this beginning August 27 in UMC 165.

Understanding Student Health Insurance

All students taking 6 or more credits are billed automatically for hospital-medical-surgical health insurance as a condition of enrollment. *

If you have your own personal health insurance, you may waive the student health insurance during schedule/bill distribution on August 27, at all three central drop/add locations, or until September 14 at Wardenburg Student Health Service.

If you are registered for 5 credit hours or less and want student health insurance, you need to sign up at Wardenburg no later than September 14. Please call Wardenburg at 492-5107 for more information.

Buying a Parking Permit

From 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, August 26, campus parking permits **will be sold to residence hall students only** at the Events/Conference Center and to **Williams Village residents** at Darley Commons.

Parking permits for all other students will not be sold until Monday, August 27 at the Events/Conference Center (and at the law school for law students) from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. On August 28, permits will be sold at the Events/Conference Center from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

To purchase a parking permit, you must present your class schedule or meal sticker, your photo ID, and your original valid vehicle registration (not a copy). The charge for the permit will be added to your bill. **You may not purchase a permit for another student.**

After August 28, parking permits will be sold at the Parking Management Office, Armory Building, 1511 University Avenue, from 8:00 a.m. to noon and 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. Parking permit cancellations will be accepted beginning September 4, and exchanges can be made beginning September 11.

For Your Information

You May Want to Know About . . .

If You Have to Withdraw

If you decide that you will not attend the University this fall, go to the registrar's office, Regent 125. They will help you complete the withdrawal process. You should be aware of the individual withdrawal policies of your college or school, as well. **Failure to withdraw makes you liable for full tuition and fees.**

Refund Schedule

Please refer to page 12 of the *Schedule of Courses* for information regarding withdrawal procedures and the refund schedule. If you selected fees on the special services form, it is your responsibility to inquire with those departments about possible refunds. Refunds are not given automatically.

Double-Degree Programs

Students who are working in a double-degree program (for example, obtaining one degree from arts and sciences and a second degree from business) should verify that both programs are entered on the student information system (SIS). Check with either of your dean's offices to see if they are. We don't want you to be closed out of required classes during fall drop/add! If you have questions concerning your double-degree program, check with either of your deans.

Looking Ahead

Registration time assignments for spring 1991 begin November 12. Your registration materials will be *distributed on campus*, October 29-31, 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., in the UMC Ballroom. There will be extended hours to pick up your materials on Tuesday, October 30, from 4:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. in the foyer of Regent Administrative Center. Look for details in the campus newspapers and on flyers during the month of October.

New Enrollment Deposit

Effective spring 1991, all continuing students will pay a **one-time-only refundable enrollment deposit of \$200**. (Both in-state and out-of-state students will pay the same deposit.) The new registration deposit must be paid by 4:00 p.m., Friday, December 7, 1990.

The new \$200 deposit will **not** be credited toward tuition and fees. It will be refunded to you upon your graduation or upon official withdrawal within established guidelines. Interest earned from these deposits will be used toward financial aid for eligible CU-Boulder students.

This *Schedule of Courses* contains an up-to-date academic calendar, information on telephone registration, course listings for spring 1990, and policies and services to help you through the semester. All students receive one free copy before registration. Additional copies must be purchased from the Book Center for \$1.00.

The requirements, policies, and course descriptions of each college and school are printed in the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog*. You are responsible for knowing and following those policies and for familiarizing yourself with the course listings. Please refer to the catalog edition corresponding to your year of entry into CU-Boulder for graduation requirements. When you declare or change your major, however, be sure to check with your new dean's office regarding applicable requirements.

Although this schedule was prepared on the basis of the best information available at the time, all information is subject to change. Because of the lead time required to publish both the schedule and the catalog, changes may occur in University, college, or school policies. It is your responsibility to be aware of such changes by consulting departmental advisers, checking departmental bulletin boards, and reading your registration instructions carefully.

Confirmed Registration—Continuing, New Graduate, and Readmitted Students

The Office of the Registrar will be conducting two types of registration for fall semester 1990:

1—immediate, confirmed registration for those students who are continuing on with degree programs, as well as for new graduate students and readmitted students (see this page), and

2—course request registration for new freshman and transfer students (see page 3).

Receiving Your Materials

Continuing, new graduate, and readmitted students receive a registration packet including:

- an invitation to register
- registration instructions
- confirmed registration form
- registration deposit form and envelope
- special services form and envelope
- Wardenburg student health insurance waiver

Registering for Courses via CU Connect

As a continuing undergraduate or graduate student, a new graduate student, or a readmitted student, you'll be able to call CU Connect and receive immediate enrollment confirmation for the classes you request. You may call from either an on-campus or off-campus touch-tone phone.

You'll need to call CU Connect during your time assignment (indicated on your invitation to register) or any time thereafter. It's important for you to call as soon as possible, however, as confirmed registration is on a first-come, first-served basis. Classes will fill up throughout the registration period.

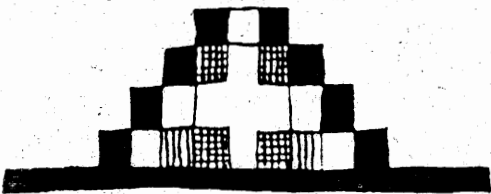
Confirmed registration for continuing undergraduate and graduate students will take place during the month of April, with much of the summer available for making schedule adjustments (see the academic calendar for specific dates).

New graduate and readmitted students will be mailed their registration materials and can register May 1 through July 20 or August 5 through 17.

Registration time assignments for continuing students are based on the following priorities:

- seniors
- graduate and law students
- freshmen
- juniors
- sophomores

Detailed instructions on all of these procedures are included in your registration packet.

Using a Wait List

Throughout registration, if you are eligible to take a course but find that it has been closed, you may be able to put your name on a computerized wait list. Each department determines if wait lists will be offered and what type of lists will be used.

The first type of wait list is set up on a first-come, first-served basis. As a vacancy occurs in a class, the person at the top of the list is automatically enrolled.

The second type of wait list uses priority coding to determine who gets enrolled in a course as spaces open up. The coding is established by the department, and is usually based on class standing and/or major. Be sure to read the information on wait lists on page 6.

Follow the instructions on the back of the confirmed registration form to add your name to a wait list.

Paying Your Registration Deposit

To successfully complete registration, all continuing students must register for courses and pay or waive their registration deposit (\$100 for in-state students and \$300 for out-of-state students) by the July 13 (4:00 p.m.) deadline. If you do not pay the deposit, you will be removed from your confirmed classes and they will be made available for other students to add. You will then have to re-register at a later date, if space in the University is still available. In addition, a late registration fee may be assessed.

All Students Please Note

If you plan to attend the University this fall, you must register for courses this spring. Paying your deposit is only part of the process—it will not hold a place for you. You must register *and* pay your deposit by the established deadlines to secure yourself a place for fall semester 1990.

Adjusting Your Schedule

Once you have registered, you'll be able to make adjustments to your schedule by calling CU Connect and dropping or adding classes. Refer to the back of the confirmed registration form for instructions. You will have much of the summer to make changes (see the academic calendar for specific dates). As always, you'll be able to adjust your schedule once classes have begun (see page 6).

By calling CU Connect, listing your schedule, and making any needed changes, you will have the schedule you want when you arrive on campus in August.

Receiving Your Schedule/Bill

Although you will know your schedule when you register, you must still pick up your schedule and tuition and fee bill at the beginning of the semester (times and locations are noted on page 5).

A Few Final Words

Registration involves a bit more than last-minute thought. Pay attention to matters such as clearing any stops on your record, paying your deposit on time, getting advising, selecting your courses carefully, and reading all registration materials thoroughly.

Course Request Registration—New Freshman and Transfer Students

If you're a new freshman or transfer student, you'll request courses sometime during the summer. CU Connect will hold your requests until all new students have had a chance to request classes. Then it will run through a series of programs to place you into classes (sectioning). After the schedules are distributed and the semester has begun, you'll be able to make corrections to your class schedule.

Course request registration is not a one-step process but extends over a period of time. The major steps are outlined below.

Orientation

Most undergraduate colleges and schools have a mandatory orientation session for new students. If you are involved in such a program, you will receive your registration materials and request your courses via CU Connect at orientation.

Receiving Your Materials

Students who aren't required to attend an orientation session will receive a course request packet in the mail. Registration materials for all new freshman and transfer students include:

- an invitation to register
- course request registration instructions
- course request registration form
- special services form and envelope
- Wardenburg student health insurance waiver

Requesting Courses via CU Connect

With the above materials, you will be able to call CU Connect to request your classes. You'll need to use a touch-tone phone, and you may call either from on campus or off campus. Although you won't be permitted to call before your assigned time period (indicated on your invitation to register), you may call at that time or any time thereafter until August 22 at 4:00 p.m.

All of the detailed instructions you will need are included in your course request packet.

Please Note: You *must* request classes by the established deadlines to secure yourself a place for fall semester 1990.

Fine Tuning Your Course Requests

Once you have made your requests by telephone, they are stored in the computer. This allows you to make changes to your requests during the request period noted on your invitation to register.

Make use of this telephone course request period wisely: by calling CU Connect, listing your requests, and then changing those requests or adding alternate selections, you can fine tune your requested schedule.

Sectioning of Course Requests

CU Connect takes the requests of all students and checks to make sure that confirmation deposits have been paid and that there are no financial or academic stops. Then, through a complex process, students are placed in courses. There are many determinations the computer must make before placing students, such as space availability and student eligibility. Spaces in many classes have been specifically reserved for new students.

Receiving Your Schedule/Bill

Registration is not considered complete and schedules are not official until all course information has been transferred to your schedule/bill, which is then distributed at the beginning of the semester (times and locations noted on page 5).

Adjusting Your Schedule

After you have received your schedule, you can make adjustments by dropping or adding classes as needed. This final adjustment period runs for the first three weeks of the semester (dates are listed in the academic calendar on the inside front cover). Please see page 6 of this publication for further information about schedule adjustment.

During final schedule adjustment, you can make necessary changes to your schedule, but you should not completely redo your schedule. If you carefully select your courses and pay close attention to prerequisites and potential time conflicts, you won't need to extensively drop or add classes.

The locations and methods for schedule adjustment will be outlined in the *Guide to Fall Semester 1990* given out at schedule/bill distribution. This guide contains all of the information you'll need to successfully complete fall registration.

A Few Final Words

For a successful registration, you'll need to pay careful attention to such matters as clearing stops, paying deposits, making careful course selections, and reading all your materials carefully.

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What All Students Should Know Before Registering

Addresses—Important!

Please keep your addresses updated at all times. An incorrect mailing address, in particular, will keep important registration materials and information from reaching you (we may need to contact you regarding course changes or cancellations).

There are also other addresses on your student record you will want to keep current, such as a permanent address.

You may update your address at the registrar's office in Regent Administrative Center or UMC 165, or you may call (303) 492-6581. You can specify which address you are updating when you fill out the change of address form or when you call.

Now, you can also verify your addresses via the address locator computer system at terminals in UMC 165, the lobby of Regent Administrative Center, and the financial aid office.

Advising

Some colleges and schools require that students speak to an adviser before registering for courses. If you receive such a message on your invitation to register or when you call CU Connect, and you are an arts and sciences or engineering student, call your faculty adviser or your major department to make arrangements for advising.

If you are a student in any other college or school and you receive an advising message, you should call your dean's office.

After you have been advised, the coding on the computer will be adjusted and you may call CU Connect to register.

Credit Hour Limits

There are limits on the number of credit hours for which you may register (refer to your registration form). Please check with your dean's office or the catalog for the maximum number of credit hours that may apply to your degree.

Independent Study/Thesis Approval and Controlled Enrollment

If you are interested in taking a course with an 800- or 900-level section number, you'll need to contact the department for a course call number before you register. Please see your registration form for further information.

No Credit

You can select classes on a no credit basis (an NC will appear on your transcript in place of a grade) during registration or schedule adjustment. However, tuition is the same, whether or not credit is received in a course. Please check with your college or school or the catalog for policies on no credit status and how it may be used.

Pass/Fail

You will be able to select classes on a pass/fail basis throughout registration and schedule adjustment. Please check with your college or school; there are restrictions on the number of courses and the types of courses that can be taken pass/fail.

Once you've signed up for a course pass/fail, your name (but not the pass/fail designation) will appear on the class roster. Your professor will assign you a grade for the class. A grade of D- or above is automatically converted by the registrar's office to a P; an F converts to an F. Only the F is calculated as part of your GPA; a grade of P is not counted.

Stops on Your Registration

When you call CU Connect, you may get a message that you have a stop on your record. Stops are holds that the University puts on student records for various reasons. They originate from financial obligations, academic concerns, or even disciplinary matters. You will not be allowed to register until the stop has been cleared. Please check with the office imposing the stop on how to clear it, and get it taken care of so you may register for classes.

Most often, you will know about a stop before calling CU Connect, because your invitation to register will display a printed message about it. However, stops can occur at any time in the registration process, so you should make it a point to know the status of your student record.

Note: If you have unpaid University debts, you *may be withdrawn* from your fall classes.

Variable Credit

When requesting a variable credit course (one with a range of minimum and maximum credits), you need to decide with your professor how many credits you would like to receive in that course. Simply indicate this when prompted by CU Connect.

You do not have to arrive at 8:30 a.m.—schedule/bills will be available all day. However, your schedule/bill will contain your drop/add time assignment, and will be necessary for purchasing a parking permit. You can avoid the crowds by picking up your schedule a bit later in the day.

Try to pick up your schedule/bill on August 27. If a University error has occurred with your schedule, it can best be corrected on that day.

If you do not pick up your schedule/bill on August 27, it will be available from August 28 to August 31 at the UMC West Ballroom. After these dates, schedule/bills need to be picked up at the Office of the Registrar in Regent 125, between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

Important!

This first schedule/bill will be the only one you'll receive before the tuition due date of September 7. Additional revised bills will be mailed after that date if you have amounts still unpaid on your record.

Parking Permits

On Sunday, August 26, from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., campus parking permits will be sold to residence hall students at the Events/Conference Center and to Williams Village residents at Darley Commons.

Parking permits for all other students will be sold on Monday, August 27 at the Events/Conference Center (at the law school for law students) from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

On Tuesday, August 28, permits will be sold at the Events/Conference Center from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. After August 28, parking permits will be sold at the Parking Management Office 1511 University Avenue), 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

You'll need to bring your schedule/bill and a photo ID with you, along with current motor vehicle registration. Permits for the fall semester sell for between \$34 and \$56, depending on location. Prices are subject to change.

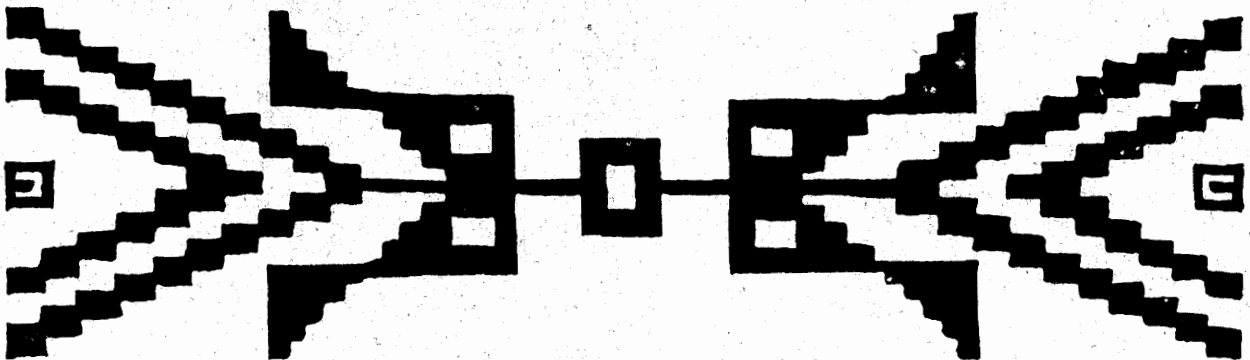
Photo IDs

Your validated photo ID is an important identification card to carry with you. It signifies that you are a currently registered student and allows you to use University services.

To get an ID made, go to the Stadium, Room 129 (between gates 4 and 5), Monday through Friday between 11:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. On August 27, the Photo ID office will be open from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

You'll need to take some other form of picture ID with you. Your initial ID is free; replacement cards cost \$7. (Continuing education and SAVE students must pay \$7; they do not receive an initial free ID.)

IDs will be validated for fall semester 1990 at schedule/bill distribution sites and at central schedule adjustment locations.



Schedule Adjustment

You may call CU Connect during your registration period to list your selections and to adjust your schedule by adding or dropping classes. Your CU Connect instructions and registration form list the function codes you'll need to use when calling.

Once the semester begins, terminals will be set up throughout the campus, and you may drop or add any course or change sections at a location that is convenient for you.

A CU Connect drop/add time assignment will be provided on some students' schedules during the first three days of schedule adjustment. After that date, all students may use CU Connect to drop and add.

The calendar on the inside cover of this publication lists important drop/add deadlines, and your *Guide to Fall Semester 1990*, given out at schedule/bill distribution, will provide more detailed information about schedule adjustment procedures.

Wait Lists

If you have placed yourself on a wait list during registration or schedule adjustment, it is your responsibility to call CU Connect to find out if you have been enrolled in the class.

When you place your name on a wait list, the total number of students already on the list is announced. As wait list positions constantly change during the registration and schedule adjustment periods, specific position information cannot be made available until the week of August 27, according to your drop/add time assignment.

If you choose not to remain on a wait list, please drop it as soon as possible. Other students will be waiting to enroll in the course.

If you are rolled from a wait list into a class you no longer want and fail to drop it by September 14, *you will be charged additional tuition for the class*. Also, if you do not attend a course you've been rolled into, *you will receive an F for that class*.

Administrative Drops

Administrative drops are initiated by departments. If you have not met all the prerequisites for a course, or if you do not attend your courses regularly during the first few weeks, you may be administratively dropped from any course. Please check with departments for policies concerning administrative drops.

Note on Dropping Courses

Any student who stops attending a course without officially dropping it will receive a grade of F in that course.

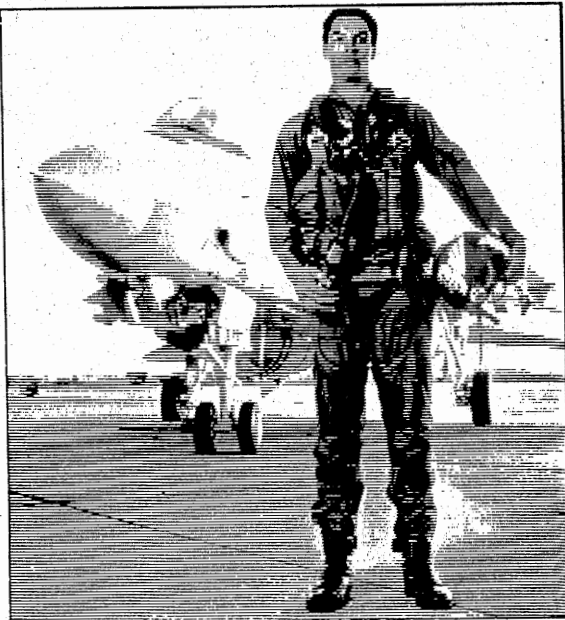

Student Fees

In 1989-90, the student activity fee for students taking only one course (1-5 credit hours) was \$23.22 per semester. All other students paid \$140.05 per semester. Fees are assessed by the University of Colorado Student Union (UCSU). In addition, all students were assessed a nonrefundable \$4 Student Information System fee. Also, students registered for 4 or more credit hours were assessed an athletic fee of \$33.00 each semester by the Board of Regents.

Extra Tuition Surcharge

There will be a surcharge for every credit hour **over 18** you register for and retain past September 14, 1990. This is a change from previous semesters.

Matriculation Fee

There is a one-time nonrefundable matriculation fee of \$15 for new degree students that is assessed at the time of initial registration. The matriculation fee covers processing charges for adding and dropping courses and for official transcripts. A nondegree student who is admitted to degree status will be assessed a \$15 matriculation fee at the time of the student's first registration after the change has been made.

Faculty and Staff Tuition Benefit

Permanent faculty and staff are entitled to 1-6 credit hours at no charge per academic year (summer through spring). Student fees will not be charged for those courses in which a faculty or staff member enrolls between August 28 and September 14. If a faculty or staff member registers early and pays tuition for the course(s), student fees will be charged. Please see page 9 for faculty and staff registration information.

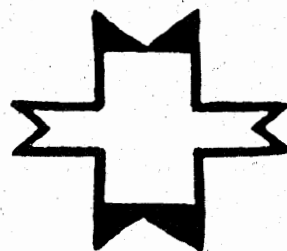
Enrollment Deposit—New!

Effective with registration for spring semester 1991, all continuing students must pay a **one-time-only refundable enrollment deposit** (\$200 for both in-state and out-of-state students). This new deposit replaces the registration deposit and must be paid by Friday, December 7, 1990.

Unlike the registration deposit for fall, which is still due on July 13, 1990, the new enrollment deposit will **not** be credited toward tuition and fees.

The \$200 deposit will be refunded to you when you graduate from the University or officially withdraw within established guidelines.

Interest accruing from the deposits will be used for financial aid for eligible CU-Boulder students.



Paying Your Bill

Your schedule/bill will reflect the total number of credit hours for which you have been enrolled, as well as tuition, fees, housing, and other charges. It is your responsibility to pay the bill by 4:00 p.m. on September 7 (postmarks are not honored) or to arrange to have one-half of it deferred. Even if the bill has been misplaced or you didn't receive a bill, you are responsible for paying the amount owed by the due date. Other things to keep in mind include:

- After September 14, there will be no tuition adjustment for courses dropped. However, tuition for classes added will be assessed and billed.
- Tuition for a no credit course is the same as for a course taken for credit.
- Tuition for a 0 credit-hour course is charged at the rate of a 1 credit-hour class.
- All students taking one course of 5 or fewer hours will be assessed a base fee (\$23.22 was charged in 1989-90) and will receive a no-fees sticker for their ID. These students will not be allowed to use Wardenburg services, unless they pay either a one-time user fee or the established ineligible user fee. They cannot use the Recreation Center and other services without payment. Doctoral students taking thesis hours only, master's candidates for degree, approved doctoral candidates, and fifth-year pharmacy students will pay only the base fee.
- Mandatory UCSU student fees (\$140.05 per semester during 1989-90) are considered as important as tuition and may only be waived due to extraordinary circumstances. If fees are waived, students must still pay the base fee (\$23.22 in 1989-90). Students who wish to petition for a waiver must do so by 4:00 p.m. on September 7. No late petitions will be accepted. Petitions will be picked up and turned in at the Bursar's Office, Regent 150, and must include documentation of the reasons for waiving the fees. In addition, students covered by the student health insurance cannot have their full student fees waived.
- All students enrolled for 6 credit hours or more will automatically be assessed for student health insurance (during 1989-90, the fee was \$273.00 per semester). Students who already have adequate health insurance coverage or personal finances to cover medical expenses may complete a waiver to remove this charge from their bill. Waivers must be received by September 14 to be honored. (Waivers submitted in fall 1990 will extend through spring semester 1991.)

Students are not required to have the insurance plan to use Wardenburg Student Health Service. However, the plan does provide first-dollar coverage for any eligible medical costs incurred at Wardenburg and provides 80 percent coverage after a \$200 deductible is satisfied at other medical facilities. Insurance is also available for spouses and children.

If you are taking one course of 5 or fewer semester hours, supplemental health insurance will be available at the same price full-time students pay. To become eligible to purchase the insurance, you must first pay full UCSU student fees. Exception: approved doctoral candidates requesting student group insurance will be charged full price for the insurance plus the Wardenburg Student Health Service fee (\$70.93 in 1989-90).

Deferred Tuition

You may defer payment of one-half your tuition and fee bill until October 12, 1990. To do so, you'll need to pay the first half of the bill and complete a deferred tuition application on or before September 7. Please be aware that the deferred balance will be subject to a 1 percent per month finance charge. If you have any doubt at all about being able to pay your full bill by the tuition due date, please take advantage of this option.

To qualify for deferred tuition, your total bill at the time of application must exceed \$100, and you must be able to pay at least one-half of the full amount by September 7. The deferred amount will be calculated on the account balance at the time of deferment. Deferred tuition applications will be available at the Events/Conference Center beginning August 27.

Failure to Make Payment in Full by the Deadline

Failure to make the required payment on each due date may result in any or all of the following actions:

- a. You may be disenrolled from the University, becoming ineligible for all University services (see Disenrollment Policy below).
- b. No grades will be issued for courses in progress unless you are reinstated within the prescribed deadlines.
- c. No transcripts, diplomas, certification, or registration materials will be issued for you until your bill is paid in full.
- d. A late payment charge in addition to a service charge (1 percent per month) on the unpaid balance will be assessed according to the following schedule:

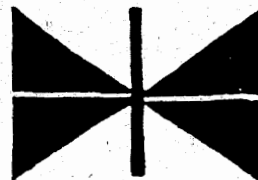
- e. A late registration fee may be charged if you have been financially disenrolled (see Disenrollment Policy below).

Disenrollment Policy

Students who fail to meet their entire tuition and fee obligations by October 12, 1990, are subject to disenrollment from the University.

Students who are disenrolled remain liable for full payment of all unpaid charges, including tuition and fees.

Please refer to the registrar's office for more information on the disenrollment policy.



Other Registrations

Concurrent Registration

If you plan to take at least one course at Boulder in the fall but cannot obtain course work required for your degree program, you may be able to register concurrently on another CU campus. The course work must be required for your degree program, you must have your dean's permission, and enrollment levels must not have been reached on the other campus. Graduate students must also have their adviser's approval. If all these conditions are met, you can register for up to two courses or 6 credit hours, whichever is greater, on another CU campus.

Business students may only exercise the concurrent registration option if they are in their graduating semester. Those business students who are two semesters from graduation and who cannot obtain a course necessary to complete a prerequisite sequence may also be allowed to use this option. The course must be required for graduation and must not be offered on the Boulder campus, or the course must conflict with another required course in which the student is already enrolled. Other students wishing to take a business course concurrently must obtain the signature of the dean of Boulder's College of Business and Administration.

Concurrent registration forms and instructions will be available at the registrar's office in Regent Administrative Center between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. beginning August 20. You cannot register concurrently until after drop/add has begun on the other campus. Boulder students will pay Boulder tuition rates for all classes.

Intercampus Registration

If you would like to take course work on another campus of the University of Colorado, you may be able to register directly on that campus. However, you must apply for admission to that campus and follow its registration procedures. Please check with your dean's office for approval. (Arts and sciences students may not register at the Denver or Colorado Springs campus except in the summer.)

On-Campus Registration

Students who have not registered for fall before August 21 may pick up course request registration materials in the UMC Ballroom on August 22 between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Telephone registration must be completed by 5:00 p.m. on August 22. Students who have not registered by 5:00 p.m. may not be able to register at a later time, unless their category is open for late registration. In addition, lower priority and late fees will apply.

Note: This registration does not apply to students who must attend a required orientation program.

Registration for Faculty and Staff

All permanent faculty and staff members at the University may take 1 to 6 free credit hours each year. The academic year begins with summer session, and the number of free hours is determined on a prorated basis from full-time status. Enrollment usually occurs on a space-available basis in conjunction with late registration, unless the faculty or staff member wishes to register early. In that event, registration takes place via CU Connect in April, and full tuition and fees are charged.

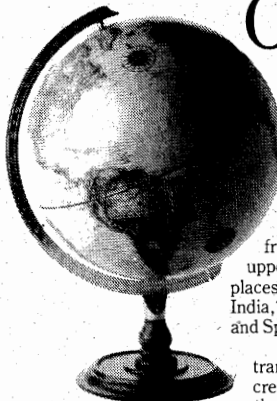
Faculty and staff members who enroll as nondegree students will need to take a copy of their current personnel action form and a nondegree student application to the Bursar's Office, Regent 150, by July 27. Office hours are 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. (Faculty and staff who were enrolled as nondegree students on the Boulder campus during spring semester 1990 will be set up automatically for fall 1990, although application for free credit hours must be made separately each semester.)

Faculty and staff students applying to a degree program should follow the regular application procedures established by the Office of Admissions. However, in order to apply for the free credit hours, the application form and current PAF should be submitted to the Bursar's Office by June 1. After one semester as new degree students, faculty and staff become continuing students and are set up automatically each semester to request courses, although application for any of the remaining free credit hours must be made separately each semester.

For those applying for the tuition benefit, instructions may be obtained from the Bursar's Office, Regent 150. Student activity fees will not be charged if registration takes place during final schedule adjustment, with the exception of the \$4 SIS fee that every student must pay.

Course work must be taken outside of scheduled working hours or an adjusted work schedule must be established that is acceptable to the employing department.

Academic Matters

Academic Integrity

A university's intellectual reputation depends on the maintenance of the highest standards of intellectual honesty. Commitment to those standards is a responsibility of every student and every faculty member at the University of Colorado.

Breaches of academic honesty include cheating, plagiarism, and the unauthorized possession of exams, papers, or other class materials that have not been formally released by the instructor.

Cheating may be defined as using unauthorized materials or giving or receiving unauthorized assistance during an examination or other academic exercise.

Plagiarism may be defined as the use of another's ideas or words without acknowledgment.

Sanctions. Breaches of academic honesty will result in disciplinary measures that may include a failing grade for a particular assignment, a failing grade for a particular course, and/or suspension for various lengths of time or permanent expulsion from the University.

Breaches of academic honesty are under the purview of each college and school pursuant to the Laws of the Regents, Article V, Section C. For further information and for individual college and school policies, students should consult with their dean's office.

Academic Standing

Generally, to be in good undergraduate academic standing at CU-Boulder, you must maintain a 2.00 GPA (C average) or better. If you cannot maintain this average, a scholastic stop may be placed on your registration.

Graduate students are expected to maintain a 3.00 GPA (B average) or better.

Please check individual college and school policies in the University catalog for information on specific GPA requirements and on scholastic stops.

Final Examination Policy

It is the policy of the University of Colorado at Boulder to adhere to the final examination schedule as published in the *Schedule of Courses* each semester. While it may be appropriate to not give a final in some cases, such as laboratory courses, seminars, and colloquia, final examinations should be given in all other undergraduate courses. Unless otherwise notified in writing during the first week of classes, students must assume that a final examination will be given.

In addition to the principles stated above, the following guidelines should be followed by all faculty members and administrators in order to assure fairness and the best possible educational experience for students.

1. The scheduled final examination period should be considered an important part of the course and used as a final examination period or for additional instruction.

2. The final examination in a course must be given as scheduled and not at other times even if the faculty member and all students in a course agree to such a change.

3. The week of classes preceding the scheduled final examination period should be used primarily for continued instruction and may include the introduction of new material. No hourly examinations are to be given during the week preceding final examinations.

4. Individual students may be granted a variance from these policies provided the instructor is satisfied that (a) the exception is based on good and sufficient reasons (such as religious observances), and (b) such an exception for an early or late examination will not prejudice the interests of other students in the course.

5. When students have three or more examinations on the same day, they will be entitled to arrange an alternative examination time for the last exam or exams scheduled on that day. Such arrangements must be made no later than the end of the sixth week of the semester (i.e., at the end of the drop period). Students will be expected to provide evidence that they have three or more examinations to qualify for exceptions.

6. This policy applies to all undergraduate students, including seniors. Graduating seniors should not be exempted from final examinations. Such exemptions are inappropriate on both procedural and academic grounds.

Grade Reports

Your fall semester 1990 grades will be sent to your local mailing address approximately three weeks after the end of finals. They will also be available for pickup in Regent 125 during the first two weeks of the spring semester.

Graduating Students

If you're planning to graduate this coming year, please check with your college or school dean's office for graduation application deadlines and notification procedures. Some colleges and schools require consultation in the semester preceding the semester of graduation.

Rights and Privacy—Education Records

The Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 protects the privacy of education records. However, certain information is considered public or "directory information." Such information may be released to anyone unless students inform the Office of Academic Records that they do not wish the information released.

"Directory information" includes name, address, phone number, date and place of birth, major field of study, participation in University activities or sports, dates of attendance at the University, full- or part-time enrollment status, degrees and awards received, educational institutions attended, and weight and height of athletes.

To prevent release of the above information (and to prevent your name and address from appearing in the *1990-91 Directory*), you must go to the Office of the Registrar before September 14 to request that directory information about you be withheld. Once requested, nondisclosure of directory information will remain on your record until you are no longer enrolled at the University.

A complete summary of University policy on the release of student information is available in the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog*, the *Student Handbook*, and at the Office of the Registrar, Regent 125, (303) 492-6970.

Transcripts

If you would like a copy of your CU academic record for advising purposes, you may call 492-6907 to request that an unofficial transcript be sent to any department on campus.

An official transcript containing your complete academic record (with the embossed seal of the University) can be requested in writing from the Office of the Registrar. There is no charge, but it usually takes 5 to 8 days to process. Rush transcripts (processed within a day) cost \$3.

Here to Serve You

Continuing Education

Both credit and noncredit classes are offered through Boulder's Division of Continuing Education, and many credit classes may be used to supplement your degree program. Almost all classes are offered in the evenings or by correspondence. There is a limit to the number of continuing education credits that may transfer to your degree program, and eligibility requirements vary among the different colleges and schools. For further information, call Continuing Education at (303) 492-5148. Tuition payment is due upon enrollment.

High School Enrollment Program

Local high school students with outstanding academic records can enroll at CU-Boulder, and the credit they earn can be applied to their high school graduation or to college-level transfer credit. Registration is carefully guided and must take place in person. Please call the Office of Admissions at (303) 492-6301 for further information.

Nightwalk/Nightride

UCSU sponsors two volunteer services that provide safe rides and walks for students and staff at night.

Nightwalk provides teams of walkers who will accompany you anywhere on campus and within a two-block radius of campus. Nightwalk operates 7:00 p.m. to midnight, Sunday through Thursday.

The Nightride van will take you anywhere within the Boulder city limits. Nightride operates 7:00 p.m. to midnight, seven nights a week.

To use Nightwalk or Nightride, come to the east lobby of Norlin Library, or call 492-SAFE to be picked up.




Student Conduct

The standards of conduct and the procedures for implementing them have been developed by the Student Conduct Advisory Board composed of students, faculty, and staff.

In establishing these standards, the University has taken into account students' rights as individuals, as well as the general welfare of the University community. The University would be remiss in its responsibility to students and the community if it ignored behavior that violates the rights of others. It is also essential that everyone share in the commitment to protect the integrity and personal safety of each member of the campus.

In most cases, if an individual is found in violation of one of the standards of conduct, the University's primary interest will be to help the individual avoid further inappropriate behavior and become a responsible member of the University community. However, if an individual fails to correct inappropriate behavior, or if the violation of the standards of conduct is serious, the University will consider taking disciplinary action that may include suspension or permanent expulsion. Behavior that threatens the safety or violates the basic purpose of the University community will not be accepted.

Any time students have questions regarding the application of the standards of conduct, or feel that another person has subjected them to behavior that interferes in any manner with their rights, the University encourages students to contact the Office of Student Conduct, Willard 223, (303) 492-5601.

A Few Last Things

Changing Your Major

If you would like to change your major or declare a major, simply go to the appropriate department and inquire about their procedures. Your change will be entered on-line into the system as soon as it has been approved by the department. If your change of major involves moving into another college or school, it is considered an intrauniversity transfer (IUT). Please see that section below or see the catalog for further information.

Double Degrees

Students who are working in a double degree program (for example, obtaining one degree from arts and sciences and one from business) should verify that both programs are entered on the student information system. Check with your dean's office; if you are not on the system, you may be closed out of required classes during registration. If you have questions concerning your double degree program, check with one of your deans.

Intrauniversity Transfer

If you would like to transfer into another CU-Boulder college or school, check with that dean's office for admission criteria and information on enrollment levels, application procedures, and deadlines. Policies vary among the different colleges and schools.

If you are waiting to hear about the status of your IUT application, please check with your new college or school to find out how you should proceed with registration.

Residency

If you're an out-of-state resident seeking in-state classification for fall 1990, you should turn in your residency petition by 4:00 p.m., August 1, 1990, to the Tuition Classification Office in Regent 125 (Campus Box 68, University of Colorado at Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0068).

Petitions will still be accepted through August 31, but you may be subject to enrollment levels and are unlikely to receive a decision by the tuition payment deadline. Adjustments will be made when applicable. Petitions will not be accepted after August 31, unless there are extraordinary circumstances clearly beyond your control, such as a medical emergency.

Students submitting a completed petition by May 15, 1990, will receive a decision by the deposit payment deadline. If you are a financial aid recipient seeking in-state classification, be sure to submit your petition by May 15 to make sure your award is processed in time for fall.

Complete information regarding the requirements for in-state status is available from the Tuition Classification Office, Regent 125, telephone (303) 492-6868.

Time Out Program

For those who would like to take a planned leave from CU-Boulder for a semester or a year, the Time Out Program provides an opportunity to leave without losing your place in your college or school. You must be in good academic standing and have your dean's approval. Your place will be guaranteed when you return, providing you meet registration and deposit deadlines. An application fee of \$30 is charged. More information is available from the Office of the Registrar, phone (303) 492-8673.

Withdrawal Procedures

If you anticipate withdrawing from CU-Boulder, please do so officially: it will save you time, money, and hassle. If you need to withdraw from fall semester 1990 before August 29, you can fill out a withdrawal form in the registrar's office or write a letter to the Withdrawal Coordinator, Office of the Registrar, Campus Box 7, University of Colorado at Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0007. You may also withdraw by dropping all of your courses via CU Connect before August 29.

Beginning on the first day of classes (August 29), you must complete a withdrawal interview. The interviewer will discuss the procedures for withdrawing, as well as your reasons for leaving. You won't need to drop your classes; that will be done for you. If you don't officially withdraw, a failing grade may be recorded for all of your classes. Remember, deadlines and rules for withdrawing may vary with each college and school.

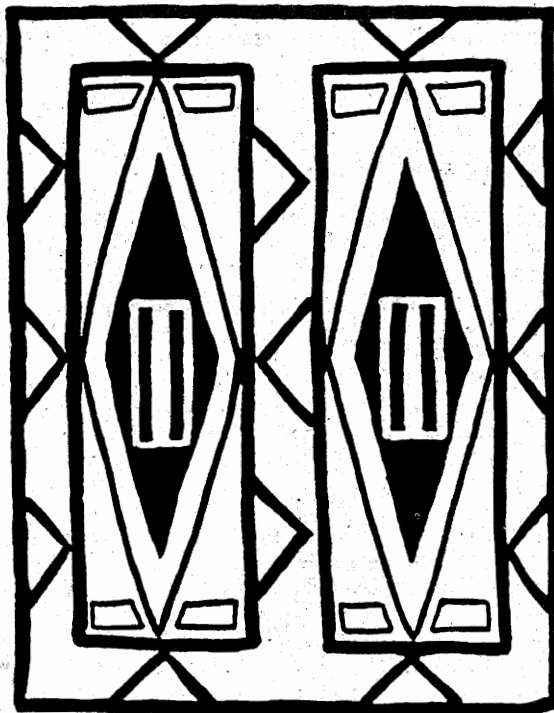

- Call No.** The **five-digit number** used for requesting a certain class or a specific section of a course via CU Connect
- Subj.** The department name abbreviated to four letters
- Course #/ Credits** The course number and credit hours for the class
- Course Title** This is often abbreviated. Refer to the catalog for the complete title and course description.
- Sec. No.** The section number; it means the same as the lecture number. When an L or R precedes the number (L004 or R010), it indicates a laboratory (lab) or a recitation (rec); either is taken along with the lecture. Some classes have all three: lecture, lab, and recitation.
- Time/Days** Meeting time and days of the class (T is Tuesday, R is Thursday, and U is Sunday)
- Bldg./Rm.** The building name and room number (see the list on page 14 for building abbreviations)

Instructor The instructor's name, when available

Max. Enroll. The approximate class size

When selecting your courses, remember that some may not be available due to college or school restrictions or class size limitations.

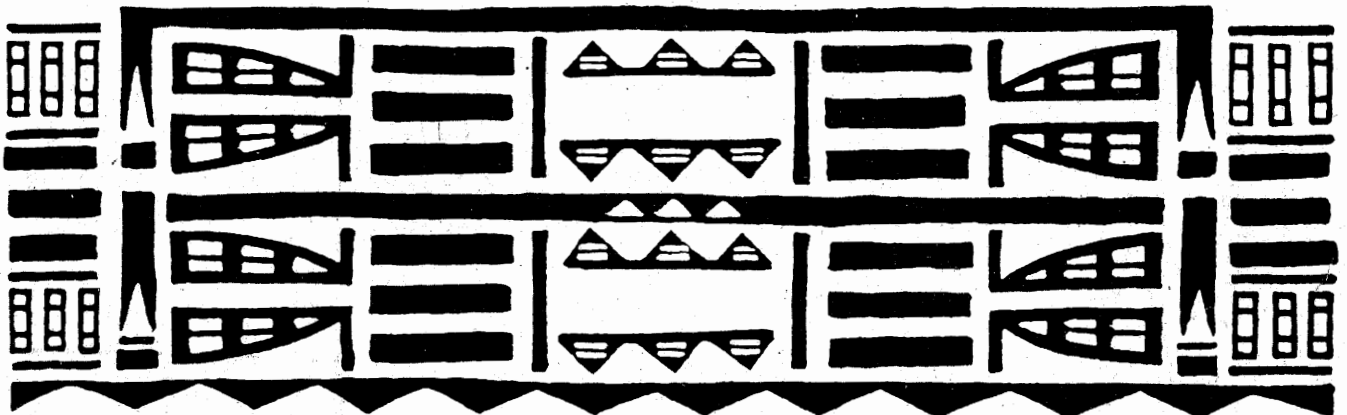

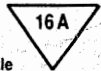
Understanding Course Numbers

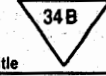

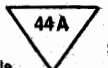

SHORTLY AFTER THE START OF THE SEMESTER, YOU WILL BE PLACED IN EITHER DIRECTED WRITING (UWRP 1050), EXPOSITORY WRITING (UWRP 1150), OR ARGUMENTATIVE WRITING (UWRP 1250) ACCORDING TO THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES:

1. IF YOU HAVE PREVIOUSLY TAKEN AND PASSED, WITH AT LEAST A C, A UNIVERSITY WRITING PROGRAM COURSE, YOU WILL BE PLACED IN THE NEXT HIGHER COURSE. (FOR EXAMPLE, IF YOU HAVE TAKEN AND PASSED UWRP 1150, YOU WILL BE PLACED IN UWRP 1250.) HOWEVER, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ADVISING, YOU WILL BE REQUIRED, DURING THE FIRST DAY OF CLASS, TO WRITE DIAGNOSTIC ESSAYS THAT WILL INDICATE YOUR SKILL LEVEL.
2. IF YOU HAVE NEVER TAKEN A UNIVERSITY WRITING PROGRAM COURSE, YOU WILL BE PLACED IN A COURSE APPROPRIATE TO YOUR SKILL LEVEL, AS DETERMINED BY THE DIAGNOSTIC ESSAYS THAT YOU WILL BE REQUIRED TO WRITE DURING THE FIRST DAYS OF CLASS.

PLACEMENT WILL BE COMPLETED BEFORE THE END OF THE SCHEDULE ADJUSTMENT PERIOD. IF YOU DO NOT WRITE BOTH DIAGNOSTIC ESSAYS, YOU WILL BE ADMINISTRATIVELY DROPPED FROM THE COURSE.

YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO ADD UWRP 1150 COURSES AFTER FRIDAY, AUGUST 31, UNLESS YOU HAVE DEPARTMENTAL APPROVAL.

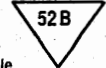

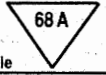

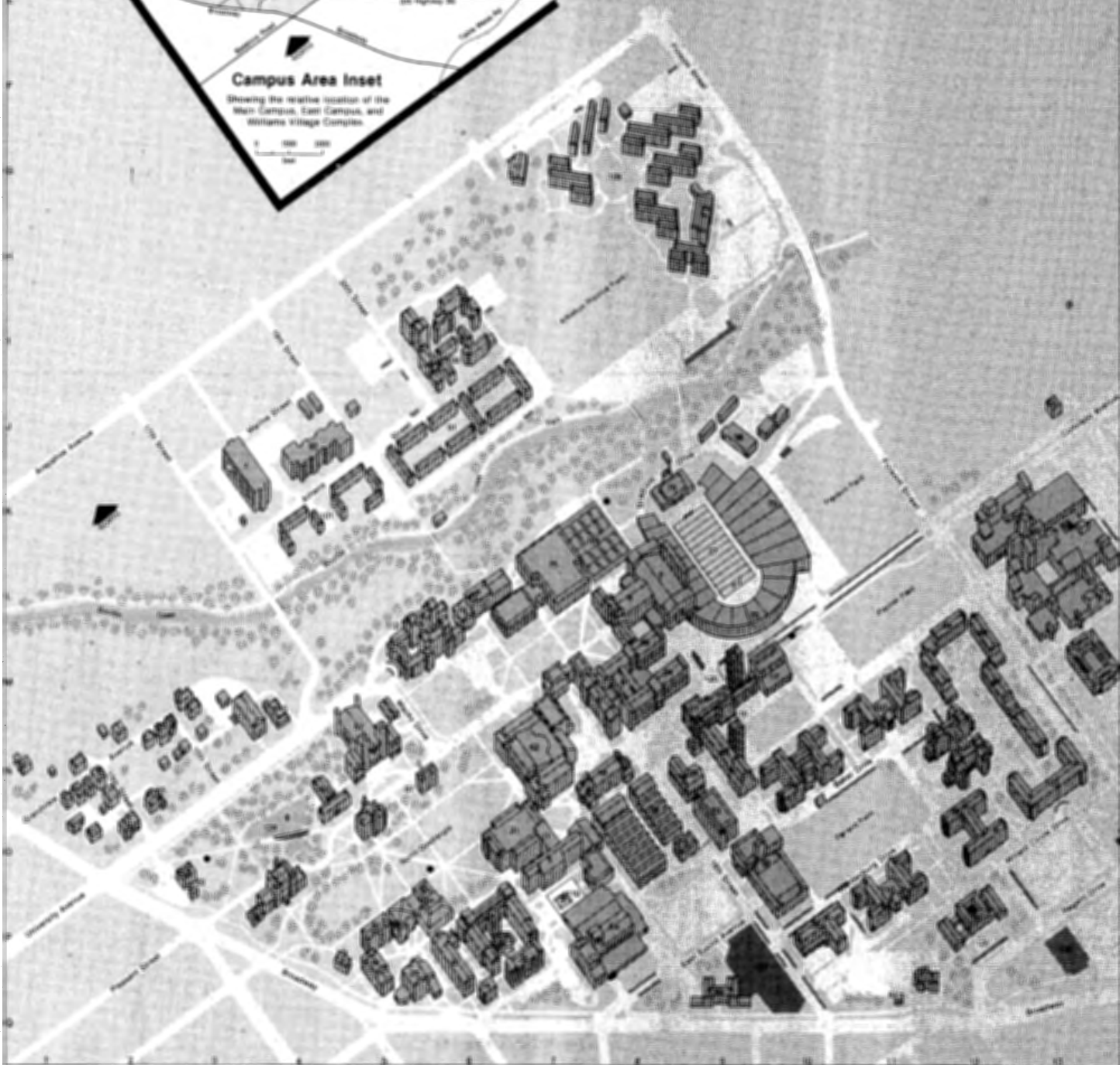
