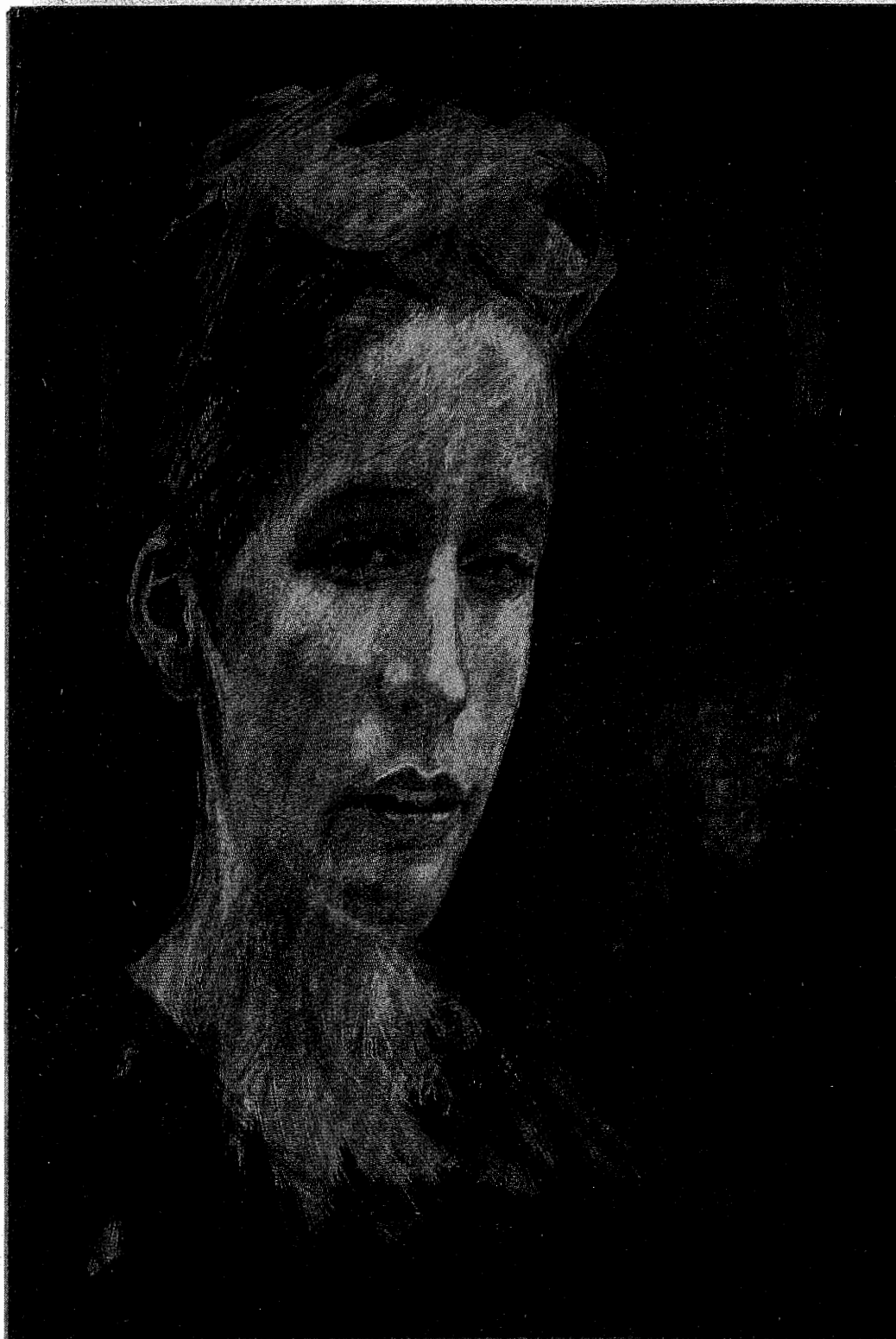

## Registration/Academic Calendar

### MARCH 30 (MON.) - APRIL 3 (FRI.)

- Fall 1998 course reservation registration period for eligible students. (See pages 31-32 of the *Spring 1998 Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* for eligibility requirements.)

### APRIL 6 (MON.) - MAY 3 (SUN.)

- Fall 1998 confirmed-registration time assignments for students enrolled during spring 1998. For best course selections, register as close to your time assignment as possible. Continuing students can register through June 11 and also August 3 through midnight on August 14.

### MAY 4 (MON.) - JUNE 11 (THURS.)

- Schedule adjustment for continuing degree students who have completed confirmed registration, registration for continuing students who have not yet registered, and registration for eligible students continuing from summer to fall. After June 11, these students may not register or adjust their schedule until August 3-14.

- Fall 1998 confirmed registration for new graduate and readmitted students. After June 11, new graduate and readmitted students may register or adjust their schedules on July 10, 17, and 24, and August 3-14.

### JUNE 12 (FRI.) - JULY 27 (MON.)

- Fall 1998 course-request registration for incoming freshmen and transfer students. Continuing, new graduate, and readmitted students may not register or adjust their schedule from June 12 to August 2. (Exception: New graduate and readmitted students can register and adjust their schedules on July 10, 17, and 24.)

### JULY 10, 17, 24 (FRI.)

- Confirmed registration and schedule adjustment for new graduate and readmitted students, 7:00 a.m. to midnight.

### JULY 29 (WED.)

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) for continuing students to withdraw from the university and receive a full refund of the \$200 enrollment deposit, less any outstanding charges. (This deadline to withdraw and not forfeit the deposit applies to students planning to go on the Time Out Program as well.) New and readmitted students are not eligible for a refund.

### JULY 31 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** to update your permanent address to ensure that your fall 1998 schedule/bill is mailed to the correct address. (**Note:** These are mailed only to continuing, new graduate, and readmitted students who confirm register by August 7.)

### AUGUST 3-14 (MON. - FRI.)

- Final registration and schedule adjustment for continuing, new graduate, and readmitted students.
- Schedule/bills mailed (to the permanent address) to all continuing, new graduate, and readmitted students who confirm register by August 7.
- Final registration period for all incoming freshmen and transfer students who did not register June 12-July 27 (except those in arts and sciences and business attending the final orientation on August 18-20).

### AUGUST 14 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** for all students, both undergraduate and graduate (except for those incoming freshmen and transfers in arts and sciences and business attending the final orientation), to register for fall courses. **Registration must be completed by midnight to be guaranteed enrollment for fall semester.** After this date, registration is on a space-available basis, and a **\$50 late fee** is charged. (See page 36 for late-registration information.)

### AUGUST 20 (THURS.)

- Schedule/bill distribution for incoming freshmen and transfer students (except for those incoming freshmen and transfers in arts and sciences and business attending the final orientation on August 18-20), for students who need a revised schedule/bill, and for students who did not receive a schedule/bill in the mail. Distribution will be from 2:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. at the Coors Events/Conference Center. (See page 17.) **Note: Drop/add does not begin until Friday, August 21.**

### AUGUST 21 (FRI.)

- Schedule/bill distribution continues, 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at the Coors Events/Conference Center.
- Drop/add time assignments begin for all incoming freshmen and transfer students. (See page 18.)

### AUGUST 23 (SUN.)

- Drop/add time assignments begin for continuing, new graduate, readmitted students, and faculty/staff. (See page 18.)
- Coors Events/Conference Center is open from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. for drop/add, schedule/bill distribution, and late-registration screening.
- Registrar's, Buff OneCard, and Bursar's Offices are open from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. for limited services.

### AUGUST 24 (MON.)

- Classes begin.
- Coors Events/Conference Center is open (*last day*) from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. for drop/add, schedule/bill distribution and reprints, and late-registration screening. Beginning on Tuesday, August 25, these registration services are located in the basement of Regent, room 1B60, through Friday, September 4. (See page 18.)

### AUGUST 25 (TUES.)

- Space available (SAVE) registration in person (location to be announced) from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. or through CU Connect. Beginning August 26, SAVE registration in person at the Continuing Education Office (1221 University) or through CU Connect. (See page 37.)

### AUGUST 31 (MON.)

- Space-available registration for Senior Citizens Auditors Program, Koenig Alumni Center, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., and continues on Tuesday, September 1, 9:00 a.m. to noon. (See page 37.)

**WHAT'S NEW!** The deadlines regarding adding courses, wait listing for courses, and changing pass/fail and no-credit status on courses are different than in previous semesters. Please read the following highlighted deadlines carefully.

**SEPTEMBER 2 (WED.)****Add Deadline:**

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to add a course, including independent study and thesis, without the instructor's signature. *After this date, you must have the signature of your instructor on a special action form to add a course (through September 11).* **NOTE:** After 5:00 p.m. on September 2, CU Connect is only available for dropping courses (through 5:00 p.m. on September 9, the drop deadline). (See page 19.)

**Wait List Deadline:**

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to add your name to a course wait list. (See pages 16-17.)

**Tuition Payment Deadline:**

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to pay full tuition and fees and to turn in a deferred tuition agreement. **No grace period.** (See pages 28-29.)
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to waive university-sponsored health insurance at Wardenburg Health Center.
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to waive UCSU student fees.
- **Deadline** to request refund of any student opportunities fees you selected. (See page 11.)

**SEPTEMBER 7 (MON.)**

- Labor Day holiday. University closed.

**SEPTEMBER 9 (WED.)****Drop Deadline:**

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to drop a course without the instructor's signature, without being assessed tuition and fees for that course, and without a *W* appearing on your transcript. *After this date, you must have the signature of your instructor on a special action form and you must be passing your course to drop it.* (See page 19.)
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to withdraw from the university and only be assessed \$200 in tuition and fees. (See page 37.)

**SEPTEMBER 11 (FRI.)**

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to add a course without petitioning your dean. **NOTE:** Instructor's signature is required on a special action form to add a course. In general, instructors will only approve an add if you've been regularly attending and there's space in the course. (See page 19.)
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to change variable-credit hours, pass/fail, and no-credit status on courses. (See page 19.)

**SEPTEMBER 23 (WED.)**

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to withdraw from the university and only be assessed 40 percent of full tuition and fees. (See page 37.)

**OCTOBER 2 (FRI.)**

- **Deadline** for students who have three or more final exams on the same day to make arrangements to change their final exam schedule. (See page 5.)

**OCTOBER 7 (WED.)**

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to drop a course without petitioning your dean. (See page 19.)
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to withdraw from the university and only be assessed 60 percent of full tuition and fees. *After this day, 100 percent of tuition and fees is due.* (See page 37.)
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to pay any unpaid balance, including approved deferred tuition. **No grace period.**
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to turn in Time Out Program (TOP) applications to the registrar's office. (See page 37.)

**OCTOBER 19-23 (MON. - FRI.)**

- Distribution of the *Spring 1999 Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* in Regent foyer, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (except Monday, October 19, until 6:00 p.m.) and UMC 155, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Beginning Monday, October 26, distribution is in Regent 105.

**OCTOBER 26-30 (MON. - FRI.)**

- Spring 1999 course reservation registration period for eligible students. (See page 35.)

### *Moscow, Russia*

COURSE: PSC 4505 "Politics of Russia"

HIGHLIGHTS: Students will visit the Romanov palaces in St. Petersburg. Excursions in Moscow will include the Kremlin and KGB headquarters. The experience will focus on politics and political history of Russia and the Soviet Union.

### *Kathmandu, Nepal*

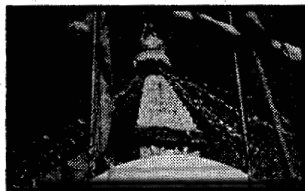
COURSES: ANTH 2706 "Anthropology and Sociology of Nepal" and ANTH 3980 "Eastern Philosophy"

HIGHLIGHTS: Students will participate in a one-week trek in the Himalayas. The group will also take a two-day elephant back jungle safari. Nepal is a high Himalayan kingdom renowned for its contrasts and the peaceful coexistence of two of the world's great religions, Hinduism and Buddhism.

### *Beijing, China*

COURSE: FINE 4750 "Art History of China"

HIGHLIGHTS: An excursion to the Great Wall will be one of many excursions in China. Students will each have a Chinese buddy who will help them explore Beijing and Chinese culture.

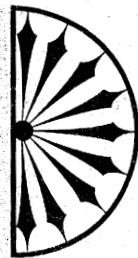
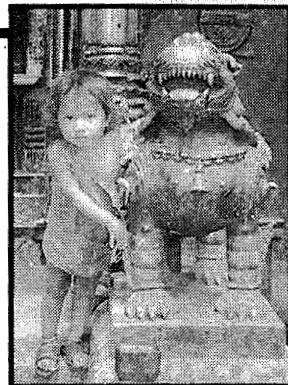

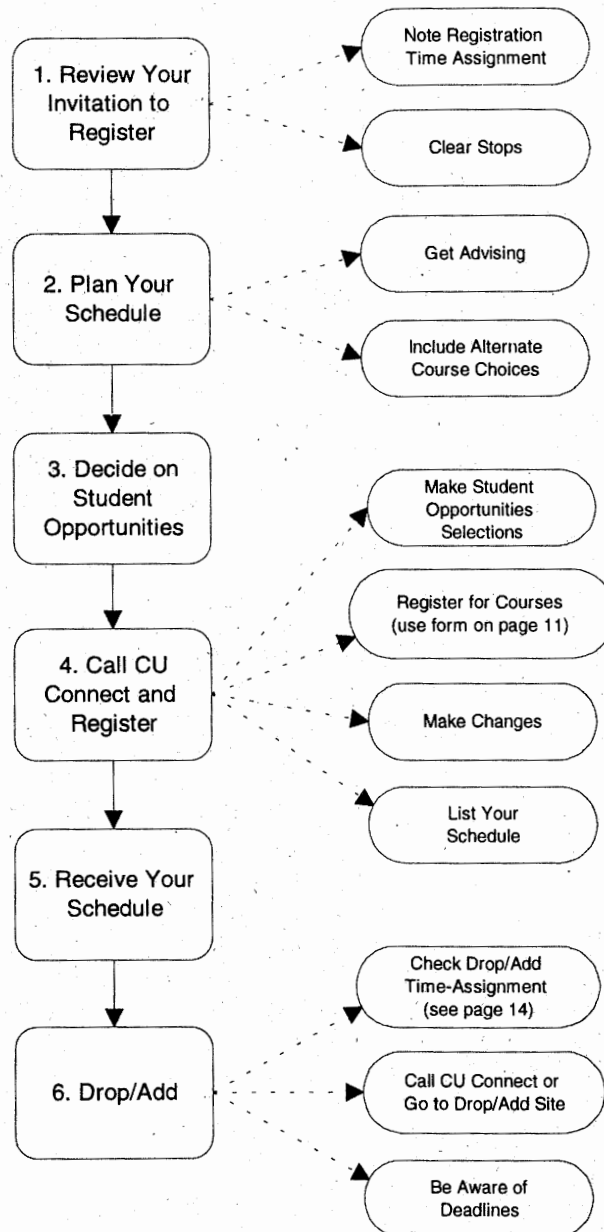

## Six Easy Steps to Registration



This *Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* (RHSC) contains information you need to register for the fall 1998 semester, adjust your schedule, and pay your bill. If policies or procedures change, you will receive further information.

The requirements, policies, and course descriptions of each college and school are printed in the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog*. You are responsible for knowing and following the catalog policies for your year of entry into a specific program at CU-Boulder.

Although this handbook was prepared on the basis of the best information available at the time of its printing (March 2, 1998), all information is subject to change.

## Registration

**Confirmed registration** is for those students who are continuing in a degree program from the spring semester or summer, as well as for new graduate students and readmitted students. Incoming freshmen and transfer students registering *after July 27* also register via confirmed registration. You can call CU Connect (our telephone registration system) to register for courses, list your schedule, drop and add courses, and sign up for course wait lists. When you register via CU Connect, you receive immediate confirmation or denial of your enrollment in courses.

**Registration Deadline** - All students must complete registration by **midnight on August 14, 1998** to be guaranteed enrollment for fall semester 1998. (**Exception:** Incoming freshmen and transfer students attending the final arts and sciences and business orientation session in August must complete registration by 5:00 p.m. on August 20.) Students who do not register by these dates (including graduate students) are subject to late registration and a \$50 late fee.

**NOTE: If you require accommodations because of a disability, notify the Office of the Registrar, Campus Box 20, Boulder, CO 80309-0020, or call (303) 492-4822. If you are deaf or hard of hearing, call (303) 492-5841 (TTY).**

### 1 Review Your Invitation to Register

#### Currently enrolled students:

You can access your personalized invitation to register for fall semester 1998 in the following ways (it will *not* be mailed to you):

- **Look on PLUS** (Personal Look-Up Services) on the World Wide Web at <http://www.colorado.edu/plus>. Use your student ID number and your PIN to access PLUS.
  - **Check your e-mail.** It was sent to you on February 23 and an updated version sent on March 9 if you had an active university e-mail account. If you don't have a university e-mail account, you can create your own account through PLUS (<http://www.colorado.edu/plus>) or visit the account office at Duane Physics C119. Call Information Technology Services' Point of Contact at (303) 492-1617 if you need help creating an e-mail account.
- NOTE:** For security reasons, we did not include PIN numbers or student ID numbers on the invitations to register sent via e-mail.

- **Come to the registrar's office** for a copy of your invitation to register.

#### All new and readmitted students:

You'll receive your personalized invitation to register in the mail (mailed to your mailing address) or at orientation (if required).

#### Your invitation to register includes:

- **Your Personal Identification Number (PIN)** - If you are a new or readmitted student, your invitation to register includes your PIN. Your PIN, in combination with your

student number, allows you to access CU Connect, the Personal Look-Up Services (PLUS) on the web, and the financial aid telephone system. Certain data specific to you is available on these systems, and your PIN controls access to this information. Your PIN is a randomly set number and must be kept confidential. **Be sure to memorize your PIN as it remains the same throughout your career at CU-Boulder.**

If you feel that your PIN is not secure and you wish to change it, come in to the registrar's office in Regent 105.

If you forget your PIN, you can call the registrar's office at (303) 492-6970 or come in to the office in Regent 105.

- **Your registration time assignment** - This is the date and time you can call CU Connect to register for courses. You can call any time after your time assignment begins through June 11, and also August 3 through midnight on August 14. It is to your advantage to call as soon as possible after your registration time assignment begins. You can also call CU Connect at (303) 938-8110 to find out your registration time assignment for fall.

Registration time assignments for undergraduate continuing students are based on the total number of hours completed at CU (any campus), transfer credit, and any courses you are currently enrolled in (as of February 16).

Graduating seniors receive the earliest assignments. All other seniors register next, then graduate and law students, first-semester freshmen (those with 12 or fewer hours), juniors, sophomores, and then second-semester freshmen. Within these groups, time assignments are random.

Freshmen .....	0-29 hours
Sophomores .....	30-59 hours
Juniors .....	60-89 hours
Seniors .....	90-123 hours
5th Year Seniors .....	124 hours and above

- **Advising notice** - If required by your college or school, consult with an advisor before registering. See pages 31-32 for instructions.
- **Other stops** - Stops are holds that the university puts on student records for various reasons. Stops may originate from delinquent financial obligations, academic concerns, or even disciplinary matters. If you have any stops on your record, you are not allowed to register until you have cleared them all. Be sure to clear all stops at least 24 hours before your registration time assignment.

### 2 Plan Your Schedule

Use the schedule planning worksheet on page 13 to fill out a preliminary schedule for fall 1998. Then, fill out the telephone registration form on page 15 before calling CU Connect. It is a good idea to include alternate course choices on your telephone registration form in case courses you request are full. Refer to page 16 for information about course available lists.

### 3 Decide on Student Opportunities

In addition to the mandatory fees you must pay along with your tuition, there is a group of student opportunities available to you for which optional fees are charged. The opportunities consist of various services provided by the university, tickets for concerts, plays, and the like, and club and student groups in which you can participate or merely provide money for their use.

When you first call CU Connect to register for courses, you will hear a brief description of the student opportunities fees available to you and be asked to choose (or not) each opportunity. After you've made your choices, you'll be asked to confirm them. With this step completed, you can register for classes.

Student opportunities you have chosen will appear on your tuition and fee bill. If you want to change any of the student opportunities originally chosen, you **cannot** do so via CU Connect. Instead, you must call the appropriate office at the phone number listed below. **Refunds will be given up to the tuition payment deadline (September 2).**

#### DESCRIPTIONS OF STUDENT OPPORTUNITIES FEES

Following are descriptions of all the opportunities available to you, including the fee for each opportunity.

Free, year-round services provided by **Career Services** in Willard Hall include career counseling, career-planning and job-search workshops, the career library, the alumni career network, video practice interviews, and the *Discover* computerized career-guidance system. Two additional services available for a fee are listed below.

#### Career Connections ..... \$35.00

This is for students graduating in December 1998, or May or August 1999. The prime time to use Career Connections is during your final year at CU. During the fall semester connect with employers seeking college graduates by taking advantage of weekly interviewing opportunities, having your resume referred to employers, obtaining employment vacancies, and networking with employers. *Contact Career Connections during the first week of classes for dates of the mandatory orientation meeting.* (303) 492-4100.

#### Cooperative Education and Internships ..... \$55.00

This is for undergraduate and graduate students seeking work experience before graduation. Each year, more than 7,000 internships are available in business, engineering, art museums, social service agencies, and environmental and governmental agencies. Contact the Co-op Office (Willard 18) early in the semester to complete the necessary materials. Full refunds are granted until the drop/add deadline. This service is good for 12 months from enrollment. (303) 492-4129.

#### Club Sports ..... \$4.75

Club sports, which are partially funded by student fees, often require participants to pay out-of-pocket expenses which may limit their involvement in the sport. This fee helps support club sports, so there are fewer out-of-pocket expenses for the participants and it also offsets

some of the overhead costs of the sports. There are currently over 30 club sports programs, with athletes competing in local, intercollegiate, regional, and sometimes national competitions. Coed sports funded include: bicycle racing, cricket, fencing, field hockey, figure skating, fly fishing, in-line hockey, kayaking, racquetball, rodeo and western heritage, running, speed skating, squash, strength and conditioning, tae kwon do, triathlon, waterpolo, and weightlifting. Men's sports are: baseball, diving, ice hockey, lacrosse, rugby, soccer, swimming, ultimate frisbee, and volleyball. Women's sports are: diving, ice hockey, lacrosse, rugby, soccer, softball, swimming, ultimate frisbee, and volleyball. (303) 492-5471.

#### College of Music Concert Card ..... \$25.00 per card

The hot sounds of jazz! International dance! The classical repertoire! The best of musical theatre and opera! Each concert card gives you \$50 worth of Artist Series and Lyric Theatre tickets for only \$25—a 50% savings over single ticket prices! Cards are valid for the entire 1998-99 season and let you choose from a variety of performances. Concert cards give you the flexibility to decide how many tickets you want and where you would like to sit. All you have to do is present your card at the box office when choosing tickets. *Concert cards will not be mailed to you.* Bring your student ID and proof of payment to Imig Music C103 to pick up your College of Music Concert Card. (303) 492-8008.

#### Student Groups ..... \$4.95

## CU Connect Confirmed Registration Codes

CU Connect is normally available Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to midnight. It is also available on Sundays from 11:00 a.m. to midnight.

### Exceptions:

- On *June 5 (from noon to 6:00 p.m.)* and *June 12-July 27*, CU Connect is only available for incoming freshmen and transfer student course-request registration. (Exception: During this period, course request registration is not available on July 10, July 17, and July 24. On these dates, the system will only be available to new graduate and readmitted students to register or adjust their schedules.)
- On *August 20*, CU Connect is only available from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (and is only available for incoming freshmen and transfer students in arts and sciences and business attending the final orientation).
- On *August 23*, CU Connect is available 10:00 a.m. to midnight.
- On *September 2*, CU Connect is only available until 5:00 p.m. (the add and wait list deadline) for adding courses and adding your name to course wait lists. **Note:** After 5:00 p.m. on September 2, CU Connect is only available for dropping courses (through 5:00 p.m. on September 9, the drop deadline).
- On *September 9*, CU Connect is available 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (the drop deadline).
- CU Connect is **NOT** available on *Saturdays* or on *May 25, July 3, July 28-August 2, and August 16-19*.

**4 Call CU Connect and Register**

Call CU Connect, (303) 938-8110, from any touch-tone phone to register. Follow the instructions on the telephone registration form on page 15 and use the function codes listed on page 14. You may call any time after your time assignment begins. **After registering via CU Connect, list your classes by pressing 5# to verify your schedule.**

CU Connect is normally available Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to midnight, and on Sundays from 11:00 a.m. to midnight. (See page 14 for exceptions.)

**Need registration assistance?** If you have problems or questions concerning telephone registration, call the registrar's office at (303) 492-6970 and press "1" to speak with a registration assistant. Call between 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. MST, Monday through Friday, except on university holidays. Recorded registration information is also available at this number 24 hours a day (press "2" to hear recorded registration information).

Once you have registered, make adjustments to your schedule by calling CU Connect through the **registration deadline, midnight on August 14.** (Exception: Incoming freshmen and transfer students attending the final arts and sciences and business orientation session in August must complete registration by 5:00 p.m. on August 20.) After these dates, see pages 18-19 for instructions on making final schedule adjustments during the drop/add period.

**LINKED COURSES**

Linked courses are lecture courses that have required recitations and/or labs. In the course listings, you can identify a linked course because *the call numbers for linked lectures are not listed.* Only the call numbers for the linked recitation or lab are listed. (For courses that have a required lecture, recitation, and a lab, the call numbers are *not listed* for the lecture and recitation; they are *only* listed for the lab.)

**NOTE:** This does not apply to courses that have a required lab with a different course number, e.g., EPOB 1210 General Biology 1 and EPOB 1230 General Biology Lab 1.

To register for linked courses, enter the call number for the lab or recitation only. When you enter the call number, the system automatically "links" all other sections of the course and either enrolls you in all sections of the course or gives you the option of placing your name on a wait list, if available, for all linked sections of the course.

**SEARCHING FOR NEW COURSE SECTIONS**

You may need to search for a new section of a course for the following reasons:

- Sometimes academic departments must change the time a course is offered *after the Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* has been published. When this happens, the department cancels the original section and adds a new section that reflects the time change.
- If you request a course section that is full, the computer voice asks you if you want to conduct a search for other open sections of that course. If you do, press 7# when prompted. CU Connect will search for other sections of the course that are available and that will fit your schedule. If another section is available, you can register for that section.

Lists of available courses can be found at the Coors Events/Conference Center (August 21 and 23-24), in Regent 1B60 (August 25-September 4), Regent 105, and on the World Wide Web at <http://www.colorado.edu/Academics/CourseAvailable/index.html>.

**WAIT LISTS**

Throughout the confirmed registration and drop/add periods, if you are eligible to take a course but find it is full, you may be able to put your name on a computerized wait list. Each department determines if a wait list will be offered for a course and what type of wait list will be used. There are two types of wait lists:

- *Automatic wait lists* are set up on a first-come, first-served basis. As a vacancy occurs in a class, the person at the top of the list is automatically enrolled.
- *Resequenced wait lists* use a priority system to determine who enrolls in a course as spaces open up. Priorities are established by the department and are usually based on class standing and/or major.

CU Connect informs you if a class you have requested has a wait list and gives you the option of adding your name to the list. Press 9# when prompted and listen for verification. **NOTE:** CU Connect does **not** tell you what type of wait list is used for the course.

When you place your name on a wait list, the number of students already on the list is announced. As wait-list positions constantly change during the registration and drop/add periods, it's a good idea to list your schedule

frequently to find out your position on the wait list. To find out your wait-list position, call CU Connect and list your schedule by pressing 5# (see the instructions on your confirmed registration form). If you are wait-listed for any courses, your wait-list position (normally current within the last 24 hours) will be announced when you list your schedule. Wait-list positions are normally updated nightly.

**(Exception:** Wait-list positions will not be announced on Thursday, August 20.)

Placing your name on a wait list does not guarantee that you will be enrolled in that course, even if you're first on the wait list.

When a space opens up for you from a wait list, you are automatically enrolled in the class. *No verification is sent.* If you choose not to remain on a wait list or if you find that you have been enrolled in a course that you no longer want, drop the course as soon as possible.

**NOTE:** Wait-listed hours are included in your credit load limit (see page 33). You cannot be enrolled and wait listed for courses offered at the same time, and you cannot be wait listed for two courses offered at the same time.

It is your responsibility to find out if you have been enrolled in a course from the wait list. If you do not attend a course you have been enrolled in, you will receive an *F* for that course.

#### DEADLINES FOR WAIT LISTS

You may place your name on course wait lists through **5:00 p.m., Wednesday, September 2.** At that time, all wait lists will be frozen. This means you cannot add your name to a wait list after September 2 and *there is no automatic enrollment from wait lists after this date.*

If you are still on a wait list as of September 3 and are still interested in taking that course, check with the department offering the course. You must let the department know you are still interested in the course, should an opening occur. In that event, the department will give you a signed special action form to add the course. **(NOTE:** After September 2, you need the signature of the instructor on a special action form to add a course.) All department wait lists are canceled at 5:00 p.m. on Friday, September 11, the deadline to add a course without petitioning your dean.

**NOTE:** If you're on the wait list as of midnight on September 2, and you don't get enrolled in the course (undergraduate courses only), you'll be eligible to reserve the course the next time it is offered through the Course Reservation Program. (See page 35.)

## 5 Receive Your Schedule

You can receive your schedule several different ways.

#### Continuing, New Graduate, and Readmitted Students

- If you register by August 7, your schedule/bill will be mailed to your permanent address by mid-August.
- If you make significant changes to your schedule or register after August 7 and/or need another copy of your schedule, you can get a printout of your revised schedule/bill at the distribution sites listed below.

**WHAT'S NEW!** The deadlines regarding adding courses, wait listing for courses, and changing pass/fail and no-credit status on courses are different than in previous semesters. Please read the following deadlines carefully.

**DEADLINES FOR ADDING COURSES**

• **Add Deadline** - The deadline to add a course, including independent study and thesis, without the instructor's signature is **5:00 p.m., Wednesday, September 2.**

*To add a course after September 2 and through September 11, you must have the signature of your instructor on a special action form. In general, instructors will only approve an add if you've been regularly attending and there's space in the course.*

• **Deadline to Add Without Petitioning Your Dean** - The deadline to add a course without petitioning your dean is **5:00 p.m., Friday, September 11.** (NOTE: You must have instructor's signature on a special action form to add a course after September 2 and through September 11.)

*No adds are permitted after September 11 unless there are extenuating circumstances.*

**September 11 is also the deadline to change variable-credit hours, pass/fail, and no-credit status on courses.** These changes can be made at the registrar's office in Regent 105 through 5:00 p.m. on September 11.

**DEADLINES FOR DROPPING COURSES**

• **Drop Deadline** - The deadline to drop a course without the instructor's signature, without being assessed tuition and fees for that course, and without a *W* grade showing on your transcript is **5:00 p.m., Wednesday, September 9.**

For courses dropped after Wednesday, September 9 (5:00 p.m.), no tuition and fee adjustments are made and you will receive a *W* grade on your transcript for dropped courses.

*To drop a course after September 9 and through October 7, you must be passing the course and a special action form must be signed by your instructor and turned into the registrar's office.*

• **Deadline to Drop Without Petitioning Your Dean** - The deadline to drop a course without petitioning your dean is **5:00 p.m., Wednesday, October 7.**

After October 7 you cannot drop a course unless there are circumstances clearly beyond your control (accident, illness, etc.).

*To drop a course after this date you must have your dean's approval, as well as the approval of your instructor. Their signatures must be on a special action form or your request will not be processed.*





**Fall 1998 Student Course Fees**

Course fees are assessed to help offset the higher costs of specialized supplies, equipment, materials, and instructional and related support that are required to teach courses in certain departments. **NOTE:** 1997-98 course fees are listed by each department in the course listings beginning on page 40. A list is available at the Bursar's Office, and on the web.

**Enrollment Deposit**

Your \$200 enrollment deposit is held for you by the university until you:

- drop *all* classes in a semester within established dates and guidelines (see page 37), or
- officially withdraw within established dates and guidelines (see page 37), or
- graduate

At that time, the deposit is credited toward any outstanding financial obligations you may have, and a refund check is mailed to you within approximately eight weeks. Update your permanent address at the Office of the Registrar or the Bursar's Office before you graduate or withdraw to be sure you receive your refund. Interest earned from enrollment deposits is used for student financial aid.

*If you enroll at the university the semester following your graduation, your enrollment deposit remains on your account. It is then refunded to you, in accordance with established university policy, when you are no longer enrolled.*

## Residency

Students classified as out-of-state residents who are seeking in-state tuition classification for fall 1998 should turn in residency petitions by **5:00 p.m., July 27, 1998**, to the Tuition Classification Office in Regent 1B54, Campus Box 68, Boulder, CO 80309-0068.

Petitions are accepted through August 28, 1998, but students who submit petitions after July 27 may not receive a decision by the tuition-payment deadline. Adjustments and reimbursements are made if a student's application is approved.

Students submitting a completed petition by May 15, 1998, receive a decision by the enrollment deposit refund deadline of July 29, 1998. Financial aid recipients seeking in-state classification should submit their petitions by May 15, 1998, to make sure their financial aid award is processed in time for fall semester.

Complete information regarding the requirements for in-state residency status is available on our website <http://registrar.colorado.edu/residenc.htm>, at the Tuition Classification Office, Regent 1B54, or by calling (303) 492-6868.

## Student Health Insurance for Fall 1998

If you do not receive an insurance packet in the mail in June, call (303) 492-5107. Students enrolled for 6 credit hours or more are **automatically charged for Plan A** of the student health insurance. If you do not wish to be insured through the university-sponsored plan, **you must submit a selection/waiver form** to Wardenburg Health Center (WHC) by **September 2, 1998**. If you wish to waive insurance, the selection/waiver form is required because you will be responsible for your own health care costs. The university is not responsible for your medical expenses.

Plan A insurance provides up to 100 percent coverage for eligible costs incurred at Wardenburg Health Center. It also provides 75 to 100 percent coverage at other medical facilities, after a deductible is satisfied, dependent upon the type of service rendered and the provider. The plan provides up to \$250,000 in coverage per illness or injury on a world-wide basis. Benefits are provided year round when both fall and spring semester coverage are purchased. There are also other insurance options from which to select.

If you are taking 5 or fewer credit hours (this includes graduate students), or are enrolled in SAVE, Continuing Education, or the Time Out Program, the university-sponsored health plan is available at the same price that full-time students pay. You may also purchase insurance for your spouse or your children. If you wish to enroll in the student health plan or you wish to enroll your spouse or dependent, you must sign up at WHC within the enrollment period, which is usually the first three weeks of the semester. Correspondence courses do not qualify you as eligible for enrollment in the student insurance plan. To become eligible to purchase the insurance, you must first

pay full USCU student fees. **Exception:** Approved doctoral candidates requesting student insurance are charged the full price for the insurance, and USCU student fees are reduced.

The university will contribute a portion of the cost toward either Option A or B if you hold at least a 20 percent appointment as a teaching, research, or graduate assistant, or as a graduate part-time instructor.

If you do not wish to purchase university health insurance, complete a selection/waiver form to remove this charge from your bill. To be honored, waivers must be turned into WHC by September 2, 1998. A selection/waiver form need not be submitted in the spring 1999 semester if you submitted one in the fall 1998 semester, unless you wish to change the insurance option for spring.

The selection/waiver form is a two-part form. Be sure to keep a copy for your files. If for some reason your original form does not reach the University Health Insurance Department, your copy will be honored through December 1, 1998.

If you fail to submit a selection/waiver form by September 2, 1998, you have the opportunity to petition the Student Health Board Fee Waiver Committee. If the committee denies your petition, you may appeal the decision to the USCU Appellate Court. The decision of the Appellate Court is final. If you are unsuccessful in your appeal, you must pay the student health insurance fee or be disenrolled from the university. The petition and appeal processes are available to you for the first two months of a semester only.

For more information about other insurance options or if you have questions, call the Student Insurance Office at (303) 492-5107.

## Paying Your Bill

You may pay your bill by:

- **Cash** - All payments made by cash must be received at the cashier windows in the lobby of Regent.
- **Personal check, certified check, or cashier's check made payable to the University of Colorado** - If you pay by check, make sure your name and student number are on the check. Mail the check and the top portion of your bill to the Denver post office box noted on the bill, or use one of the tuition drop boxes at the north and south entrances of Regent. *Do not use campus mail.*

If you write a bad check (regardless of the amount) to the university, you may be subject to late charges and service charges, and a stop will be placed on your record. A \$17 returned-check charge is assessed, in addition to the amount due to the university. You may also be liable for collection costs and prosecution under the Colorado Criminal Statutes.

**Credit cards are not accepted.**

**The payment deadline is 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 2, 1998.** Postmark dates are not honored.

If you purchase a parking permit, add a class, etc., *after you receive your original bill*, call (303) 938-8110 for your current balance.

**Original charges (less any adjustments) are always due on the first bill due date of the semester.** A second bill reflecting new charges (and payments) will be mailed to your local mailing address approximately 10 days after the first bill due date.

It is recommended that checks be written on a U.S. bank and in U.S. funds in order to avoid processing delays of up to three weeks and possible bank fees. If the delay extends beyond the tuition due date, late and service charges may be assessed.

**NOTE:** All checks containing restrictive endorsements are null and void and nonbinding on the university.

If you must send payments via express mail, send them to the Bursar's Office, Regent, Room 175, Boulder, CO 80309-0041.

If you do not receive a tuition and fee bill, you are still responsible for knowing the amount of your bill and for paying it on time.

The Bursar's Office hours from August 21 to September 4 are Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (Tuesday, September 1, and Wednesday, September 2 until 6:00 p.m.). Refer to information included with your schedule/bill for extended hours of service.

The Bursar's Office offers personal assistance to Spanish-speaking students and students with a disability. If you need assistance, stop by the Bursar's Office, Regent, Room 150 or call (303) 492-5381, or if deaf or hard of hearing, call (303) 492-3528 (TTY).

### Tuition Payment Option: Deferred Tuition

By completing and returning the deferred tuition agreement located on the reverse side of your schedule/bill, you are allowed to pay one-half of the amount due on **September 2**. The minimum balance due, indicated on the reverse side of your bill, is reduced automatically by any credits (financial aid, insurance, RA/TA tuition waivers, and scholarships) applied after your bill is produced. If there are changes, you can call CU Connect at (303) 938-8110, or call (303) 492-5091 for your current balance or access your current bill information on PLUS at <http://www.colorado.edu/plus>.

On **October 7**, you must pay the balance of your bill and a one-percent finance charge and any new charges added to your bill. A second bill reflecting this balance is mailed to your local mailing address the third week of September. Make sure your address is current.

If the deferred tuition agreement is not part of your schedule/bill, you may also defer your tuition at the student billing windows in Regent from August 21 to September 2.

### Failure to Pay in Full by the Deadline

A **financial stop** will be placed on your record if you fail to pay your full tuition and fee bill by the published deadline. This stop will prevent you from:

- registering for future terms
- participating in drop/add
- receiving an academic transcript
- receiving a diploma

In addition, if you are registered for a future term and a finance stop is added to your record, you are in risk of losing those classes.

**A late-payment charge, in addition to a service charge** on the unpaid balance (one percent per month), is assessed according to the following schedule:

300-499.99 .....	\$20
500-699.99 .....	\$30
700-899.99 .....	\$40
\$900 and over .....	\$50

All past due accounts are referred to the Student Debt Management department for collection, where additional collection charges may be assessed.

Colorado law requires the university to place all delinquent accounts with the state's Central Collection Services Office (CCS). If your account is referred to CCS, you must pay any collection costs allowed by the Uniform Consumer Credit Code.

### Direct Lending

*All Federal Direct Stafford/Ford and PLUS loan proceeds are applied directly to your tuition and fee bill.* If your financial aid pays your bill in full, and there is money remaining, you are entitled to a refund (see below).

### Getting Your Refund

If your tuition account reflects a credit balance, you are entitled to a refund. You can receive your refund either by:

- **Direct Deposit** - If you are currently enrolled for direct deposit, or sign up by August 5, and have a credit balance on your tuition account as of August 17, your fall 1998 refund will be deposited into your bank account on August 21. Throughout the semester, whenever your tuition account reflects a credit balance, your refund will be deposited to your bank account 48 hours after a credit balance appears on your tuition and fee account.

For more information, or to sign up for this service, please call (303) 492-5381 or (303) 492-3528 (TTY), or stop by and fill out an application form.

- **Refund Checks** - If you do not sign up for direct deposit, and your tuition account reflects a credit balance as of August 17, a refund check will be mailed to your local mailing address on August 20. This refund **cannot** be picked up.

If your tuition account reflects a credit balance after August 17, a refund check is available at the cashier's window in Regent beginning August 21. You must have your photo ID with you. Checks not picked up will be mailed to your local mailing address on a monthly basis throughout the semester.

### Tuition and Fee Information on the WWW

If you have any questions regarding tuition information on PLUS, call the Bursar's Office at (303) 492-5381. If deaf or hard of hearing, call (303) 492-3528 (TTY). The Bursar's Office can also be reached by e-mail at [bursars@spot.colorado.edu](mailto:bursars@spot.colorado.edu).

### Financial Aid

If you meet all of the qualifications to receive financial aid funds, your scholarship, grant, or loan proceeds are automatically applied to your bill.

All Federal Direct Student Loans and Federal Perkins Loans are credited to your university bill, provided you meet all the eligibility criteria to receive your financial aid and you return all promissory notes.

### Short-Term Loans

Short-term loans up to \$500 are available to students during periods of enrollment and between fall and spring semesters. You must be at least eighteen years of age and enrolled at least half-time on the Boulder campus to qualify (SAVE and Continuing Education students are not eligible), and you must present your photo ID. All loans must be backed by financial aid or have a co-signer.

### Veterans' Benefits

If you are entitled to veterans' benefits, write Veterans' Services, Office of Financial Aid, Campus Box 106, Boulder, CO 80309-0106, or call (303) 492-7322 for further information.

### Withdrawing and Financial Aid

The University of Colorado at Boulder refund/repayment policy is based on requirements stated in federal regulations (34 CFR 668.22). An adjustment to your tuition and fees bill may result from your withdrawal. A refund or repayment may result. This refund does not mean that you will receive money; it means returning financial aid funds to financial aid accounts if financial aid was used to pay any portion of your bill (direct loans, Federal Pell Grant, etc.).

The withdrawal policy regarding tuition and fees is found on page 37, and in the CU-Boulder catalog. If you did not receive sufficient financial aid to cover the charges and repay financial aid accounts, you will receive a bill.

There is an exception to the above for a first-time student. If you are a first-time student and you withdraw before 60 percent of the semester has passed, the financial aid office must calculate the "portion that remains" of the

semester and assess the amount of financial aid to be repaid to the funds appropriately.

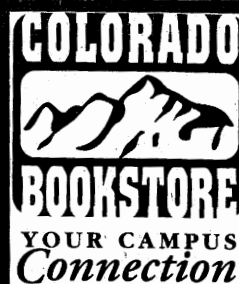
In the case of special circumstances that make it impractical for you to complete the semester, the Bursar's Office will review the information you give and make a settlement that is reasonable and fair to both you and the university.

### Refunds

If you received financial aid other than work-study, and the calculation results in a refund, we refund financial aid accounts in the following order: Federal Direct Stafford/Ford Loan, unsubsidized; Federal Direct Stafford/Ford Loan, subsidized; Federal Direct PLUS loan; Federal Pell Grant Program; Federal SEOG Program; Colorado Student Incentive Grant; Other Title IV programs; Institutional Aid; Colorado Athletic Scholarship; Graduate Need Grant; Colorado Graduate Fellowship; Undergraduate Merit; Colorado Extended Studies; Colorado Student Grant; private sources; student.

The amount refunded to any program cannot be greater than the amount awarded from that fund. Refunds are rounded upward to the nearest dollar. If a refund is made to a loan program, you or your parent will receive simultaneous notice of the refund. If you petition the Bursar's Office for a different rebate period, we will recalculate the refund to the financial aid accounts if your petition is granted. Examples of refund calculations are available upon request from the Office of Financial Aid.

## Repayment

The following repayment policy is applied if you received financial aid for educational costs other than tuition and fees and you withdraw. Federal Direct Loans and work-study awards are excluded from this calculation.

To determine if you received an overpayment, we must establish that the *funds you received* (the refund check after your aid paid your bill) for living expenses, travel, etc. (these are non-direct education costs) exceeded the costs for your living expenses, etc., for the time you were enrolled. See the Office of Financial Aid or the fact sheet titled *Withdrawing and Financial Aid* for the percentages used.

If any portion of the refund you received cannot be attributed to the cost of books and supplies, room and board, transportation, and medical expenses, then that portion must be returned to the fund from which it was received. If you received aid from more than one fund, then any overpayment will be returned to the funds in the same order as the refund order stated previously, excluding the Federal Direct Loan programs.

The Office of Financial Aid will return the amount calculated to the aid funds and then a bill will be created for you by the Bursar's Office. In the event that there is a balance due, your bill payments will be handled by the Bursar's Office.

## General Information

Many of the questions you may have about registration procedures are answered in this section.

### Addresses

The following addresses on your student record must be kept current:

- **Mailing address** - your address during the fall and spring semesters. Registration information for future semesters, outstanding tuition and fee bills, refund checks, and financial aid information are mailed to you at this address from late August through mid-May. (**Exception:** Your permanent address is used during the winter semester break.)

- **Permanent address** - considered your "home-base" address. It can be your parents' address, a Boulder address, or the address of someone who knows how to reach you. Schedule/bills are mailed to this address before the semester begins. This address is used for mailings during the summer months and during the winter semester break.

Other offices, such as the library, housing, payroll, and Wardenburg, have separate address systems and changes must be made there as well.

You can look up any of your addresses on the Personal Look-Up Services (PLUS) at <http://www.colorado.edu/plus> (see page 34) and, if needed, send us your address changes via PLUS. Or you can fill out a change-of-address form at the Office of the Registrar in Regent 105, in the Office of Financial Aid in Environmental Design, room 2, or by calling (303) 492-6970. You can also update your address by sending an e-mail to [change.address@colorado.edu](mailto:change.address@colorado.edu). Be sure to indicate which address type you're updating.

**NOTE:** The address that appears on your student record (and PLUS) also appears on the directory on CU-Boulder's home page on the web. When you make a change to any of your addresses, the change is normally updated on your student record within 24 hours. The same change is then normally updated on PLUS nightly during the registration and drop/add periods and weekly during the rest of the year. Addresses on the directory on the web are updated weekly.

### Advising

Check your invitation to register for advising requirements.

If you need advising and are an:

- Arts and sciences or engineering student - Call your faculty advisor, your major department, or your dean's office for advising. **NOTE:** If you are currently a freshman or sophomore in the College of Arts and Sciences, core advising is required. See <http://www.colorado.edu/ArtsSciences/core.html> on the web for information.

- A student in any other college or school - Call your dean's office.



### Campus ID Card (Buff OneCard)

The Buff OneCard is your official CU-Boulder student ID. It allows you access to the Student Recreation Center, libraries, meal plans, RTD buses, purchasing of tickets to athletic events, accessing some areas of the residence halls, and anywhere else that official CU-Boulder identification is required.

The Buff OneCard office is located in the basement of the UMC, room 25. Office hours are Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. In order to receive your Buff OneCard some form of picture ID is required. Your initial Buff OneCard is free (Boulder main campus students only). There is a replacement fee of \$15 for lost cards. To report a lost or stolen card, call (303) 492-1212 immediately to avoid unauthorized use of your card. Do not give your Buff OneCard to anyone else.

**Buff Bucks** is the Buff OneCard's optional on-campus expense account. If you choose this option, you can make purchases at campus vending machines equipped with card readers and campus merchants. It debits against the total value on your card. You can deposit funds to your Buff Bucks account at the OneCard Office or at Buff Bucks Transaction Machines located in the UMC, recreation center, and Williams Village. You can store up to \$250 in your Buff Bucks account. Since it is not a bank account, cash withdrawals cannot be made.

Through an agreement with the U of C Federal Credit Union, the Buff OneCard also offers an ATM/Debit Card option called **Buff Gold**. This option allows you to use the Buff OneCard to get cash from ATMs and to make debit card purchases from establishments that belong to the Star/Explore network (such as King Soopers and Safeway grocery stores). To activate this option, open a share draft account at the U of C Federal Credit Union or at the Buff OneCard Office. Your cash withdrawal and purchase limit will be the amount of money you have in your credit union account.

You may also elect to use your Buff OneCard as a **long distance calling card** through MCI. You will receive 10 free minutes of long-distance calling by getting an MCI authorization code and PIN. If you are a residence hall student, direct dialing from your room would still cost less than using the calling card.

### Changing Your College or Major

If you want to transfer into another CU-Boulder college or school, check with the new dean's office for admission criteria and information on enrollment levels, application procedures, and deadlines. If you have already submitted

an IUT application, register as if you have been accepted into the new school or college. **NOTE:** You may not be able to register for some courses until you have been accepted into your new school or college. Once you are accepted, you may change your schedule through the drop/add deadline.

If you want to change or declare a major, go to the new major department for the required procedures.

**NOTE:** If you are or will be receiving financial aid and are working on two majors (same degree) or a major and a minor and don't plan to graduate from both majors (or your major and minor) at the same time, your financial aid may be in jeopardy. For more information, contact the Office of Financial Aid in the basement of Environmental Design, or call (303) 492-5091.

### Confidentiality of Student Records

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords you certain rights with respect to your education records. They are:

(1) The right to inspect and review your education records within 45 days of the day the university receives a request for access.

You should submit to the registrar, dean, head of the academic department, or other appropriate official, written requests that identify the record(s) you wish to inspect. The university official will make arrangements for access and notify you of the time and place where the records may be inspected. If the records are not maintained by the university official to whom the request was submitted, that official shall advise you of the correct official to whom the request should be addressed.

(2) The right to request the amendment of your education records that you believe are inaccurate or misleading.

You may ask the university to amend a record that you believe is inaccurate or misleading. You should write the university official responsible for the record, clearly identify the part of the record you want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading.

If the university decides not to amend the record as requested by you, the university will notify you of the decision and advise you of your right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to you when notified of the right to a hearing.

(3) The right to consent of disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in your education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.

One exception which permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the university in an administrative, supervisory, academic or research, or support staff position (including law enforcement unit personnel and health staff); a person or company with whom the university has contracted (such as an attorney, auditor, or collection agent); a person

serving on the Board of Regents; or a student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or one assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks.

A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.

Upon request, the university discloses education records without consent to officials of another school in which a student seeks or intends to enroll.

(4) The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the university to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the office that administers FERPA is:

The following items of student information have been designated by the University of Colorado at Boulder as public or "directory" information: name, addresses, telephone numbers, e-mail address, ID photo, dates of attendance, registration status, class, major field of study, awards, honors, degree(s) conferred, past and present participation in officially recognized sports and activities, physical factors (height, weight) of athletes, and date and place of birth. Such information may be disclosed by the institution at its discretion.

You have the right to withhold "directory information" from inquirers by selecting a "privacy" or "limited-privacy" option. The privacy option will prevent all directory and enrollment information from being released to all who do not have a clear educational interest for access to this information. The limited-privacy option will prevent the release of directory information to off-campus inquirers and to campus directory services, but is not as restrictive as the privacy option.

## Credit-Hour Limits and Course-Load Definitions

**During the registration period**, undergraduate students can register for a maximum of 19 credit hours (15 credit hours for graduate students and 16 credit hours for law students), *including wait-listed courses*.

**During the final drop/add period**, undergraduates are allowed to register for up to 21 credit hours, *including wait-listed courses*. **NOTE:** A tuition surcharge is assessed for every credit hour added over 18.

For undergraduate students, 12 credit hours is considered a full-time load for financial aid and for enrollment-verification purposes. Graduate students qualify for full-time status for enrollment verification purposes if they are enrolled for 5 or more hours or any number of thesis hours. Law students need 10 or more hours for full-time status. Check with the Office of Financial Aid for their full- and part-time status definitions for graduate students.

## Credit and Grading Options

You can select or change the following credit and grading options via CU Connect through 5:00 p.m. on September 2 or at the registrar's office in Regent 105 through 5:00 p.m. on September 11. (*Be sure to read the highlighted note below.*)

- **No Credit.** To register for a course on a no-credit basis, call CU Connect and select the no-credit option (see page 14). You still pay full tuition for a no-credit course, but you do not receive a grade. An *NC* will appear on your transcript in place of a grade. Check with your college or school for policies on no-credit status and how it may be used. **NOTE:** No-credit courses do not count toward full-time enrollment for financial aid purposes.

- **Pass/Fail.** Check with your college or school for the restrictions on the number and types of courses that can be taken pass/fail. To register for a course pass/fail, call CU Connect and select the pass/fail option (see page 14).

Once you have signed up for a course on a pass/fail basis, it is *not* noted on class rosters or final-grade lists, nor should your instructor be notified that you are taking the course pass/fail. You are assigned a grade for the course. A grade of *D-* or above is converted to a *P*; an *F* remains an *F*. Only the *F* is calculated as part of your GPA; a grade of *P* is not counted.

**NOTE:** If you attempt to change the status of a course from or to *P/F* or *NC* by telephone, you will not be able to re-enroll in the course if it is closed or a wait list exists for the course. You can make this change without jeopardizing your enrollment in the course by filling out a credit-option form at the registrar's office in Regent 105 (through September 11), at the Coors Events/Conference Center (August 21 and 23-24), or in Regent 1B60 (August 25 - September 4).

- **Variable Credit.** All independent study courses and some regular courses are offered on a variable-credit basis (that is, they have a range of minimum and maximum credits). When you call CU Connect to register, enter the number of credit hours you want to receive for the course when prompted. The number of credits can be changed throughout the registration and drop/add periods through 5:00 p.m., Friday, September 11.

## E-Mail the Registrar

Have you ever had an academic records-related or registration-related question but didn't know whom to ask? Or have you ever had a comment you wanted to share with us about one of our programs or processes?

E-mail the registrar's office at [registrar@colorado.edu](mailto:registrar@colorado.edu) to get some answers or make your comments. Your e-mails will be read by a staff member in the registrar's office and then forwarded to the appropriate person for a response.

## Grade Information

To obtain information about grades at the end of the semester:

- Call CU Connect, the telephone registration system, at (303) 938-8110, during regular hours of operation (see page 14). When prompted to enter an application code, enter a "2" to access the grading application. You'll then need to enter the term code for the semester you want to access, followed by your student number and your PIN. Term codes consist of the last two digits in the year followed by one of these numbers:

- 1 = spring
- 4 = summer
- 7 = fall

For **fall semester 1998** grades (available beginning December 24), use the **term code 987**. For **spring semester 1998** grades (available beginning May 21), use the **term code 981**.

- Look up your grades on PLUS on the World Wide Web, <http://www.colorado.edu/plus>. Fall semester 1998 grades will be available on PLUS beginning December 24.
- Check to see if your grades are posted, as many instructors post grades for their courses outside of their offices, the classroom, or the departmental office.
- Order official transcripts at no charge by writing to:

These can also be ordered through a signed FAX request to (303) 492-4884, or via a telephone request to (303) 492-8987. Your transcript will be mailed out within four working days.

- Order an unofficial transcript for a cost of \$1 (next-day service) or \$5 (same-day service) at the transcript window, Regent lobby, or by calling (303) 492-6907. Unofficial transcripts are not mailed off campus.

## Graduation

If you plan to graduate within the next year, you must check with your dean's office for graduation application deadlines and notification procedures.

Graduating students with Federal Perkins/NDSL loans must complete a loan exit interview before leaving the university.

Graduation rates for full-time freshmen: Entering in '93, 4-year rate: 35%. Entering in '92, 5-year rate: 56%. Entering in '91, 6-year graduation rate: 65%.

## World Wide Web Sites

The UCB web site provides important information regarding registration, a listing of available courses, the final exam schedule, course descriptions, information about the Buff OneCard, tuition, and more.

More than 60 terminals are located in buildings and residence halls throughout the campus. Computing labs in Business, Duane Physics, Economics, Education, Engineering, Environmental Design, Fleming Law, Hellems, Ketchum, Macky, Muenzinger, Recreation Center, and Norlin also have web access.

## AVAILABLE COURSES ON THE WORLD WIDE WEB

At any time during the registration and drop/add periods, you can determine which courses are available by accessing the UCB web site from any computer terminal that has web access. Open courses are listed and entries are updated regularly.

Available courses offered for fall, all available arts and sciences core courses, and all available courses in order of time offered will be displayed.

## DEGREE AUDITS ON THE WORLD WIDE WEB

Degree audits for students in journalism and architecture and planning are available on the World Wide Web. The address is <http://www.colorado.edu/plus>. These students can also order degree audits from their dean's office.

Arts and sciences core audits are also available on the World Wide Web. Arts and sciences students can also order core audits from their dean's office and major audits from their major department.

Degree audits for most students in the College of Business are also available on the World Wide-Web or can be ordered from their dean's office.

## PLUS: VIEWING YOUR RECORDS ON-LINE

You can view the following information on PLUS (Personal Look Up Services) on the World Wide Web by using your university student number and Personal Identification Number (PIN):

### REGISTRAR'S HOME PAGE

### Other Registration Programs

A number of different registrations are held each semester for specific categories of students. If you have questions about any of these registrations, call the number listed in that section or see the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog*.

### Concurrent Registration

If you plan to take at least one course at CU-Boulder in the fall and cannot register for all courses required for your degree program, you may be able to register concurrently on another CU campus. The course(s) must be required for your degree program, you must have your dean's permission, and enrollment levels must not have been reached on the other campus. Graduate students must have their advisor's approval. If all these conditions are met, you may register on another CU campus for up to two courses or 6 credit hours, whichever is greater.

You cannot register concurrently until the final drop/add period has begun on the other campus. Boulder students pay Boulder tuition rates for all courses.

Concurrent registration forms and instructions are available at the registrar's office in Regent 105 beginning August 3. For information, call (303) 492-8494.

**Note to Graduate Students:** Check with the Office of the Registrar for exceptions to the home-campus registration requirement and limitation on credit hours at the host campus.

### Course Reservation Program

The Course Reservation Program assists you in getting the courses you need to graduate by giving you an opportunity to reserve space in a course and enroll in that course for the next semester before the next registration period begins. All undergraduate courses offered at CU-Boulder that utilize wait lists, except for controlled enrollment courses, are included in the Course Reservation Program.

You are eligible to participate in the Course Reservation Program for *spring semester 1999* if your name is on a wait list for a course as of 5:00 p.m. on September 2 (the wait list deadline), and you don't get enrolled in the course.

**NOTE:** This applies only to course wait lists on the Student Information System (SIS), not wait lists that may be kept manually by a department.

If you are on a course wait list as of 5:00 p.m. on September 2, you should plan to come into the registrar's office, Regent 105, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., **October 26 - 30** to register for the course for spring 1999. Registrations will *not* be honored through the Course Reservation Program after October 30. In addition, all restrictions are honored, and you must clear up any "stops" before registering. You will register for all other spring 1999 courses during your regular registration time assignment.

### Faculty and Staff Registration

All permanent faculty and staff members at CU-Boulder may take 1 to 6 credit hours each year without paying tuition. Course work must be taken outside of scheduled working hours or an adjusted work schedule must be established that is acceptable to the employing department. For more information, call (303) 492-4369 or (303) 492-5381.

### High School Nondegree Registration

The high school nondegree program is coordinated by the Division of Continuing Education. Registration is held through the SAVE and Boulder Evening programs. For information on availability of courses and eligibility for registration using CU Connect, please call (303) 492-5148.

### Late Registration

To be guaranteed enrollment for fall 1998, you must complete registration by **midnight on August 14**. (**Exception:** Incoming freshmen and transfer students attending the final arts and sciences and business orientation session must complete registration by 5:00 p.m. on August 20). If you do not register by this deadline (this includes graduate students), you are subject to late registration. Only students in open categories are eligible for late registration. In addition, a lower registration priority and a **\$50 late fee** are applied.

If you are a continuing student, call (303) 492-6970 on August 17 to see if you are eligible for late registration. If you are a new or readmitted student, go to Admissions Operations in Regent 1B65 (303) 492-2451 to check for eligibility. Students who are eligible for late registration must go to the registrar's office in Regent 105 (August 17 - 20), to the Coors Events/Conference Center (August 21 and 23-24), or to Regent 1B60 (August 25 - September 4) to be set up for late registration.

### Parking Permits and Bicycle Registration

To buy a parking permit, you must bring a photo ID and a valid state motor-vehicle registration form. The cost of a parking permit for autos is \$72, \$96, or \$120; it is \$24 for motorcycles (all prices are subject to change). You can pay with cash, check, or charge it to your tuition and fee bill.

Parking permit sales take place at the Coors Events/Conference Center, Concourse Level, according to the following schedule (subject to change):

If you have a disability making it too difficult for you to come to the permit sale at the Events Center, please call a parking representative at (303) 492-1541.

For fall semester, bike registration begins on Thursday, August 20. Look for the blue canopy near the buffalo at the northwest entrance to the Events Center. Hours are the same as the permit sale. On Sunday, August 23, an additional table will be set up at Darley Commons (Williams Village) for bike registration. For further information, call (303) 492-2322.

### Registering on Another CU Campus

If you want to take course work on another University of Colorado campus but not go through the concurrent registration program, apply for admission to that campus and follow its registration procedures. Check with your dean's office for approval. (Students in the College of Arts and Sciences may not register at the Denver or Colorado Springs campus except in the summer.)

### Senior Citizens Auditors Program Registration

All Colorado residents age 55 and older can register in this tuition-free, noncredit program to audit classes on a space-available basis. This program is sponsored by the CU-Boulder Alumni Association. Registration for senior auditors is at Koenig Alumni Center, August 31, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., and September 1, 9:00 a.m. to noon. Call (303) 492-8484 for information.

### Space-Available (SAVE) Registration

Nondegree students (students not currently enrolled in a degree program at CU-Boulder) may take Boulder campus courses on a space-available basis. Register in person (location to be announced), August 25, 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. or through CU Connect. After August 25, registration will be at the Continuing Education Office (1221 University) or through CU Connect. For information on registration eligibility and the location of in-person registration for August 25, please call (303) 492-5148. Tuition charges are identical to CU-Boulder rates, and payment is due in full upon enrollment.

**NOTE:** Out-of-state students who want to register for 3 credit hours or less through SAVE are assessed a rate less than the regular out-of-state tuition rate. Degree students must obtain approval from their dean.

### Time Out Program

The Time Out Program (TOP) provides an opportunity for you to take a leave from the university for a semester or a year without losing your place in your current college or school. You must be in good academic standing and have your dean's approval. Readmission to the university is guaranteed when you return, providing you meet registration and deposit deadlines. A nonrefundable \$40 application fee is charged. The TOP application deadline for fall semester is **October 7**. More information is available from the Office of the Registrar, Regent 105, (303) 492-8673.

### Withdrawal Procedures

If you need to withdraw from fall semester 1998 *before* September 9, fill out a withdrawal form in the registrar's office or write a letter to the Withdrawal Coordinator, Office of the Registrar, Campus Box 7, Boulder, CO 80309-0007. You need not drop your courses; this is done for you.

If you withdraw *after* September 9, you must complete a withdrawal interview to discuss procedures for withdrawing.

**NOTE:** If you drop all your courses and don't re-register for courses, you are considered withdrawn from the university and you should notify the registrar's office.

If you are registered for courses and do not officially withdraw from the university by contacting the registrar's office, failing grades are recorded for all of your courses.

**Remember:** Deadlines and rules for withdrawing may vary within each college and school. Check with your dean's office concerning withdrawal rules.

**NOTE:** If you withdraw from CU-Boulder but plan to return to the Boulder main campus in the future, you must either go on the Time Out Program (see above) or reapply through the Office of Admissions.

Tuition assessments for students with financial aid may differ from those listed on this page. Please check with the Bursar's Office at (303) 492-5381. If deaf or hard of hearing, call (303) 492-3528 (TTY).

Withdrawing students (including students applying for the Time Out Program) with Federal Perkins/NDSL loans must complete a loan exit interview before leaving the university. Failure to do so will result in a stop on your record. This stop will prevent you from receiving a diploma or an academic transcript of work at the university and from registering for any future terms. In order to complete a loan exit interview, contact the university Student Loans department in the Bursar's Office at (303) 492-5571. If deaf or hard of hearing, call (303) 492-3528 (TTY).

## About Course Listings

### Understanding Course Numbers

Courses are numbered according to the following guidelines:

1000-2999	Lower-division courses
3000-4999	Upper-division courses
5000-5999	Courses intended for graduate students and qualified undergraduates
6000-8999	Courses open to graduate students only

Enrollment in courses with a 700-, 800-, or 900-level section number is controlled by each department. The department staff either gives you the five-digit course call number so you can register for the course via CU Connect, enrolls you in the course directly on the computer, or gives you a special action form to take to a central drop/add site (during the final drop/add period *only*) or to the registrar's office.

### Understanding Course Listings

The headers at the top of each column of the course listings include:

**Core Diamonds**—A diamond (♦) appears to the left of courses that fulfill a College of Arts and Sciences core curriculum requirement. (Refer to the College of Business Degree Requirements brochure for information on courses that fulfill the College of Business core curriculum requirements.)

**Course Title**—Often abbreviated; refer to the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog* for the complete title and course description.

**Section Number**—This three-digit number refers to the specific meeting pattern of the course. The three-digit number alone is the lecture number. When an R, L, P, or S precedes the section number, it indicates that the section is a recitation (R), a laboratory (L), a practicum (P) or a studio (S), which must be taken in addition to the lecture. Some courses may have three: lecture, lab, and recitation.

**Call Number**—The five-digit number, specific to a particular term, that is used for requesting a specific section of a course via CU Connect.

**Time/Days**—Meeting time and days of the class (M—Monday; T—Tuesday; W—Wednesday; R—Thursday; F—Friday; S—Saturday; and U—Sunday).

**Building/Room**—The building name and room number where the class meets; this is subject to change. (See this page and the next for the building abbreviations.)

**Maximum Enrollment**—The maximum number of students allowed to enroll in the course.

When a course has a prerequisite and/or a corequisite, a note (*in italics*) appears just after the course title. Additional course notes are inserted into each course listing, as needed.

*Remember:* Some courses may not be available to you due to college or school restrictions or class size limitations. In this case, CU Connect will inform you with an appropriate message.

**Department Headings** - These will include the phone number and the department location.

☐ - **Departments with the computer terminal symbol have terminals available for drop/add on August 21 (Fri.) and August 24 (Mon.) through September 2 (Wed.).** You may go to any of these departments to drop or add courses. (See page 18 for times and for more information about drop/add sites.)



The core curriculum must be satisfied by all students in the College of Arts and Sciences who began their undergraduate study in the summer of 1988 or later. Those students who finished high school in the spring of 1988 or later must also meet the college's minimum academic preparation standards, or MAPS (see page 118). You may not use courses taken to complete a MAPS deficiency to fulfill any area of the core curriculum, with the exception of foreign language.

There are eleven requirements of the core curriculum—four in skills acquisition and seven in the content areas of study. The requirements are all listed here, with instructions and lists of courses that will fulfill each requirement. For a complete explanation of graduation requirements in the College of Arts and Sciences, see the University of Colorado Catalog.

Selected majors are exempt from portions of the core curriculum (see sections 6, 8, 9 and 10 of the content areas of study). Content area exemptions may be used cumulatively if you are graduating with more than one eligible major.

Although a single course may appear in several areas, you may use it to meet only one requirement.

### Skills Acquisition

### 9. Natural Science (13 hours minimum)

The natural science requirement, which consists of passing 13 hours of approved natural science course work, includes one two-semester sequence of courses and at least 1 credit hour of an associated laboratory or field experience.

No more than two lower-division courses may be taken from any single department (1-credit-hour laboratory/field experience courses are excepted).

Students who graduate with a major in the natural sciences (Biochemistry, Chemistry, EPOB, Geology, Kinesiology, MCDB, or Physics) are exempt from completing the natural science requirement.

**Minimum Academic Preparation Standards**

The College of Arts and Sciences has adopted the following standards for admissions. These standards are defined in high school years.

- English** 4 high school years (including 2 in composition)
- Mathematics** 3 high school years (2 in algebra and 1 in geometry)
- Natural Science** 3 high school years (including 2 in lab science, one of which must be chemistry or physics)
- Social Science** 3 high school years (including one of U.S. or world history and one of geography. A student who has U.S. history may use 1/2 year of world history and 1/2 year of geography instead of one year of geography.)
- Foreign Language** completion of a third-year-level course (level III) in a high school foreign language sequence

**Policies Concerning the Completion of MAPS**

If you were admitted to the College of Arts and Sciences with missing MAPS courses, you are subject to the following policies:

1. Each year of missing high school work can be made up by one semester of appropriate CU-Boulder course work.
2. All course work taken toward fulfillment of the MAPS must be taken for a letter grade, and you must receive a passing grade.
3. You are required to enroll in and complete at least one MAPS course each term, beginning in your first term of enrollment, until such time as all MAPS requirements are completed. This policy applies to new freshmen, transfer students, and students transferring from other colleges or schools on the Boulder campus and from other campuses of the University. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in suspension at the end of the term in which you cease to complete

missing MAPS courses.

4. All students who first enroll in one college or school at CU-Boulder and who subsequently transfer to another college or school are required to meet the MAPS specified for the new college or school, whether or not they have completed their MAPS courses in their previous college or school.

5. Double-degree students must meet MAPS requirements of both degree-granting colleges or schools.

6. During the arts and sciences orientation, students must consult with a CU-Boulder academic advisor to determine which specific courses may be used to meet a MAPS requirement.

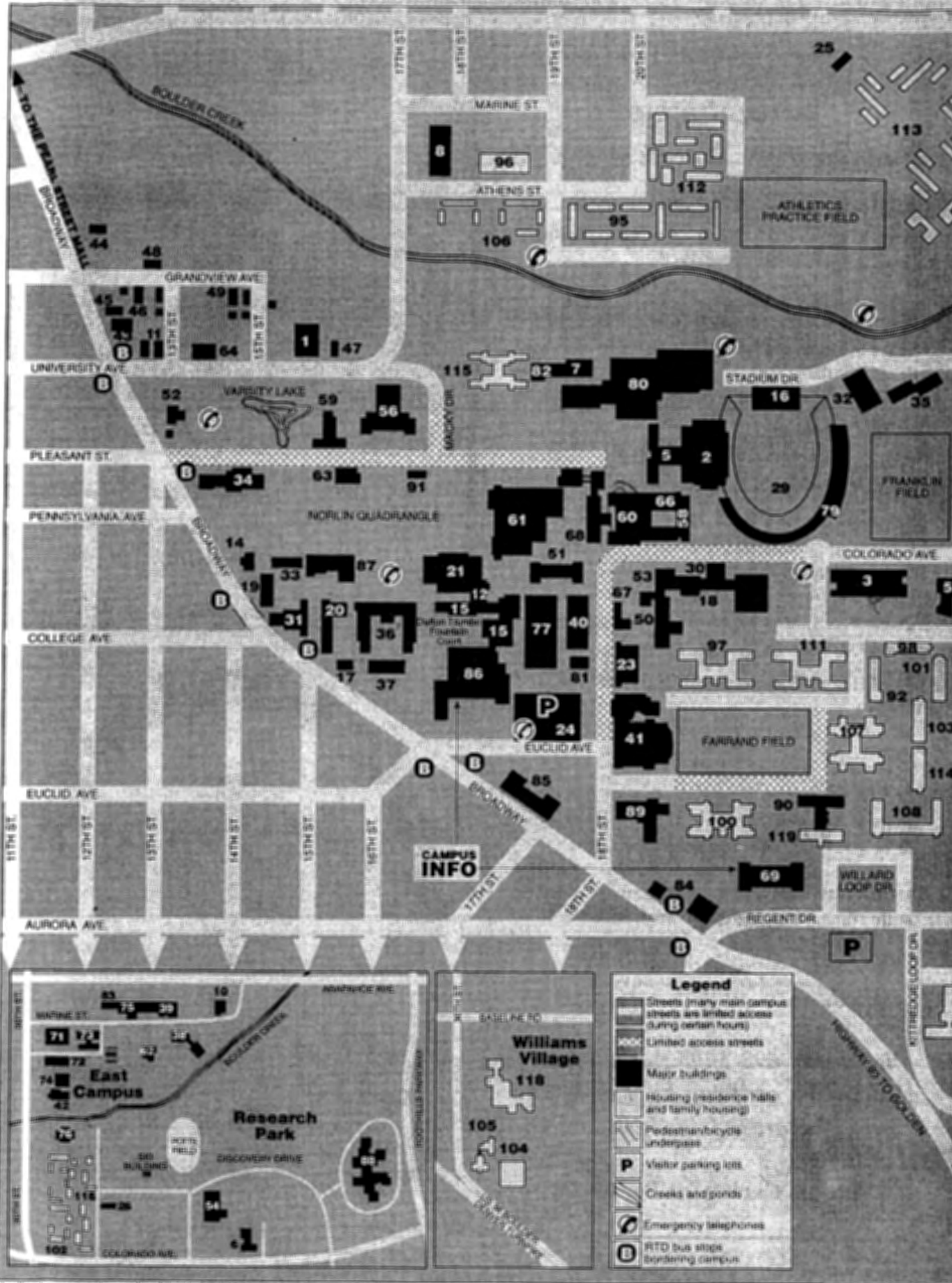

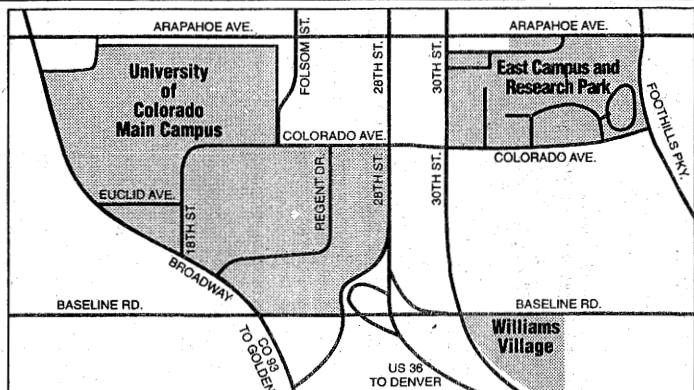


