Registration/Academic Calendar

Any student who completes registration agrees to pay the University of Colorado at Boulder according to the payment terms documented in the *Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* under the Paying Your Bill section. (See page 30.)

MARCH 19 - 29 (MON. - THURS.)

- Fall 2001 course reservation registration period for eligible students. (See page 39 of the *Spring 2001 Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* for eligibility requirements.)

APRIL 2 - 29 (MON. - SUN.)

- Fall 2001 registration time assignments for students enrolled during spring 2001. For best course selection, register as soon as possible after your time assignment begins. Continuing students can register through June 1 (also July 30 - August 17).

APRIL 30 (MON.) - JUNE 1 (FRI.)

- Schedule adjustment for continuing degree students who have completed registration for fall semester and registration for continuing students who have not yet registered. After June 1, these students may not register or adjust their schedules until July 30 - August 17.
- Fall 2001 registration for new graduate, readmitted students, and eligible students continuing from summer to fall. After June 1, readmitted students may not register or adjust their schedules until July 30 - August 17.

JUNE 15 (FRI.) - JULY 27 (FRI.)

- Fall 2001 registration for incoming freshman and transfer students (*on specified dates*). Continuing and readmitted students may not register or adjust their schedules until July 30 - August 17.
- Registration continues (*on specified dates*) for new graduate students and eligible students continuing from summer to fall.

JULY 30 (MON.) - AUGUST 17 (FRI.)

- Final registration and schedule adjustment for continuing, new graduate, readmitted students, and eligible students continuing from summer to fall.
- Final registration period for all incoming freshman and transfer students who did not register in June and July (except those in arts and sciences attending the final orientation on August 21-23) and schedule adjustments for transfer students who registered in June or July.

AUGUST 3 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** to update your billing and permanent addresses to ensure that your fall 2001 schedule/bill is mailed to the correct address.

AUGUST 6 - 20 (MON. - MON.)

- Schedule/bills mailed to the billing address of all students who register by August 17. If no billing address is on record, schedule/bills will be mailed to the permanent address.

AUGUST 17 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** for continuing students to withdraw from the university and receive a **full refund** of the \$200 enrollment deposit, less any outstanding charges. (This deadline to withdraw and not forfeit the deposit applies to students planning to go on the Time Out Program as well.) New and readmitted students are not eligible for a refund. (See pages 39-40.)

- **Deadline** for all students, both undergraduate and graduate (except for those incoming freshmen and transfers in arts and sciences attending the final orientation), to register for fall courses. **Registration must be completed by midnight to be guaranteed enrollment for fall semester.** After this date, registration is on a space-available basis, and a **\$50 late fee** is charged. (See page 38 for late registration information.)

AUGUST 23 (THURS.)

- Registration for new freshmen and transfers in arts and sciences who are attending the final orientation on August 21-23, as well as registration for all other new freshmen and transfers who have not yet registered. **These students must complete registration by 5:00 p.m. to be guaranteed enrollment for fall semester.** After this date, registration is on a space-available basis, and a **\$50 late fee** is charged. (See page 38 for late registration information.)

AUGUST 24 (FRI.)

- Schedule/bills mailed to the mailing address of all students who register August 19-23.
- Drop/add time assignments begin for all incoming freshman and transfer students. (See page 18.)
- ACCESS registration begins. (See page 37.)

AUGUST 26 (SUN.)

- Drop/add time assignments begin for continuing, new, graduate, readmitted students, and faculty/staff. University closed. (See page 18.)

AUGUST 27 (MON.)

- Classes begin.

SEPTEMBER 3 (MON.)

- Labor Day holiday. No classes. University closed.

SEPTEMBER 4 (TUES.)

- Space-available registration for Senior Citizens Auditors Program, Koenig Alumni Center, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.; continues on Wednesday, September 5, 9:00 a.m. to noon. (See page 39.)

SEPTEMBER 5 (WED.)

Add Deadline:

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to add a course, including independent study and thesis, without the instructor's signature. *After this date, you must have the signature of your instructor on a special action form to add a course (through September 14).* **NOTE:** After 5:00 p.m. on this date, CU Connect and web registration are only available for dropping courses (through 5:00 p.m. on September 12, the drop deadline). (See page 19.)

Wait List Deadline:

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to add your name to a course wait list. (See page 19.)

Tuition Payment Deadline:

- **Deadline** (6:00 p.m.) to pay full tuition and fees and to turn in a deferred tuition (two payment plan) agreement. **No grace period.** (See pages 30-31.)
- **Deadline** (6:00 p.m.) to waive university-sponsored health insurance at Wardenburg Health Center.
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to petition to waive UCSU student fees.
- **Deadline** to request a refund of any student opportunities fees you selected. (See pages 12-13.)
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) for private scholarship checks to be received in the financial aid scholarship office to avoid late and service charges. Outstanding charges that are anticipated to be paid by a scholarship that has not been received must be paid by this date in order to avoid late and service charges.

SEPTEMBER 12 (WED.)**Drop Deadline:**

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to drop a course without the instructor's signature, without being assessed tuition and fees for that course, and without a *W* appearing on your transcript. *After this date, you must have the signature of your instructor on a special action form and you must be passing your course to drop it.* (See page 19.)
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to withdraw from the university and only be assessed \$200 in tuition and fees. (See pages 39-40.)

SEPTEMBER 14 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to add a course without petitioning your dean. **NOTE:** Instructor's signature is required on a special action form to add a course. In general, instructors will only approve an add if you've been regularly attending and there's space in the course. (See page 19.)
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to change variable-credit hours, pass/fail, and no-credit status on courses. (See page 19.)

SEPTEMBER 26 (WED.)

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to withdraw from the university and only be assessed 40 percent of full tuition and fees. (See pages 39-40.)

OCTOBER 4 - 5 (THURS. - FRI.)

- Fall break. No classes.

OCTOBER 8 (MON.)

- **Deadline** for students who have three or more final exams on the same day to make arrangements to change their final exam schedule. (See page 5.)

OCTOBER 10 (WED.)

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to drop a course without petitioning your dean. (See page 19.)
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to withdraw from the university and only be assessed 60 percent of full tuition and fees. After this day, 100 percent of tuition and fees is due. (See page 39-40.)
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to pay any unpaid balance, including approved deferred tuition (two payment plan). **No grace period.**
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to turn in Time Out Program (TOP) applications to the registrar's office. (See page 39.)

OCTOBER 22 - 26 (MON. - FRI.)

- Distribution of the *Spring 2002 Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* in Regent foyer, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (except Monday, October 22, until 6:00 p.m.). Beginning Monday, October 29, distribution is in Regent 105. The handbook will also be available at the CU Book Store in the UMC beginning on October 22.

OCTOBER 29 (MON.) - NOVEMBER 2 (FRI.)

- Spring 2002 course reservation registration period for eligible students. (See page 38.)

NOVEMBER 5 (MON.) - DECEMBER 2 (SUN.)

- Spring 2002 registration begins for eligible new and readmitted students.
- Spring 2002 registration period for continuing degree students enrolled during fall 2001.

NOVEMBER 20 - 21 (TUES. - WED.)

- Classes that normally meet on Thursday and Friday will instead be held on Tuesday and Wednesday of this week because of the Thanksgiving holiday. Therefore, classes that normally meet on Tuesdays and Wednesdays will **NOT** meet this week.

NOVEMBER 22 - 23 (THURS. - FRI.)

- Thanksgiving holiday. No classes. University closed.

DECEMBER 3 (MON.)

- Spring 2002 registration begins for eligible new and readmitted students.

DECEMBER 13 (THURS.)

- Last day of classes for fall 2001.

DECEMBER 14 - 20 (FRI. - THURS.)

- Final exams for fall 2002. (There are no exams on Sunday, December 16.)

DECEMBER 21 (FRI.)

- Fall 2001 commencement, Coors Events/Conference Center, 9:30 a.m.

JANUARY 14 (MON.)

- Spring 2002 classes begin.

JANUARY 21 (MON.)

- Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday. University closed.

MARCH 25 - 29 (MON. - FRI.)

- Spring break. No classes. University closed on Friday, March 29.

MAY 3 (FRI.)

- Last day of classes for spring 2002.

MAY 4 - 9 (SAT. - THURS.)

- Final exams for spring 2002. (There are no exams on Sunday, May 5.)

MAY 10 (FRI.)

- Spring 2002 commencement, Folsom Stadium, 9:30 a.m.

If you have three or more final exams scheduled on the same day, you are entitled to arrange an alternative exam time for the last exam or exams scheduled on that day. To qualify for rescheduling final exam times, you must provide evidence that you have three or more exams on the same day, and arrangements must be made with your instructor no later than the end of the sixth week of the semester (Monday, October 8, 2001).

Art Contest Winner



My work, though not realistic, is naturalistic and reflects my intimate personal relationship with the equine race. Each flick of an ear, turn of the neck or swish of the tail is an expression of the horse's personality and imitates the natural curiosity and emotional reactions that I have come to appreciate in my long association with these beautiful animals.

Visually, my horses represent what we, as riders, perceive as physical impairments blended with that which we consider desirable attributes. For example, the horse tends to have stocky legs, with the front end an inch shorter than the back. This is to promote balance and to insure he doesn't trip over his own feet while escaping from various horse eating critters. Perhaps it is a practical design from nature's standpoint but highly undesirable from a sport horse point of view.

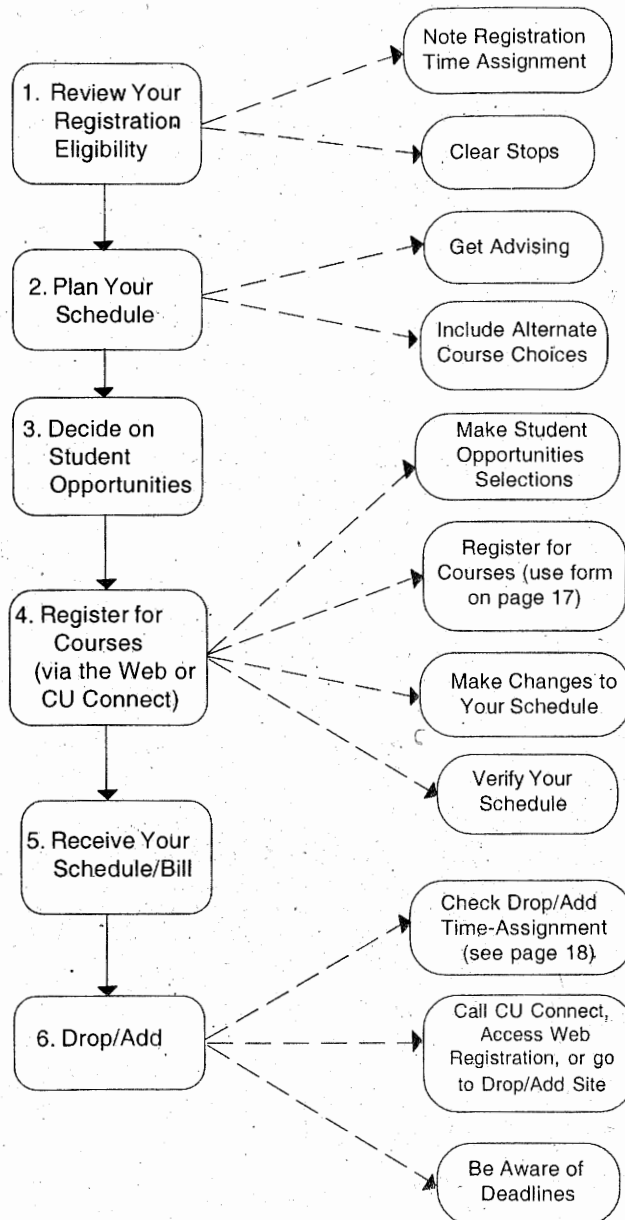
Dressage, my own discipline, demands that the horse have long graceful legs in order to execute the elegant movements demanded by the sport and the front end must be at least as tall as the back end in order to carry himself and his rider with aplomb. Personally, I have never met such a horse and the animals I have recreated here do have the required long legs but also possess the tendency of being, shall we say, just a wee bit short in the front.

This describes, in part, the inspiration for the creative judgment that goes into my art but it's ultimate purpose is simply to entertain and amuse.

Six Easy Steps to Registration



This *Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* contains information you need to register for the fall 2001 semester, adjust your schedule, and pay your bill. If policies or procedures change, you will receive further information.

The requirements, policies, and course descriptions of each college and school are printed in the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog*. You are responsible for knowing and following the catalog policies for your year of entry into a specific program at CU-Boulder.

Although this handbook was prepared on the basis of the best information available at the time of its printing (February 16, 2001), all information is subject to change.

The University of Colorado at Boulder has a strong institutional commitment to the principles of diversity and takes affirmative action to achieve that end. The university does not discriminate in its educational and employment programs and activities on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability, creed, religion, or veteran status.

Registration

You can access web registration or call CU Connect (our telephone registration system) to check your registration eligibility, register for courses, drop and add courses, and sign up for course wait lists. When you register, you receive immediate confirmation or denial of your enrollment in courses.

Registration Deadline - All students must complete registration by **midnight on August 17** to be guaranteed enrollment for fall semester 2001. (**Exception:** Incoming freshmen and transfer students attending the final arts and sciences orientation session in August must complete registration by 5:00 p.m. on August 23. All other incoming freshmen and transfer students who have not registered by August 17 must register on August 23 by 5:00 p.m.) Students who do not register by these dates (including graduate students) are subject to late registration and a **\$50 late fee**.

NOTE: If you require accommodations because of a disability, notify the Office of the Registrar, Campus Box 20, Boulder, CO 80309-0020, or call 303-492-4822 and press 1 to speak with a registration assistant. If you are deaf or hard of hearing, call 303-492-5841 (TTY).

1 Review Your Registration Eligibility

Currently enrolled students:

You can access your fall semester 2001 registration eligibility (including your registration time assignment) in the following ways:

- **View your registration eligibility status via web registration.** You may view your registration time assignment and whether you have any stops that need to be cleared by checking your registration status via web registration. To access this information, go to PLUS on the Web at www.colorado.edu/plus and select the "Registration" button and then log on to web registration by entering your student ID number and your PIN (Personal Identification Number). Select the "Registration Status" tab at the bottom of the screen to view your eligibility to register for fall semester 2001 (including any stops currently on your record) as well as your registration time assignment. **NOTE: Your registration time assignment will not show on the web registration status screen once your time assignment has passed.** It only displays if it has not yet arrived and thus makes you ineligible to register.

- **Come to the registrar's office** for a copy of your invitation to register if you don't have access to the web.

All new and readmitted students:

- You'll receive a personalized invitation to register in the mail (mailed to your mailing address) or at orientation (if required).

Your invitation to register includes your PIN (Personal Identification Number). Your PIN, in combination with your student number, allows you to access web registration, CU Connect (our telephone registration system), the Personal Look-Up Services (PLUS) on the Web, and the financial aid telephone system. Certain data specific to you are available on these systems, and your PIN controls access to this information. Your PIN is a randomly set

number and must be kept confidential. **Be sure to memorize your PIN, as it remains the same throughout your career at CU-Boulder.**

Note to All Students:

If you feel that your PIN is not secure and you wish to change it, you can change it via PLUS or come in to the registrar's office in Regent 105.

Or if you forget your PIN, you can call the registrar's office at 303-492-6970 or come in to the office in Regent 105.

Your registration eligibility via web registration (or your invitation to register) includes:

- **Your registration time assignment** - This is the date and time you can register for courses. You can register any time after your time assignment begins through the registration deadline (see the registration/academic calendar for specific dates). It is to your advantage to register as soon as possible after your registration time assignment begins. You can also call CU Connect at 303-938-8110 (enter **017 for the fall semester 2001 term code** when prompted) or check your registration status on the Web to find out your registration time assignment.

NOTE: Your registration time assignment will *not* show on the web registration status screen once your time assignment has passed. It only displays if it has not yet arrived and thus makes you ineligible to register.

Fall semester registration time assignments for undergraduate continuing students are based on the total number of predicted hours completed at the end of spring semester 2001. This includes the total number of hours completed at CU (any campus), plus transfer credit and any courses you are currently enrolled in (as of February 23).

Graduating seniors receive the earliest assignments. All other seniors register next, then graduate and law students, first-semester freshmen (those with 12 or fewer hours), juniors, sophomores, and then second-semester freshmen. Within these groups, time assignments are random but those with more hours register first.

- **Advising notice** - If required by your college or school, consult with an advisor before registering. See page 35 for more information.

- **Other stops** - Stops are holds that the university puts on student records for various reasons. Stops may originate from delinquent financial obligations, academic concerns, or even disciplinary matters. If you have any stops on your record, you are not allowed to register until you have cleared them all. Be sure to clear all stops at least 24 hours before your registration time assignment.

2 Plan Your Schedule

Use the schedule planning worksheet on page 11 to fill out a preliminary schedule for fall 2001. Then, fill out the registration form on page 17 before registering. It is a good idea to include alternate course choices on your registration form in case courses you request are full. Refer to page 14 under "searching for courses" for information about the schedule planner tool on the Web and course availability.

3 Decide on Student Opportunities

In addition to the mandatory fees you must pay along with your tuition, there is a group of student opportunities available to you for which optional fees are charged. The opportunities consist of various services provided by the university, tickets for concerts, plays, and the like, and club and student groups in which you can participate or merely provide money for their use.

When you first access registration (either via CU Connect or the Web), you will be given a brief description of the student opportunities fees available to you and be prompted to choose (or not) each opportunity. After you've made your choices, you'll be prompted to confirm them. With this step completed, you can register for classes.

The student opportunities you have chosen will appear on your tuition and fee bill. *If you want to change any of the student opportunities originally chosen, you cannot do so via CU Connect or the Web.* Instead, you must call the appropriate office at the phone number listed below.

Refunds will be given up to the first tuition payment deadline (September 5).

DESCRIPTIONS OF STUDENT OPPORTUNITIES FEES

Following are descriptions of all the opportunities available to you, including the fee for each opportunity.

(Attention Business Majors: The cost of the services for Career Connections and the Internship Program is paid through your student fees. Therefore, you should NOT select either of these when making your student opportunities selections.)

Career Connections \$35.00

For students graduating by August 2002. The prime time to use Career Connections is during your final year at CU. During the semester connect with employers seeking college graduates by taking advantage of weekly interviewing opportunities, having your resume referred to employers, obtaining employment vacancies, and networking with employers. *To complete your registration for this service, view a web orientation or attend a presentation during the first week of class. View the Career Services web site at www.colorado.edu/careerservices/students/connect.html for more information.* 303-492-4100.

Club Sports \$4.75

Club sports, which are partially funded by student fees, often require participants to pay out-of-pocket expenses that may limit their involvement in the sport. This fee helps support club sports, so there are fewer out-of-pocket expenses for the participants, and it also offsets some of the overhead costs of the sports. There are

currently over 30 club sports programs, with athletes competing in local, intercollegiate, regional, and sometimes national competitions. Coed sports funded include: bicycle racing, diving, equestrian, fencing, field hockey, figure skating, fly fishing, in-line hockey, kayaking, racquetball, rodeo, running, speed skating, squash, swimming, tae kwon do, triathlon, and water polo. Men's sports are: baseball, ice hockey, lacrosse, rugby, soccer, ultimate frisbee, and volleyball. Women's sports are: dance, ice hockey, lacrosse, rugby, soccer, softball, ultimate frisbee, and volleyball. 303-492-5471.

College of Music Concert Card \$30.00 per card

The hot sounds of jazz! International dance! The classical repertoire! The best of musical theatre and opera! Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, and Transgender

Resource Center.....\$5.00

The Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, and Transgender (GLBT) Resource Center serves as a central clearing house for information about gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender issues. Open to all regardless of sexual orientation and gender identity, the center provides resources; information dissemination and referral; and educational, cultural, and social programming including discussion groups, LesBiGayTrans Awareness Month, book and video library, and a great lounge area. Although a department within the Division of Student Affairs, the GLBT Resource Center receives no state general funds or other student fee money. Fees will fund the center's programming, and contributors will have the option to receive *CU Out & About: A Publication of the Lesbian, Bisexual, Gay and Transgender Community at the University of Colorado at Boulder* and supplemental events calendars. Internship Program \$55.00

For undergraduate and graduate students seeking work experience before graduation. Each year, more than 7,000 internships are available in a variety of organizations including business, engineering, art museums, social service agencies, and environmental and governmental agencies. Contact the Internship Office (Willard 18) early in the semester to complete necessary materials. Full refunds are granted until the drop/add deadline. You can register using the following methods (or a combination of the following methods):

Telephone Registration - Call CU Connect, 303-938-8110, from any touch-tone phone to register. Follow the instructions on the registration form on page 17 and use the function codes listed on page 16. You may call any time after your time assignment begins. **After registering via CU Connect, list your classes by pressing 5# to verify your schedule.**

Registration via the Web - First complete the registration form on page 17. Then go to PLUS at www.colorado.edu/plus and select the "Registration" button. Follow the instructions shown on the web registration pages. **When you're done registering, be sure to verify your schedule by going to the schedule page in web registration.**

CU Connect and web registration are normally available Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to midnight, and on Sundays from 11:00 a.m. to midnight. They are NOT available on Saturdays. (See page 16 for exceptions.)

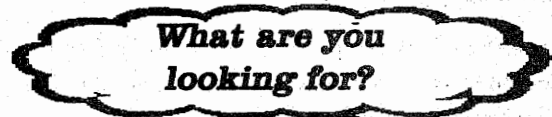

Need registration assistance? If you have problems or questions concerning telephone or web registration, call the registrar's office at **303-492-6970** and press "1" to speak with a registration assistant. Call between 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, except on university holidays. Recorded registration information is also available at this number 24 hours a day (press "2" to hear recorded registration information).

Once you have registered, make adjustments to your schedule either via CU Connect or the Web through the **registration deadline, midnight on August 17. (Exception:** Incoming freshmen and transfer students attending the final arts and sciences orientation session in August must complete registration by 5:00 p.m. on August 23. All other incoming freshmen and transfer students who have not registered by August 17 must register on August 23 by 5:00 p.m.) After this date, see pages 18-19 for instructions on making final schedule adjustments during the drop/add period.

LINKED COURSES

Linked courses are lecture courses that have required recitations and/or labs. In the course listings, you can identify a linked course because *the call numbers for linked lectures are not listed*. Only the call numbers for the linked recitation or lab are listed. (For courses that have a required lecture, recitation, and a lab, the call numbers are *not listed* for the lecture and recitation; they are *only* listed for the lab.)

To register for linked courses, enter the call number for the lab or recitation only. When you enter the call number, the system automatically "links" all other sections of the course and either enrolls you in all sections of the course or gives you the option of placing your name on a wait list, if available, for all linked sections of the course.

CONTROLLED ENROLLMENT AND INDEPENDENT STUDY COURSES

Controlled enrollment sections of a course and independent study courses are ones that have specific restrictions placed by the department that offers the course. They have a section number between 700 and 999. The call numbers are not published for these sections. To find out if you qualify for a controlled enrollment section or an independent study course, contact the department that offers the course. If you are eligible, the department will either enroll you in the course or give you the call number so you can register for the course via the web or via CU Connect.

SEARCHING FOR COURSES

You may need to search for a new section of a course for the following reasons:

- Sometimes academic departments must change the time a course is offered *after the Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* has been published (when this happens, the department cancels the original section and adds a new section that reflects the time change), or
- The section you request is full.

You can search for available sections in the following ways:

- The **schedule planner** is a tool to find out about course availability as well as additional course information. Using this feature, you can also search for courses by subject,

core requirements, by meeting time, and the option to search for only open courses. When a course is displayed, you can access the course description, required books, and student ratings of the course. In addition, you can map out your schedule to show when you have courses and other scheduled commitments, such as work. *The schedule planner is updated nightly during registration periods, so it is a good planning source, but does not display up-to-the-minute course availability.* You can access the schedule planner feature via PLUS at www.colorado.edu/plus.

- You can conduct on-line course searches via web registration. The **web registration course search** tool allows you to search by subject, level, course number, core requirements, and by meeting time. **NEW - You can now also choose to limit your search to only open courses and sections. The course search feature is updated on a real-time basis, so if you find a course you would like to sign up for, you immediately know whether there is still room in the course.** Also, if you try to **register for a course via web registration but you're denied the course** (due to the section being closed or cancelled), you can conduct a **section search** to see if there are any available sections of that same course that fit in with your schedule. When you're denied a course, click on the word "search" next to the course and then click on the "submit" button. If there are any available sections of the course that fit your schedule, you'll be given the option to add the course (just click on the "add" button for the section you want.) You can access web registration via PLUS at www.colorado.edu/plus.

- If you request a course section that is full **via CU Connect**, the computer voice asks you if you want to conduct a **search for other open sections of that course**. If you do, press **7#** when prompted. CU Connect will search for other sections of the course that are available and that will fit your schedule. If another section is available, you can register for that section.

- **A list of available courses** can also be referenced in Regent 105.

WAIT LISTS

Throughout the registration and drop/add periods, if you are eligible to take a course but find it is full, you may be able to put your name on a computerized wait list. Each department determines if a wait list will be offered for a course and what type of wait list will be used. There are two types of wait lists:

- **Automatic wait lists** are set up on a first-come, first-served basis. As a vacancy occurs in a class, the person at the top of the list is automatically enrolled.
- **Resequenced wait lists** use a priority system to determine who enrolls in a course as spaces open up. Priorities are established by the department and are usually based on class standing and/or major.

CU Connect and web registration inform you if a class you have requested has a wait list and gives you the option of adding your name to the list. On CU Connect, press **9#** when prompted and listen for verification. On the Web, select the wait list option and then select "submit" and wait for verification. **NOTE:** CU Connect and web registration do **not** tell you what type of wait list is used for the course.

When you place your name on a wait list, the number of students already on the list is announced. As wait-list positions constantly change during the registration and drop/add periods, it's a good idea to check your schedule frequently to find out your position on the wait list. To find out your wait-list position, you can:

- Call CU Connect and list your schedule by pressing 5# (see the instructions on your registration form). If you are wait-listed for any courses, your wait-list position (normally current within the last 24 hours) will be announced when you list your schedule via CU Connect. Wait-list positions are normally updated nightly on CU Connect.
- Or you can check your wait-list position via web registration. Log on to web registration via PLUS and then click on the "schedule" tab at the bottom of the page. You'll be able to see your wait-list position for a course under "status" on the schedule page. Wait-list positions via web registration are updated in real time.

Placing your name on a wait list does not guarantee that you will be enrolled in that course, even if you're first on the wait list.

When a space opens up for you from a wait list, you are automatically enrolled in the class. *No verification is sent.* If you choose not to remain on a wait list or if you find that you have been enrolled in a course that you no longer want, *drop the course as soon as possible.*

NOTE: Wait-listed hours are included in your credit load limit (see page 35). You cannot be enrolled and wait listed for courses offered at the same time, and you cannot be wait listed for two courses offered at the same time.

It is your responsibility to find out if you have been enrolled in a course from the wait list. If you do not attend a course you have been enrolled in, you will receive an F for that course.

DEADLINES FOR WAIT LISTS

You may place your name on course wait lists through 5:00 p.m., **Wednesday, September 5**. At midnight on September 5, one final roll of the wait lists will occur to automatically enroll students from wait lists into any existing course openings. After this final wait list roll, all wait lists will be frozen. *This means that there is no automatic enrollment from wait lists beginning on September 6.*

If you are still on a wait list as of September 6 and are still interested in taking that course, check with the department offering the course. You must let the department know you are still interested in the course, should an opening occur. In that event, the department will give you a signed special action form to add the course. (**NOTE:** After September 5, you need the signature of the instructor on a special action form to add a course.) All department wait lists are canceled at 5:00 p.m. on Friday, September 14, the deadline to add a course without petitioning your dean.

NOTE: If you're on the wait list as of 5:00 p.m. on September 5, and you don't get enrolled in the course (undergraduate courses only), you'll be eligible to reserve the course the next time it is offered through the Course Reservation Program. (See page 38.)

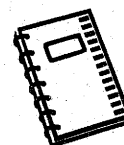
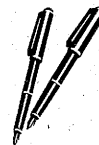

CU Connect and Web Registration Hours

CU Connect and web registration are normally available Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to midnight. They are also available on Sundays from 11:00 a.m. to midnight. (They are NOT available on Saturdays.)

Exceptions:

- From June 2 through July 27, CU Connect and web registration are only available (on specified dates) to incoming freshmen, transfer students, and new graduate students. Continuing and readmitted students will not be able to do any registration or schedule adjustment during this time period (until July 30).
- *Limited hours* -- August 23, 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.; September 5, 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. for adding courses and adding your name to course wait lists. **Note:** After 5:00 p.m. on September 5, CU Connect and web registration are *only available for dropping courses through 5:00 p.m. on September 12*, the drop deadline.
- CU Connect and web registration are *NOT* available on *Saturdays or on May 28, July 4, and August 19-22.*

6 Drop/Add

After the registration deadline (August 23 for incoming freshmen and transfer and August 17 for all other students), you may not make any adjustments to your schedule until your drop/add time assignment begins on either August 24 or 26. Once your drop/add time assignment begins, you may make final adjustments to your schedule through the add and drop deadlines (see page 19 for deadlines).

Time assignments during the final drop/add period are based on the last two digits of your student number. **You are not able to drop or add courses through CU Connect, at a central drop/add site, or via web registration until your drop/add time assignment begins.** Time assignments are changed each semester to ensure fairness.

• **Add Deadline** - The deadline to add a course, including independent study and thesis, without the instructor's signature is **5:00 p.m., Wednesday, September 5.** To add a course after September 5 and through September 14 you must have the signature of your instructor on a special action form. In general, instructors will only approve an add if you've been regularly attending and there's space in the course.

• **Deadline to Add Without Petitioning Your Dean** - The deadline to add a course without petitioning your dean is **5:00 p.m., Friday, September 14.** (NOTE: You must have instructor's signature on a special action form to add a course after September 5 and through September 14.)

No adds are permitted after September 14 unless there are extenuating circumstances clearly beyond your control (accident, illness, etc.)

September 14 is also the deadline to change variable-credit hours, pass/fail, and no-credit status on courses.

These changes can be made at the registrar's office in Regent 105 through 5:00 p.m. on September 14.

DEADLINES FOR DROPPING COURSES

• **Drop Deadline** - The deadline to drop a course without the instructor's signature, without being assessed tuition and fees for that course, and without a W grade showing on your transcript is **5:00 p.m., Wednesday, September 12.**

For courses dropped after Wednesday, September 12 (5:00 p.m.), no tuition and fee adjustments are made and you will receive a W grade on your transcript for dropped courses.

To drop a course after September 12 and through October 10 you must be passing the course, and a special action form must be signed by your instructor and turned into the registrar's office.

• **Deadline to Drop Without Petitioning Your Dean** - The deadline to drop a course without petitioning your dean is **5:00 p.m., Wednesday, October 10.**

After October 10 you cannot drop a course unless there are circumstances clearly beyond your control (accident, illness, etc.).

To drop a course after this date you must have your dean's approval, as well as the approval of your instructor. Their signatures must be on a special action form or your request will not be processed.

Note: Dropping all your Boulder main campus courses constitutes withdrawing from the university. See pages 39-40 for withdrawal information.

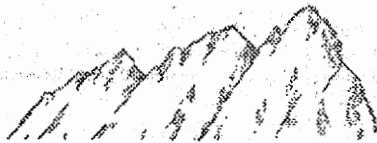

UCSU student fees are mandatory for students enrolled in more than one class or in one class of more than 5 credit hours and may only be waived due to extraordinary circumstances. If your fees are waived, you must still pay the base fee of \$27.63. If you wish to petition for a waiver of UCSU fees, you must do so by **5:00 p.m. on September 5. No late petitions are accepted.** Petitions may be picked up and turned in at the Bursar's Office, Regent 150, or the UCSU office in UMC 333, and must include documentation of the reasons for waiving the fees.

Fall 2001 Course Fees

Course fees are assessed to help offset the higher costs of specialized supplies, equipment, materials, and instructional and related support that are required to teach courses in certain departments. **NOTE:** 2000-2001 course fees are listed by each department in the course listings beginning on page 44. A list is also available at the Bursar's Office, and on the Web at www-bursar.colorado.edu.

Enrollment Deposit

Your \$200 enrollment deposit is held for you by the university until you:

- drop *all* classes in a semester within established dates and guidelines (see pages 39-40), or
- officially withdraw within established dates and guidelines (see pages 39-40), or
- graduate.

At that time, the deposit is credited toward any outstanding financial obligations you may have, and a refund check is mailed to you or directly deposited into your bank account within approximately eight weeks. Update your permanent address at the Office of the Registrar or the Bursar's Office before you graduate or withdraw to be sure you receive your refund. Interest earned from enrollment deposits is used for student financial aid.

If you enroll at the university the semester following your graduation, your enrollment deposit remains on your account. It is then refunded to you, in accordance with established university policy, when you are no longer enrolled.

Residency

Students classified as out-of-state residents who are seeking in-state tuition classification for fall 2001 should turn in residency petitions by **5:00 p.m., July 23, 2001**, to the Tuition Classification Office in Regent 1B54, 68 UCB, Boulder, CO 80309-0068.

Petitions are accepted through August 31, 2001, but students who submit petitions after July 23 may not receive a decision by the tuition-payment deadline. Adjustments and reimbursements are made if a student's application is approved.

Students submitting a completed petition by May 15, 2001, receive a decision by the enrollment deposit refund deadline of August 17, 2001. Financial aid recipients seeking in-state classification should submit their petitions by May 15, 2001, to make sure their financial aid award is processed in time for spring semester.

Golden Buffalo Student Health Insurance Fall 2001

*Dates of coverage for Fall 2001 Insurance
August 18, 2001 - January 4, 2002*

It is understood that at times illness and/or injury can interrupt your studies and personal goals. Therefore, CU-Boulder sponsors a health insurance plan to guarantee needed health care with minimal financial difficulty, if such needs arise. Students taking 6 credit hours or more are automatically enrolled and billed by the university for the Golden Buffalo Student Health Insurance Buff Limited, unless you select or waive the health insurance by **September 5, 2001**.

You may select any one of the Golden Buffalo Student Health Insurance Plans: **Buff Value**, **Buff Limited**, **Buff Max**, or waive the insurance. The insurance you select for fall 2001 automatically extends through the spring semester and summer, 2002.

To select or waive the insurance on-line for fall 2001, go on-line to www.colorado.edu/plus. (You will need your PIN number). You may also go to the Golden Buffalo Student Health Insurance Office, located at the Health Center in Wardenburg, to enroll and pay the premium. Your final deadline to select or waive the insurance is **September 5, 2001**.

Exceptions

Enrollment is not automatic for the following:

- ACCESS students
- Continuing Education students
- Spouse/domestic partner and dependents
- Semester at Sea students

- Study Abroad students
- Students taking 5 credits or less (including graduate students and law students)
- Time Out students

Students who are included in the "exception" category, need to go to the Golden Buffalo Student Health Insurance Office, located at the Health Center in Wardenburg, to enroll and pay the premium by **September 5, 2001** for fall 2001 insurance coverage.

Review of Insurance Plans

You may go on-line to www.colorado.edu/stuhealthinsur for more complete information.

Buff Value (a supplemental health insurance plan) may be an excellent option for those who want health services on campus at the Health Center at Wardenburg and are covered by other insurance for services off campus. The premium is \$150 per semester for students, which may be less than the deductible with your current comprehensive insurance plan. Spouse/domestic partner premium charges are additional.

Buff Limited may be chosen by those who want increased coverage on campus at the Health Center at Wardenburg and limited coverage for services off campus, including spouse/domestic partner and dependent coverage.

Buff Max may be helpful for those needing more comprehensive coverage, both at the Health Center at Wardenburg and off campus, especially if you plan to travel abroad or need increased coverage for your spouse/domestic partner or dependents.

In order to provide the highest benefits available, the Health Center at Wardenburg is the primary care provider (PCP). Wardenburg Health Center is accredited by the

State/CU-Boulder Requirements for Immunizations

• New International Student - Tuberculosis (TB) Testing

The university requires incoming (new) international students from countries where the incidence of TB is high to be tested for TB. Wardenburg Health Center provides TB testing at minimal cost. If your test results are positive and treatment is needed, free care is available through the Colorado Department of Health.

If you fail to be tested, a stop will be placed on your registration for the following semester. For more information call 303-492-2005.

• Measles, Mumps & Rubella Immunization Requirements

All degree-seeking students born in or after 1957, must provide immunization documentation for two rubeola (measles), two rubella (German measles), and two mumps immunizations. A signed/stamped copy of your immunizations may be obtained from your physician, high school, previous university records or military records. Immunizations are available at cost through Wardenburg on a walk-in basis. Medical, religious, and personal exemptions are allowed by law. Failure to take care of this the first semester will result in a stop being placed on your registration the following semester. Your immunization record may be faxed to 303-492-1014, mailed or delivered in person to the Immunization Office, located in Wardenburg Health Center, room 348, 3rd floor. For more information see www.colorado.EDU/wardenburg/immunization.html or call 303-492-2005 or 303-492-8217.

Paying Your Bill

Any student who completes registration agrees to pay the University of Colorado at Boulder according to the payment terms documented under this section.

Payment Methods and Locations

• **Cash** - All payments made by cash must be received at the cashier windows in the lobby of Regent.

• **Personal check, certified check, or cashier's check made payable to the University of Colorado** - If you pay by check, make sure your name and student number are on the check. Mail the check and the top portion of your bill to the Denver post office box noted on the bill. *Do not use campus mail.*

If you write a bad check (regardless of the amount) to the university, you may be subject to late charges and service charges, and a stop will be placed on your record. A \$17 returned-check charge is assessed, in addition to the amount due to the university. You may also be liable for collection costs and prosecution under the Colorado Criminal Statutes.

• **Tuition Drop Boxes** - Drop your payment in one of the drop boxes located outside at the north and south entrances of Regent.

The payment deadline is 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 5, 2001. *Postmark dates are not honored.* **Credit cards are not accepted.**

Do not include scholarship checks with your payment to the Bursar's Office. Instead, forward the scholarship check to the Office of Financial Aid, 312 UCB, Boulder, CO 80309-0312. If your scholarship check is not received in the financial aid scholarship office by the bill payment deadline, you are advised to make other arrangements to pay your bill to avoid late and service charges. The scholarship will be credited when it arrives and, in many cases, will generate a refund for you at the Bursar's Office.

If no specific instructions are provided by the donor, the financial aid office automatically divides private scholarships of \$500 or more equally between the fall and spring semesters. Private scholarships of less than \$500 will be applied in full to the current semester.

Scholarship checks should be made payable to the **University of Colorado** and sent to CU-Boulder, Scholarships, 312 UCB, Boulder, CO 80309-0312.

Original charges (less any adjustments) are always due on the first bill due date of the semester. A second bill reflecting new charges (parking permit, classes added, etc.) will be mailed on September 17 and due on October 10. Call 303-492-5381 for your balance or check PLUS at www.colorado.edu/plus.

It is recommended that checks be written on a U.S. bank and in U.S. funds in order to avoid processing delays of up to three weeks and possible bank fees. If the delay extends beyond the tuition due date, late and service charges may be assessed.

NOTE: All checks containing restrictive endorsements are null and void and nonbinding on the university.

If you must send payments via express mail, send them to the Bursar's Office, Regent, Room 175, Boulder, CO 80309-0041.

If you do not receive a tuition and fee bill, you are still responsible for knowing the amount of your bill and for paying it on time. Call the Bursar's Office at 303-492-5381 for your current balance, or access your current bill information on PLUS at www.colorado.edu/plus, both available August 24. A late payment charge (\$5 - \$50) and a 1% service charge per month is assessed for late payment. A financial stop is applied to the student record that will prevent registering for future terms, participating in class schedule adjustments (drop/add), receiving an academic transcript, and receiving a diploma. In addition, future term registrations may be cancelled.

The Bursar's Office hours from August 24 to September 7 are Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (Tuesday, September 4, and Wednesday, September 5, until 6:00 p.m.). Refer to information included with your schedule/bill for extended hours of service.

The Bursar's Office offers personal assistance to Spanish-speaking students and students with disabilities. If you need assistance, stop by the Bursar's Office, Regent, Room 150 or call 303-492-5381, or if deaf or hard of hearing, call 303-492-3528 (TTY).

Deferred Tuition - Two Payment Plan

By completing and returning the deferred tuition agreement located on the reverse side of your schedule/bill, you are allowed to pay one-half of the amount due on **September 5**. The minimum balance due, indicated on the reverse side of your bill, is automatically reduced by any credits (financial aid, insurance, RA/TA tuition waivers, and scholarships) applied after your bill is produced.

If the deferred tuition agreement is not part of your schedule/bill, you may also defer your tuition at the student billing windows in Regent from August 24 through September 5.

On **October 10**, you must pay the balance of your bill and a one-percent finance charge and any new charges added to your bill. A second bill reflecting this balance is mailed on September 17. Make sure your billing address is current.

Failure to Pay in Full by the Deadline

A **financial stop** will be placed on your record if you fail to pay your full tuition and fee bill by the published deadline. This stop will prevent you from:

- registering for future terms
- participating in drop/add
- receiving an academic transcript
- receiving a diploma

In addition, if you are registered for a future term and a financial stop is added to your record, you are in risk of losing those classes.

If your payment is late, you will be charged a late payment charge and a service charge. The service charge is 1% per month on the unpaid balance. The late charge is charged according to the following schedule:

Balance Due	Late Payment Charge
\$99.99 or less	\$ 5
100-299.99	\$10
300-499.99	\$20
500-699.99	\$30
700-899.99	\$40
\$900 and over	\$50

All past due accounts are referred to the Student Debt Management (SDM) department for collection after the end of the semester. Past due service charges of 1% continue to accrue monthly as long as the debt is unpaid, and additional collection charges may be assessed.

Colorado law requires the university to place all delinquent accounts with the state's Central Collection Services (CCS) office. The SDM department will place all delinquent accounts with CCS after one year, unless there exists a satisfactory repayment agreement including a signed contract with the Student Debt Management department in the Bursar's Office. CCS reports all past due accounts to national credit bureaus. Financial stops remain on your record until the balance is paid in full. Establishing a repayment agreement does not result in removal of stops. If your account is referred to CCS, you must pay any collection costs allowed by the Uniform Consumer Credit Code.

Getting Your Refund

If your tuition account reflects a credit balance, you are entitled to a refund. Sign up for direct deposit to avoid postal delays, incorrect addresses, and standing in line. Forms are available on the website at www-bursar.colorado.edu.

• **Direct Deposit** - If you are currently enrolled for direct deposit or sign up by August 7, and have a credit balance on your tuition account as of August 21, your fall 2001 refund will be deposited into your bank account on August 24. Throughout the semester, whenever your tuition account reflects a credit balance, your refund will be deposited to your bank account 24-48 hours after a credit balance appears on your tuition and fee account.

To sign up for this service, visit our website at www-bursar.colorado.edu or call 303-492-5381 or 303-492-3528 (TTY), print the direct deposit form from the web (www-bursar.colorado.edu), or stop by the Bursar's Office and fill out an application form.

• **Refund Checks** - If you do not sign up for direct deposit, and your tuition account reflects a credit balance as of August 20, a refund check will be mailed to your local mailing address on August 23. This refund **cannot** be picked up.

If your tuition account reflects a credit balance after August 20, a refund check will be available at the cashier's window in Regent beginning August 24. You must have your photo ID with you. Checks not picked up will be mailed to your local mailing address on a monthly basis throughout the semester.

Financial Aid

If you have not yet applied for financial aid you may still apply by completing the 2001-2002 *Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)*. Students are encouraged to apply by April 1, 2001 in order to complete the process before the last day of the spring 2001 term. Due to funding limitations, some forms of assistance may not be available to late applicants.

Applications are available from the Office of Financial Aid, Room 2, Environmental Design, or on the Web at www.fafsa.ed.gov. For more detailed information, visit the financial aid office, the web www.colorado.edu/finaid, or call 303-492-5091.

Financial aid includes grants, scholarships, work-study and loans, and is usually awarded based on financial need. Grants and university scholarships are automatically applied to your bill. Student and parent loans are credited to your bill after you submit signed promissory notes. Before a promissory note for a parent loan can be signed, a credit check must be completed for the parent borrower. The process for approving a parent loan can take several weeks, so plan accordingly when accepting this type of loan. If your tuition account reflects a credit balance, you are entitled to a refund (see Refunds, page 31).

Less Than Full-Time Enrollment

Students have until Friday, September 14 (the last day to add classes without petitioning their dean) to finalize their fall semester class schedules. Students who are not enrolled full time by September 14 may have their financial aid reduced to reflect their actual enrollment status.

The week of September 17, revised award letters will be mailed to students whose aid has been adjusted because they are not enrolled full time.

Students who have specific questions about how less-than-full-time enrollment affects their financial aid should contact the Office of Financial Aid.

Short-Term Loans

Short-term loans up to \$500 are available to students during periods of enrollment and between fall and spring semesters. You must be at least eighteen years of age and enrolled at least half-time on the Boulder campus to qualify (ACCESS and Continuing Education students are not eligible), and you must present your photo ID. All loans must be backed by financial aid or have a co-signer. Apply for short term loans in the Office of Financial Aid, or in the University Student Loan Office.

Veterans' Benefits

If you are entitled to veterans' benefits, write Veterans' Services, Office of Financial Aid, Campus Box 312, Boulder, CO 80309-0312, or call 303-492-7322 for further information.

Withdrawing and Financial Aid

The *Withdrawal Policy Regarding Tuition and Fees* states that students who pay their \$200 enrollment deposit and register for classes for any given semester are obligated to pay full tuition and fees for that semester unless they **officially withdraw** from the university. If you begin classes at CU-Boulder, receive financial aid, and then

withdraw, your financial aid will be adjusted according to the following federal regulations. (See pages 39-40 for withdrawal procedures.)

RETURN OF UNEARNED TITLE IV AID (34 CFR 668.22)

The federal rules state that you earn your aid based on the period of time you remain enrolled.

Enrolled days divided by days in the enrollment period equals the percentage of aid earned.

The Office of Financial Aid will calculate the percentage of aid earned using this formula. If you remain enrolled beyond the 60% point you earn all aid for the period. Aid earned is credited to your tuition and fee bill.

REPAYMENT OF UNEARNED AID (34 CFR 668.22 g,h,i)

The responsibility to repay unearned aid is shared by the institution and you in proportion to the aid each is assumed to possess.

The institution's share is the lesser of:

- The total amount of unearned aid, or
- The institutional charges multiplied by the percentage of aid that was unearned.

Your share is the difference between the total unearned amount and the institution's share. The institution's share is allocated among the Title IV programs, in an order specified by statute, before your share. After your share is fully allocated among the Title IV programs, any amount owed to a grant program is reduced by half. The same

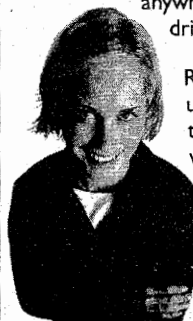

This policy applies to students with financial aid who officially withdraw. It may also apply to those who stop attending classes without formally withdrawing. Students who do not formally withdraw are required to document their last day of attendance.

Examples of refund calculations are available upon request. Visit with a financial aid counselor for more information regarding your specific situation.

Appeals

In the case of a prolonged illness, accident, death in the family, or other circumstances that make it impractical to complete the semester, you may submit an appeal through the Bursar's Office. The Bursar's Office reviews the information provided and determines a settlement that is reasonable and fair to both you and the university.

Balances Due

If unearned aid results in a balance due, a revised tuition and fee bill will be mailed to you by the Bursar's Office. It is your responsibility to repay those funds. To ensure that you receive information in a timely manner, make sure that your address and phone information is up to date.

General Information

Many of the questions you may have about registration procedures are answered in this section.

Addresses

The following addresses on your student record must be kept current:

- **Billing address (new address option beginning summer 2001).** The address you want all of your tuition and fee bills mailed to throughout the year, including the first schedule/bill mailing prior to the start of each semester. (**Exception:** Schedule/bills for new students who

register at orientation in August or January will be mailed to your mailing address at the beginning of the semester.)

If no billing address is given, your first schedule/bill of each fall or spring semester will be mailed to your permanent address and all subsequent bills to your mailing address. If you're enrolled in summer and no billing address is given, then all summer schedule/bills will be mailed to your mailing address.

- **Mailing address** (your address during the fall and spring semesters and during the summer months if you're enrolled in summer classes). Registration information for future semesters, outstanding tuition and fee bills (if you don't have a billing address on record), refund checks, and financial aid information are mailed to you at this address from late August through mid-May (and throughout the summer if you're enrolled in summer classes). **Exception:** Your permanent address is used during the winter semester break. **Note:** An accurate local mailing address is also important in case the university needs to reach you due to a family or personal emergency, so be sure to give the university a local mailing address.

- **Permanent address** (considered your "home-base" address). It can be your parents' address, a Boulder address, or the address of someone who knows how to reach you. Schedule/bills are mailed to this address before the semester begins (unless you specify a billing address). This address is also used for mailings during the summer months and during the winter semester break. **Exception:** If you're enrolled in summer classes, your mailing address is used during the summer months. Other offices, such as the library, housing, payroll, and Wardenburg, have separate address systems and changes must be made there as well.

You can look up any of your addresses on the Personal Look-Up Services (PLUS) at www.colorado.edu/plus (see page 38) and, if needed, update your addresses via PLUS. Or you can fill out a change-of-address form at the Office of the Registrar in Regent 105, in the Office of Financial Aid in Environmental Design, room 2, or by calling 303-492-6970.

NOTE:

- The address that appears on your student record (and PLUS) also appears on the directory on CU-Boulder's home page on the Web. When you make a change to any of your addresses, the change is normally updated on your student record within 24 hours. **Exception:** If you update your address via PLUS, your addresses are updated immediately (real time). Addresses on the web directory are updated weekly.

- **If you are employed by the university**, the phone number and address for the department/office that employs you appears on CU-Boulder's web directory *instead of your personal phone number and address.*

- **If you do not want your address to be part of directory information**, you may request that "limited privacy" be put on your record. See pages 34-35 for more information about "limited privacy" as well as other privacy options under "Confidentiality of Student Records."

Advising

Check your invitation to register for advising requirements. If advising is required or if you wish to speak with an advisor:

- Arts and Sciences students - Schedule an appointment to meet with your academic advisor prior to registering. For information on how to schedule a registration advising appointment or for information about changing your major visit www.colorado.edu/ArtsSciences/aacforstudents, click on "Registration Information" or "Changing Majors" and follow the instructions. Be sure to bring a print out of your degree audit from PLUS as well as a completed registration form (see page 17) including alternate course selections to your advising appointment.
- Engineering students - Call your faculty advisor, your major department, or your dean's office for advising.
- Students in any other college or school - Call your dean's office.

Photo ID Cards / Campus Card Program (Buff OneCard™)

The Buff OneCard™ is the official CU-Boulder student ID to be used for a student's entire career at CU-Boulder. The card is required as official verification of eligibility for many student privileges, including access to the Student Recreation Center, campus libraries, Wardenburg Health Center, Housing dining centers, purchasing tickets for athletic events, and riding on local and regional RTD buses. The card also offers a number of convenient, optional programs such as the **Buff Gold** program that turns the card into an ATM/debit card that access accounts setup with the U of C Federal Credit Union. To activate this option you will need to open a Credit Union account checking account and ask for the **Buff Gold** option. The **Housing Dollars** program allows you to make purchases at five different Housing Ala.Carte dining facilities and is set up when you purchase a Housing meal plan.

Your first card is free if you are a fee-paying student. Additional cards cost \$15 each. After paying your confirmation deposit, students can get a Buff OneCard™ by bringing photo-identification to one of two Campus Card Offices.

The main Campus Card Office is located in the Department of Housing at 66 Hallett Hall and is open from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. 7 days a week when classes are in session. The UMC also has a Campus Card Office in room 25, located on the lower level across from the CU Book Store, open from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. As your official CU-Boulder Campus ID you should NEVER share or lend your card to anyone else. Also, you are not allowed to place stickers of any kind on your card. **Please remember, you can report your Buff OneCard™ lost or stolen at any time by calling 303-492-1212.**

Changing Your College or Major

If you want to transfer into another CU-Boulder college or school, check with the new dean's office for admission criteria and information on enrollment levels, application procedures, and deadlines. If you have already submitted an IUT (intrauniversity transfer) application, register as if you have been accepted into the new school or college.

NOTE: You may not be able to register for some courses until you have been accepted into your new school or college. Once you are accepted, you may change your schedule through the drop/add deadline. If you want to change or declare a major, go to the new major department for the required procedures.

NOTE: If you are receiving financial aid and are working on two majors (same degree) or a major and a minor and don't plan to graduate from both programs at the same time, your financial aid may be affected. For more information, contact the Office of Financial Aid in the lower level of Environmental Design, or call 303-492-5091.

Computer Labs

You can use any of ITS' or Housing's computing labs to access the Internet and register online. Labs that are maintained by Housing are in every residence hall. ITS labs are located in other buildings across campus including Business, Clare Small Arts and Sciences, Duane Physics, Economics, Education, Ekeley Sciences, Engineering, Environmental Design, Fleming Law, Hellems, Macky, Muenzinger, and Norlin Library. See the ITS web site at www.colorado.edu/its/labs for a complete list of ITS' computer lab sites.

You can also access the online registration page from your residence hall room using ethernet connectivity (go to www.colorado.edu/totalcomm for further details) or from off-campus locations by dialing into the modem pool (go to www.colorado.edu/its/docs/#comm for instructions).

Confidentiality of Student Records

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords you certain rights with respect to your education records. They are:

(1) The right to inspect and review your education records within 45 days of the day the university receives a request for access.

You should submit to the registrar, dean, head of the academic department, or other appropriate official, a written request that identifies the record(s) you wish to inspect. The university official will make arrangements for access and notify you of the time and place where the records may be inspected. If the records are not maintained by the university official to whom the request was submitted, that official shall advise you of the correct official to whom the request should be addressed.

(2) The right to request the amendment of your education records that you believe are inaccurate or misleading.

You may ask the university to amend a record that you believe is inaccurate or misleading. You should write the university official responsible for the record, clearly identify the part of the record you want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading.

If the university decides not to amend the record as requested by you, the university will notify you of the decision and advise you of your right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to you when notified of the right to a hearing.

(3) The right to consent of disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in your education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.

One exception that permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the university in an administrative, supervisory, academic or research or support staff position (including law enforcement unit personnel and health staff); a person or company with whom the university has contracted (such as an attorney, auditor, or collection agent); a person serving on the Board of Regents; a student employee; or a student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or one assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks. In addition, your records may be disclosed to your parent(s) upon request if your parent(s) claim you as a dependent for income tax purposes.

A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.

Upon request, the university discloses education records without consent to officials of another school in which a student seeks or intends to enroll.

(4) The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the university to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the office that administers FERPA is:

The following items of student information have been designated by the University of Colorado at Boulder as public or "directory" information: name, addresses, telephone numbers, e-mail address, dates of attendance, registration status, class, previous educational institutions attended, major field of study, awards, honors, degree(s) conferred, past and present participation in officially recognized sports and activities, physical factors (height, weight) of athletes, and date and place of birth. Such information may be disclosed by the institution at its discretion. Buff OneCard photos and numbers (not social security numbers) are not considered directory information but are shared with other campus departments and associates of the Buff OneCard program.

You have the right to withhold "directory information" from inquirers by selecting a "privacy" or "limited-privacy" option. The privacy option will prevent all directory and enrollment information from being released to all who do not have a clear educational interest for access to this information. The limited-privacy option will prevent the

release of directory information to off-campus inquirers and to campus directory services, but is not as restrictive as the privacy option.

Release of Disciplinary Information

Provisions of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, as amended by the Higher Education Amendments of 1998, govern access to a student's disciplinary file. The student and/or those university officials who demonstrate a legitimate educational need for disciplinary information may have access to the student's disciplinary file. Parent(s), who provide proof that a student is a dependent as defined in Section 152 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (i.e., a copy of the last federal income tax return listing the student as a dependent), can have access to the student's disciplinary file without written consent of the student. In this case, parents may also have access to a disciplinary file, even if the student has requested otherwise.

In addition, parent(s) may be notified if a student under 21 years of age is found responsible for a violation involving use or possession of alcohol and drugs.

The Campus Security Act permits higher education institutions to disclose to alleged victims of any crime of violence (murder, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, motor vehicle theft) the results of the conduct proceedings conducted by the institution against an alleged perpetrator with respect to such crime. The Campus Security Act also requires that both accused and the accuser be informed of campus conduct proceedings involving a sexual assault.

Additionally, the Higher Education Amendments of 1998 permit disclosure of the final results of disciplinary cases in which a student has been found responsible for a violation involving violence or for a sex offense.

Credit-Hour Limits and Course-Load Definitions

During the registration period (which begins April 2), undergraduate students can register for a maximum of 19 credit hours (15 credit hours for graduate students and 16 credit hours for law students), *including wait-listed courses*.

During the final drop/add period (beginning August 24), undergraduates are allowed to register for up to 21 credit hours, *including wait-listed courses*. **NOTE:** A tuition surcharge is assessed for every credit hour added over 18.

For undergraduate students, 12 credit hours is considered a full-time load for financial aid and for enrollment verification purposes. Graduate students qualify for full-time status for enrollment verification purposes if they are enrolled for 5 or more hours or any number of thesis hours. Law students need 10 or more hours for full-time status. Check with the Office of Financial Aid for full- and part-time status definitions for graduate students.

Credit and Grading Options

You can select the following credit and grading options via CU Connect and web registration when you register for courses. To make *changes* to credit and grading options, you can do this at the registrar's office in Regent 105 through 5:00 p.m. on September 14. (**Important: Be sure to read the highlighted note on the next page.**)

• **No Credit.** To register for a course on a no-credit basis, call CU Connect and select the no-credit option (see page 16), or select the no-credit option when registering via the Web. You still pay full tuition for a no-credit course, but you do not receive a grade. An *NC* will appear on your transcript in place of a grade. Check with your college or school for policies on no-credit status and how it may be used.

NOTE: No-credit courses do not count toward full-time enrollment for financial aid purposes.

• **Pass/Fail.** Check with your college or school for the restrictions on the number and types of courses that can be taken pass/fail. To register for a course pass/fail, call CU Connect and select the pass/fail option (see page 16), or select the pass/fail option when registering via the Web.

Once you have signed up for a course on a pass/fail basis, it is *not* noted on class rosters or final-grade lists, nor should your instructor be notified that you are taking the course pass/fail. You are assigned a grade for the course. A grade of *D-* or above is converted to a *P*; an *F* remains an *F*. Only the *F* is calculated as part of your GPA; a grade of *P* is not counted.

NOTE: If you attempt to change the status of a course from or to P/F or NC by telephone or via the Web, you will not be able to re-enroll in the course if it is closed or a wait list exists for the course. You can make this change without jeopardizing your enrollment in the course by filling out a credit-option form at the registrar's office in Regent 105.

• **Variable Credit.** All independent study courses and some regular courses are offered on a variable-credit basis (that is, they have a range of minimum and maximum credits). When you register via CU Connect or via the Web for a variable credit course, enter the number of credit hours you want to receive for the course when prompted. The number of credits can be changed at the registrar's office throughout the registration and drop/add periods through 5:00 p.m., Friday, September 14.

E-Mail the Registrar

Have you ever had an academic records-related or registration-related question but didn't know whom to ask? Or have you ever had a comment you wanted to share with us about one of our programs or processes?

E-mail the registrar's office at registrar@colorado.edu to get some answers or make your comments. Your e-mail will be read by a staff member in the registrar's office and then forwarded to the appropriate person for a response.

Grade Information

To obtain information about grades at the end of the semester:

• Call CU Connect, the telephone registration system, at 303-938-8110, during regular hours of operation (see page 16). When prompted to enter an application code, enter a "2" to access the grading application. You'll then need to enter the term code for the semester you want to access, followed by your student number and your PIN.

Term codes consist of the last two digits in the year followed by one of these numbers:

- 1 = spring
- 4 = summer
- 7 = fall

For spring semester 2001 grades, use the term code 011. For fall semester 2001 grades, use the term code 017.

• Look up your grades on PLUS on the Web at www.colorado.edu/plus.

NOTE: Spring semester 2001 grades will be available on PLUS and CU Connect *beginning* May 11. Fall semester 2001 grades will be available *beginning* December 20.

• Check to see if your grades are posted, as some instructors post grades for their courses outside of their offices, the classroom, or the departmental office.

• Order official transcripts by:

- mailing a signed written request to Transcripts, UCB 68, University of Colorado, Boulder, CO 80309-0068
- sending a signed FAX request to 303-492-4884
- calling in a request to 303-492-8987

The above methods for ordering official transcripts are free of charge and are normally processed (mailed 1st Class) within four business days.

There are two additional methods available for ordering an official transcript. Both are available 24 hours/day by a third party provider, VOICE FX. You may either call 1-800-613-3735 or contact them by Web at www.gettranscript.com and select the University of Colorado at Boulder. Transcripts through this service cost \$1.50 each. These are processed (mailed 1st class) within four business days.

• Order an unofficial transcript for a cost of \$1 (next-day service) or \$5 (same-day service) at the transcript window, Regent lobby, or by calling 303-492-8987. Unofficial transcripts are not mailed off campus.

Graduation

If you plan to graduate within the next year, you must check with your dean's office for graduation application deadlines and notification procedures.

Graduating students with Federal Perkins/NDSL loans must complete a loan exit interview before leaving the university.

NOTE: If you are receiving financial aid and are working on two majors (same degree) or a major and a minor and don't plan to graduate from both programs at the same time, your financial aid may be affected. For more information, contact the Office of Financial Aid (see page 7 for location), or call 303-492-5091.

You can view the following information on PLUS (Personal Look-up Services) on the World Wide Web by using your university student number and personal identification number (PIN):

Students in the College of Business and Administration and the College of Engineering and Applied Science must contact their respective dean's office concerning academic progress.

Other Registration Programs

A number of different registrations are held each semester for specific categories of students. If you have questions about any of these registrations, call the number listed in that section or see the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog*.

ACCESS Registration

Nondegree students (students not currently enrolled in a degree program at CU-Boulder) may take Boulder campus courses through the ACCESS (Available Credit Courses for Eligible Special Students) Program. Register through CU Connect, web registration, or in person at the Continuing Education Office, 1505 University, beginning Friday, August 24. For information on registration eligibility and times for registration, please call 303-492-5148 or visit the ACCESS web site at www.colorado.edu/conted/access.htm.

NOTE: Nondegree students who are classified as non-residents may register for 3 credit hours or less through ACCESS and be assessed a rate less than regular nonresident tuition.

Concurrent Registration

If you plan to take at least one course at CU-Boulder in the fall and cannot register for all courses required for your degree program, you may be able to register concurrently on another CU campus. The course(s) must be required for your degree program, you must have your dean's permission, and enrollment levels must not have been reached on the other campus. Graduate students must have their advisor's approval. If all these conditions are met, you may register on another CU campus for up to two courses or 6 credit hours, whichever is greater.

You cannot register concurrently until the final drop/add period has begun on the other campus. Boulder students pay Boulder tuition rates for all courses.

Concurrent registration forms and instructions are available at the registrar's office in Regent 105 beginning August 1. For information, call 303-492-8494.

Note to Graduate Students: Check with the Office of the Registrar for exceptions to the home-campus registration requirement and limitation on credit hours at the host campus.

Course Reservation Program

The course reservation program assists you in getting the courses you need to graduate by giving you an opportunity to reserve space in a course and enroll in that course for the next semester before the next registration period begins. All undergraduate courses offered at CU-Boulder that use wait lists, except for controlled enrollment courses, are included in the course reservation program.

You are eligible to participate in the course reservation program for *spring semester 2002* if your name is on a wait list for a course as of 5:00 p.m. on September 5 (the wait list deadline), and you don't get enrolled in the course.

NOTE: This applies only to course wait lists on the Student Information System (SIS), not wait lists that may be kept manually by a department.

If you are on a course wait list as of 5:00 p.m. on September 5 and don't get into the class, you should plan to come into the registrar's office, Regent 105, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., **October 29 - November 2** to register for the course for spring 2002. Registrations will *not* be honored through the course reservation program after November 2. In addition, all restrictions are honored, and you must clear up any "stops" before registering. You will register for all other spring 2002 courses during your regular registration time assignment.

Faculty and Staff Registration

All permanent faculty and staff members at CU-Boulder may take 1 to 6 credit hours each year without paying tuition. Course work must be taken outside of scheduled working hours or an adjusted work schedule must be established that is acceptable to the employing department. For more information, call 303-492-5381.

High School Concurrent Program

High school students interested in the challenge of university course work may enroll in credit courses at the University of Colorado at Boulder through the High School Concurrent Program. In addition to earning college credit, students may also earn credit toward high school graduation requirements. Registration is available through the Division of Continuing Education. For information on eligibility and times for registration using CU Connect or web registration, please call 303-492-5148 or visit the high school concurrent web site at www.colorado.edu/conted/hsconcur.htm.

Intercampus Registration

If you want to take course work on another University of Colorado campus but not go through the concurrent registration program, apply for admission to that campus

and follow its registration procedures. Check with your dean's office for approval. (Students in the College of Arts and Sciences may not register at the Denver or Colorado Springs campus except in the summer.)

Late Registration

To be guaranteed enrollment for fall 2001, you must complete registration by **midnight on August 17**. (**Exception:** Incoming freshmen and transfer students attending the final arts and sciences orientation session in August must complete registration by 5:00 p.m. on August 23. All other incoming freshmen and transfer students who have not registered by August 17 must register on August 23 by 5:00 p.m.) If you do not register by the appropriate deadline (this includes graduate students), you are subject to late registration. Only students in open categories are eligible for late registration. In addition, a lower registration priority and a **\$50 late fee** are applied.

If you are a continuing student, call 303-492-6970 on August 24 to see if you are eligible for late registration. If you are a new or readmitted student, go to the Office of Admissions in Regent 125 (303-492-6301) to check for eligibility. Students who are eligible for late registration must go to the registrar's office in Regent 105, to be set up for late registration.

Parking Permits and Bicycle Registration

Buy a student parking permit in person at Coors Events/Conference Center (conference level) for fall 2001. The permit sale schedule is listed below. Please check our website (ucbparking.colorado.edu) for possible changes to this schedule. Please bring a photo ID and a valid state motor vehicle registration form.

The costs for an academic-year permit (August - May) are \$180, \$225, \$279, and \$297. Semester rates are \$90, \$112.50, \$139.50 and \$148.50. Motorcycle permits cost \$36 per semester or \$72 for academic year (all prices are subject to change). You can pay with cash, check, credit card (Visa, MasterCard, American Express), or charge it to your tuition and fee bill.

Bike Registration

The Time Out Program (TOP) provides an opportunity for you to take a leave from the university for a semester or a year without losing your place in your current college or school. You must be in good academic standing and have your dean's approval. Readmission to the university is guaranteed when you return, providing you meet registration and deposit deadlines. A nonrefundable \$40 application fee is charged. The TOP application deadline for fall semester is **October 10**. Withdrawal Procedures

If you need to withdraw from *all of your courses* for fall semester 2001, you can do one of the following. **Note:** In all withdrawal correspondence, be sure to include your name, student ID number, the semester from which you want to withdraw, and your signature.

- Fill out a withdrawal form in the registrar's office in Regent 105.
- Write a letter to the Withdrawal Coordinator, Office of the Registrar, 20 UCB, Boulder, CO 80309-0020. (Exception: Nondegree students withdraw through Continuing Education, 1505 University Ave., 178 UCB, Boulder, CO 80309-0178.)
- Fax a letter of withdrawal to 303-492-8748 or 303-492-4884.
- E-mail a statement of withdrawal (if the e-mail account is in your name) to withdrawal@registrar.colorado.edu.

You need not drop your courses; this is done for you.

Also, be sure to refer to the withdrawal "refund or assessment schedule" on the next page.

If you are registered for courses and do not officially withdraw from the university by contacting the registrar's office, failing grades are recorded for all of your courses.

For questions or more information about the withdrawal process, visit or call the Office of the Registrar, Regent 105, 303-492-8673 or e-mail withdrawal@registrar.colorado.edu.

NOTE:

- Deadlines and rules for withdrawing may vary within each college and school. Check with your dean's office concerning withdrawal rules.
- *If you drop all your courses and don't re-register, you are considered withdrawn from the university and you should notify the registrar's office.*
- If you withdraw from CU-Boulder but plan to return to the Boulder main campus in the future, you must either go on the Time Out Program (see this page) or reapply through the Office of Admissions. (Students remaining enrolled in only Continuing Education classes must still either reapply or go on TOP to return to Boulder main campus.)
- Tuition assessments for students with financial aid (see pages 32-33) may differ from those listed on this page. Please check with the Bursar's Office at 303-492-5381. If deaf or hard of hearing, call 303-492-3528 (TTY).

Withdrawing students (including students applying for the Time Out Program) with Federal Perkins/NDSL loans must complete a loan exit interview before leaving the university. Failure to do so will result in a stop on your record. This stop will prevent you from receiving a diploma or an academic transcript of work at the university and from registering for any future terms. In order to complete a loan exit interview, contact the Student Loan Department in the Bursar's Office at 303-492-5571. If deaf or hard of hearing, call 303-492-3528 (TTY).

About Course Listings

Understanding Course Numbers

Courses are numbered according to the following guidelines:

1000-2999	Lower-division courses
3000-4999	Upper-division courses
5000-5999	Courses intended for graduate students and qualified undergraduates
6000-8999	Courses open to graduate students only

Enrollment in courses with a 700-, 800-, or 900-level section number is controlled by each department. The department staff will either give you the five-digit course call number which will permit you to register for the course directly (either via CU Connect or via web registration), or they will give you a special action form to take to the registrar's office.

Understanding Course Listings

The headers at the top of each column of the course listings include:

Core Diamonds—A diamond (♦) appears to the left of courses that fulfill a College of Arts and Sciences core curriculum requirement. (Refer to the College of Business Degree Requirements brochure for information on courses that fulfill the College of Business core curriculum requirements.)

Course Title—Often abbreviated; refer to the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog* for the complete title and course description.

Section Number—This three-digit number refers to the specific meeting pattern of the course. A single three-digit number is the lecture number. When an R, L, P, or S precedes the section number, it indicates that the section is a recitation (R), a laboratory (L), a practicum (P), or a studio (S), which must be taken in addition to the lecture. Some courses may have three: lecture, lab, and recitation.

Call Number—The five-digit number, specific to a particular term, that is used for requesting a specific section of a course via CU Connect and via web registration.

Time/Days—Meeting time and days of the class: (M—Monday; T—Tuesday; W—Wednesday; R—Thursday; F—Friday; S—Saturday; and U—Sunday).

Building/Room—The building name and room number where the class meets; this is subject to change. (See page 42 for the building abbreviations.)

Maximum Enrollment—The maximum number of students allowed to enroll in the course.

Notes—When a course has a prerequisite and/or a corequisite, a note (*in italics*) appears just after the course title. Additional course notes are inserted into each course listing, as needed, e.g. exam dates, etc.

Remember: Some courses may not be available to you due to college or school restrictions or class size limitations. In this case, CU Connect and web registration will inform you with an appropriate message.

Department Headings—These will include the phone number and the department location.

The core curriculum must be satisfied by all students in the College of Arts and Sciences who began their undergraduate study in the summer of 1988 or later. Those students who finished high school in the spring of 1988 or later must also meet the college's minimum academic preparation standards, or MAPS (see page 120). You must take one course per MAPS deficiency per term. **Please note the following change in policy: If you complete a course approved to fulfill a MAPS deficiency and that course also is approved to fulfill a Core area, that course can be used to fulfill both the Core requirement and the MAPS deficiency. This change in policy applies to all Arts and Sciences students who are subject to MAPS. Please contact your academic advisor for additional information.**

There are eleven requirements of the core curriculum—four in skills acquisition and seven in the content areas of study. The requirements are all listed here, with instructions and lists of courses that will fulfill each requirement. For a complete explanation of graduation requirements in the College of Arts and Sciences, see the University of Colorado Catalog.

Selected majors are exempt from portions of the core curriculum (see sections 6, 8, 9 and 10 of the content areas of study). Content area exemptions may be used cumulatively if you are graduating with more than one eligible major.

Although a single course may appear in several areas, you may use it to meet only one core requirement.

Skills Acquisition

While in high school, all students are required to demonstrate third-level proficiency in a single modern or classical foreign language. If you have not met this requirement at the time you enter the college, you are required to meet the deficiency by passing an appropriate third-semester college course or by passing a CU-Boulder-approved equivalency examination. 9. Natural Science (13 hours minimum)

Minimum Academic Preparation Standards

All new students entering the University of Colorado who finished high school in the spring of 1988 or later must meet the Minimum Academic Preparation Standards (MAPS) specified by their school or college. The purpose of these standards is to assure that all students have some core knowledge in common.

The College of Arts and Sciences has adopted the following standards for admissions. These standards are defined in high school years.

- English** 4 high school years (including 2 in composition)
- Mathematics** 3 high school years (2 in algebra and 1 in geometry)
- Natural Science** 3 high school years (including 2 in lab science, one of which must be chemistry or physics)
- Social Science** 3 high school years (including one of U.S. or world history and one of geography. A student who has U.S. history may use 1/2 year of world history and 1/2 year of geography instead of one year of geography)
- Foreign Language** completion of a third-year-level course (level III) in a high school foreign language sequence

Policies Concerning the Completion of MAPS

If you were admitted to the College of Arts and Sciences with missing MAPS courses, you are subject to the following policies:

1. Each year of missing high school work can be made up by one semester of appropriate CU-Boulder course work.
2. All course work taken toward fulfillment of the MAPS must be taken for a letter grade, and you must receive a passing grade.
3. You are required to enroll in and complete at least one MAPS course each term, beginning in your first term of enrollment, until such time as all MAPS requirements are completed. This policy applies to new freshmen, transfer students, and students transferring from other colleges or schools on the Boulder campus and from other campuses of the University. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in suspension at the end of the term

in which you cease to complete missing MAPS courses.

4. All students who first enroll in one college or school at CU-Boulder and who subsequently transfer to another college or school are required to meet the MAPS specified for the new college or school, whether or not they have completed their MAPS courses in their previous college or school.

5. Double-degree students must meet MAPS requirements of both degree-granting colleges or schools.

6. During the arts and sciences orientation, students must consult with a CU-Boulder academic advisor to determine which specific courses may be used to meet a MAPS requirement.

7. If you complete a course approved to fulfill a MAPS deficiency and that course also is approved to fulfill a Core area, that course can be used to fulfill both the Core requirement and the MAPS deficiency. This change in policy applies to all Arts and Sciences students who are subject to MAPS.
