## Registration/Academic Calendar

**NOTE:** Any student who completes registration agrees to pay the University of Colorado at Boulder according to the payment terms documented in the *Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses under the Paying Your Bill* section. (See pages 27–28.)

### **October 27–31 (Mon.–Fri.)**

Spring 2004 course reservation registration period for eligible students. (See page 39 of the *Fall 2003 Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* for eligibility requirements.)

### **November 3–30 (Mon.–Sun.)**

► Spring 2004 registration time assignments for students enrolled during fall 2003. For best course selection, register as soon as possible after your time assignment begins. Continuing students can register through January 8.

### **December 1 (Mon.) – January 8 (Thurs.)**

Schedule adjustment for continuing degree students who have registered for spring semester and registration for continuing students who have not yet registered.

Spring 2004 registration for new admitted and confirmed students and confirmed readmitted students.

### **December 12 (Fri.)**

**Deadline** to update your billing and permanent addresses to ensure that your spring 2004 bill is mailed to the correct address.

### **December 15 (Mon.)**

Bills mailed to the billing addresses of all students who register by December 12, or view bills online if using the E-bill/E-check option. If no billing address is on record, bills will be mailed to the permanent address.

### **December 22 (Mon.)**

Bills mailed to the billing addresses of all students who register December 13–19, or view bills online if using the E-bill/E-check option. If no billing address is on record, bills will be mailed to the permanent address.

### **January 2 (Fri.)**

► **Deadline for continuing students to withdraw from the university and receive a full refund of the \$200 enrollment deposit, less any outstanding charges.** (This deadline to withdraw and not forfeit the deposit applies to students planning to go on the Time Out Program as well.) New and readmitted students are not eligible for a refund. (See page 37.)

### **January 5 (Mon.)**

Bills mailed to the billing addresses of all students who register December 20 - January 2, or view bills online if using the E-bill/E-check option. If no billing address is on record, bills will be mailed to the permanent address.

### **January 8 (Thurs.)**

► **Deadline for all students, both undergraduate and graduate, to register for spring courses. Registration must be completed by 6:00 p.m. on this day to be guaranteed enrollment for spring semester.** After this date, registration is on a space-available basis, and a **\$50 late fee** is charged. (See page 36 for late registration information.)

### **January 9 (Fri.)**

Bills mailed to the mailing addresses of all students who register January 3–8, or view bills online if using the E-bill/E-check option.

Drop/add time assignments begin. (See page 17.)

ACCESS registration begins. (See page 35.)

### **January 11 (Sun.)**

Drop/add time assignments continue, and faculty/staff registration begins. University closed. (See page 17.)

### **January 12 (Mon.)**

► **Classes begin.**

### **January 19 (Mon.)**

Martin Luther King Jr. holiday. No classes. University closed.

### **January 20 (Tues.)**

Space-available registration for Senior Citizens Auditors Program, Koenig Alumni Center, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.; continues on Wednesday, January 21, 9:00 a.m. to noon. (See page 36.)

### **January 21 (Wed.)**

**Add Deadline:**

► **Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to add a course**, including independent study and thesis, without the instructor's signature. *After this date, the instructor's signature is required on a special action form to add a course (through January 30).* **NOTE:** After 5:00 p.m. on this date, web registration is only available for dropping courses (through 5:00 p.m. on January 28, the drop deadline). (See page 17.)

**Wait List Deadline:**

► **Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to add name to a course wait list.** (See page 13.)

**Tuition Payment Deadlines:**

► **Deadline to pay full tuition and fees. Due before 6:00 p.m. if paid in person or mailed, or before midnight using the E-check option.** No grace period. (See pages 27–28.)

► **Deadline** to sign up for the two-payment plan before midnight via PLUS. No grace period.

► **Deadline (5:00 p.m.)** to waive university-sponsored health insurance at Wardenburg Health Center.

► **Deadline (5:00 p.m.)** for private scholarship checks to be received in the financial aid Scholarship Office to avoid late and service charges. Outstanding charges that are anticipated to be paid by a scholarship that has not been received must be paid by this date in order to avoid late and service charges.

### **January 28 (Wed.)**

**Drop Deadline:**

► **Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to drop a course** without the instructor's signature, without being assessed tuition and fees for that course, and without a *W* grade appearing on the transcript. *After this date, the instructor's signature is required on a special action form and students must be passing the course to drop it.* (See page 17.) *No refunds for tuition or fees are given for courses dropped after this date.*

► **Deadline (5:00 p.m.)** to petition to waive UCSU student fees.

► **Deadline** to request a refund of any student opportunities fees you selected. (See page 11.)

► **Deadline (5:00 p.m.)** to withdraw from the university and only be assessed \$200 in tuition and fees. (See page 37.)

**January 30 (Fri.)**

► **Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to add a course without petitioning your dean.** NOTE: Instructors' signature is required on a special action form to add a course. In general, instructors only approve an add students have been regularly attending and there's space in the course. (See page 17.)

► **Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to change variable-credit hours, pass/fail, and no-credit status on courses.** (See page 17.)

**February 11 (Wed.)**

► **Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to withdraw from the university and only be assessed 40 percent of full tuition and fees.** (See page 37.)

**February 20 (Fri.)**

► **Deadline** for students who have three or more final exams on the same day for spring semester to make arrangements to change their final exam schedule. (See page 5.)

**February 25 (Wed.)**

► **Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to drop a course without petitioning the dean's office.** (See page 17.)

► **Deadline** to pay unpaid balance (including Two-Payment Plan). Due 5:00 p.m. if paid in person or mailed, or before midnight using the E-check option. No grace period.

► **Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to withdraw from the university and only be assessed 60 percent of full tuition and fees.**

► **Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to turn in Time Out Program (TOP) applications to the registrar's office and be assured a continuing student registration time assignment for fall semester 2004.** (See page 37.)

► **Fall 2004 course listings available on the Web.**

**March 3 (Wed.)**

Summer 2004 registration begins for continuing degree students enrolled during spring 2004.

**March 8 (Mon.)**

Summer 2004 registration begins for eligible new and readmitted students and for nondegree students.

**March 10 (Wed.)**

The *Fall 2004 Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses (RHSC)* is available for \$3 per copy beginning on this date in Regent 105, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and at the CU Book Store in the UMC. 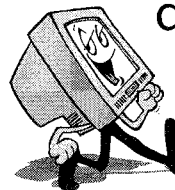

To qualify for rescheduling final exam times, you must provide evidence that you have three or more exams on the same day, and arrangements must be made with your instructor no later than the end of the sixth week of the semester (Friday, February 20, 2004).

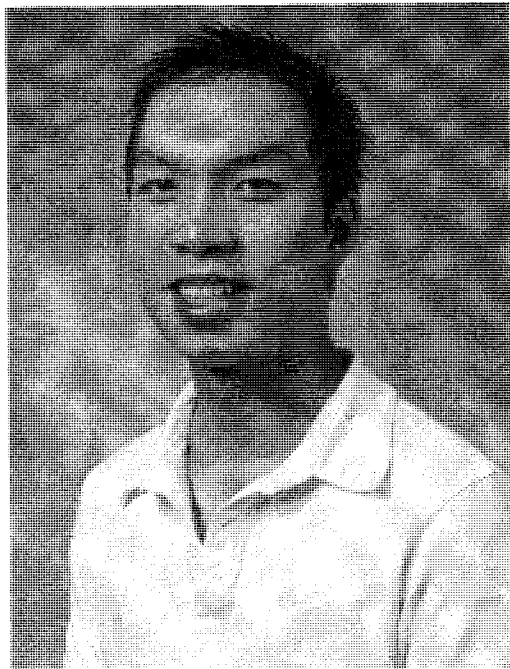

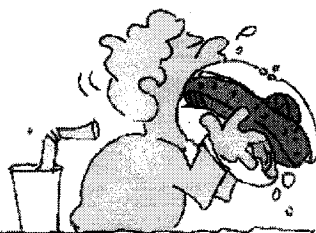

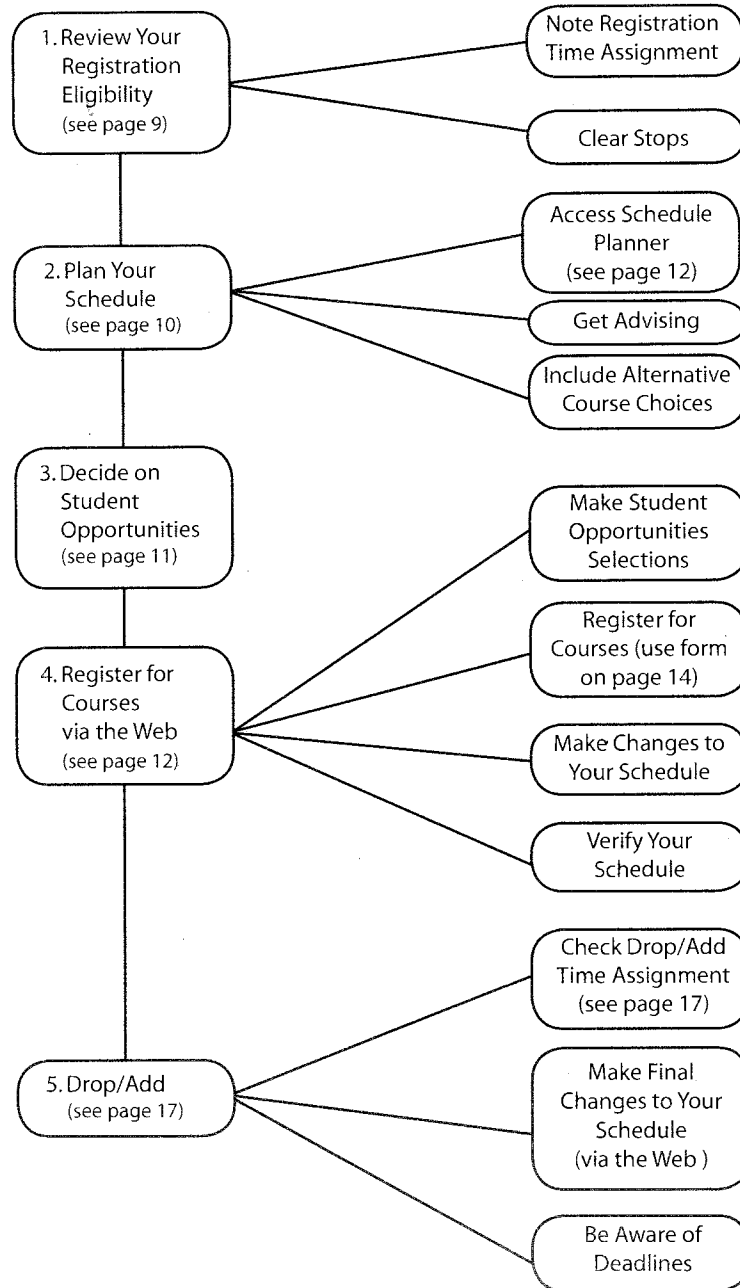

## Steps to Registration



This *Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* contains information you need to register for the spring 2004 semester, adjust your schedule, and pay your bill. If policies or procedures change, you will receive further information. The requirements, policies, and course descriptions of each college and school are printed in the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog*. You are responsible for knowing and following the catalog policies for your year of entry into a specific program at CU-Boulder.

Although this handbook was prepared on the basis of the best information available at the time of its printing (October 2, 2003) all information is subject to change.

You can access web registration to check your registration eligibility, register for courses, drop and add courses, and sign up for course wait lists (if available). When you register, you will receive immediate confirmation or denial of your enrollment in courses.

**Registration Deadline** - All students must complete registration by 6:00 p.m. on January 8 to be guaranteed enrollment for spring semester 2004. Students who do not register by this date (including graduate students) are subject to late registration and a **\$50 late fee**.

**NOTE: If you require accommodations because of a disability, notify the Office of the Registrar, University of Colorado at Boulder, 20 UCB, Boulder, CO 80309-0020, or call 303-492-6970 and press 1 to speak with a registration assistant. If you are deaf or hard of hearing, call 303-492-5841 (TTY).**

**① Review Your Registration Eligibility**

**Currently enrolled students:**

You can access your spring semester 2004 registration eligibility (including your registration time assignment) in the following ways:

- **View your registration eligibility status via web registration.** You may view your registration time assignment and any stops or advising requirements that need to be cleared by checking your registration status via web registration. To access this information, go to PLUS on the Web at [www.colorado.edu/plus](http://www.colorado.edu/plus) and select the Registration button. Next, log on to web registration by entering your student ID number and your PIN (personal identification number). Then select the Reg. Status tab at the bottom of the screen. You can then select spring semester 2004 to view your eligibility to register (including any stops or advising requirements currently on your record) as well as your registration time assignment (the time you may begin registering). **NOTE: Your registration time assignment does not show on the web registration status screen after your time assignment has passed;** it only displays if it has not yet arrived and thus makes you ineligible to register.
- **Come to the registrar's office** for a copy of your invitation to register if you don't have access to the Web.

**All new and readmitted students:**

- **You'll receive a personalized invitation to register** in the mail (mailed to your mailing address) or at orientation (if required). Your invitation to register includes your student ID number and PIN (personal identification number). Your PIN, in combination with your student number, allows you to access web registration, the Personal Look-Up Services (PLUS) on the Web, and the financial aid telephone system. Certain data specific to you are available on these systems, and your PIN controls access to this information. Your PIN is a randomly set number and must be kept confidential. **Be sure to memorize your PIN, as it remains the same throughout your career at CU-Boulder.**

**Note to All Students:** If you feel that your PIN is not secure and you wish to change it, you can change it via PLUS or come in to the registrar's office in Regent 105. Or if you forget your PIN, you can call the registrar's office at 303-492-6970, or come in to the office in Regent 105.

**Your registration eligibility via web registration (or your invitation to register) includes:**

- **Your registration time assignment** - This is the date and time you can begin registering for courses. You can register any time after your time assignment begins through the registration deadline (see the registration/academic calendar on pages 2-3 for specific dates). It is to your advantage to register as soon as possible after your registration time assignment begins. You can check your registration status on the Web to find out your registration time assignment (the time you may begin registering). **NOTE:** Your registration time assignment does not show on the web registration status screen after your time assignment has passed. It only displays if it has not yet arrived and thus makes you ineligible to register.

**Spring semester registration time assignments for undergraduate continuing students** are based on the total number of predicted cumulative hours completed at the end of fall semester 2003. This includes the total number of hours completed at CU (any campus), plus transfer credit, and any courses you are currently enrolled in (as of September 26). Graduating seniors receive the earliest assignments. All other seniors register next, then graduate and law students, first-semester freshmen (those with 12 or fewer hours), juniors, sophomores, and then second-semester freshmen. Within these groups, time assignments are random, but those with more hours register first.

Freshmen.....	0-29 hours
Sophomores .....	30-59 hours
Juniors .....	60-89 hours
Seniors .....	90-123 hours
5th Year Seniors .....	124 hours and above

- **Advising notice** - If required by your college or school, consult with an advisor before registering. (See page 31.) If required by the Herbst Academic Center (for student athletes) contact your academic coordinator at the Herbst Academic Center before registering.
- **Other stops** - Stops are holds that the university puts on student records for various reasons. Stops might originate from delinquent financial obligations, academic concerns, or even disciplinary matters. All stops must be cleared before you are allowed to register.

## ☉ Decide on Student Opportunities

In addition to the mandatory fees you must pay along with your tuition, there is a group of student opportunities available to you for which optional fees are charged. The opportunities consist of various services provided by the university; tickets for concerts, plays, and the like, and clubs and student groups in which you can participate or merely provide money for their use. When you first access web registration, you will need to go to the Student Opp. tab to make your student opportunities selections. A brief description of the student opportunities fees can be accessed via web registration. You will need to choose (or not) each opportunity. After you've made your choices, you'll be prompted to confirm them. With this step completed, you can register for classes. The student opportunities you have chosen will appear on your tuition and fee bill. If you want to change any of the student opportunities originally chosen, you cannot do so via the Web. Instead, you must **call the appropriate office** at the phone number listed below. **January 28 is the deadline to request a refund of any student opportunities fee you selected.** Following are descriptions of all the opportunities available to you, including the fee for each opportunity.

### Club Sports..... \$4.75

Club Sports are partially funded by student fees and require participants to pay out-of-pocket expenses that may limit participation in their sport. This optional fee helps support club sports so there are fewer out-of-pocket expenses for national competitions and overhead costs incurred by each club. There are currently over 30 club sports, with students competing in local, regional, and national competitions. Coed sports include: bicycle racing, crew, diving, equestrian, fencing, field hockey, figure skating, fly fishing, kayaking, racquetball, snowboarding, speed skating, squash, swimming, tae kwon do, tennis, triathlon, and water polo. Men's sports include: baseball, ice hockey, roller hockey, rugby, soccer, ultimate frisbee, volleyball, and wrestling. Women's sports include: dance, ice hockey, rugby, soccer, softball, ultimate frisbee, and volleyball. **303-492-5274**

### 4 Register for Courses

#### Register for courses via web registration.

First complete the registration form on page 14. Then go to PLUS at [www.colorado.edu/plus](http://www.colorado.edu/plus) and select the Registration button. Follow the instructions shown on the web registration pages. When you're done registering, be sure to verify your schedule by going to the schedule page in web registration.

Web registration is normally available Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to midnight, and on Sundays from 11:00 a.m. to midnight. (See page 14 for exceptions.) Web registration is NOT available on Saturdays.

**Need registration assistance?** If you have problems or questions concerning web registration, call the registrar's office at **303-492-6970** and press **1** to speak with a registration assistant. Call between 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, except on university holidays. Recorded registration information is also available at this number 24 hours a day (press **2** to hear recorded registration information).

Once you have registered, make adjustments to your schedule via the Web through the **registration deadline, 6:00 p.m. on January 8**. After this date, see page 17 for instructions on making final schedule adjustments during the drop/add period.

#### Linked Courses

Linked courses are lecture courses that have required recitations and/or labs. In the course listings, you can identify a linked course because the call numbers for linked lectures are not listed. Only the call numbers for the linked recitation or lab are listed. (For courses that have a required lecture, recitation, and a lab, the call numbers are not listed for the lecture and recitation; they are only listed for the lab.)

To register for linked courses, enter the call number for the lab or recitation only. When you enter the call number, the system automatically links all other sections of the course and either enrolls you in all sections of the course or gives you the option of placing your name on a wait list, if available, for all linked sections of the course.

#### Controlled Enrollment and Independent Study Courses

Controlled enrollment sections of a course and independent study courses are ones that have specific restrictions placed by the department that offers the course. They have a section number between 700 and 999. The call numbers are not usually published for these sections. To find out if you qualify for a controlled enrollment section or an independent study course, contact the department that offers the course. If you are eligible, the department will either enroll you in the course or give you the call number so you can register for the course via the Web.

#### Searching for Courses

You might need to search for a new section of a course for the following reasons:

- Sometimes academic departments must change the time a course is offered after the *Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* has been published (when this happens, the department cancels the original section and adds a new section that reflects the time change), or
- The section you request is full.

#### You can search for available sections the following ways:

- **The schedule planner is a tool** to find out about course availability as well as additional course information. Using this feature, you can also search for courses by subject, core requirements, or meeting time, and you also have the option to search for only open courses. When a course is displayed, you can access the course description, required books, final exam time, and student ratings of the course. In addition, you can map out your schedule to show when you have courses and other scheduled commitments, such as work. **NOTE:** *The schedule planner is updated nightly during registration periods, so it is a good planning source, but does not display up-to-the-minute course availability.* You can access the schedule planner feature via PLUS at [www.colorado.edu/plus](http://www.colorado.edu/plus).
- **You can conduct online course searches** via web registration. The **web registration course search** tool allows you to search by subject, level, course number, core requirements, and by meeting time. You can also choose to limit your search to only open courses and sections. **The course search feature is updated on a real-time basis**, so if you find a course you would like to sign up for, you immediately know whether there is still room in the course. **Also, if you try to register for a course via web registration but you're denied the course** (due to the section being closed or cancelled), you can conduct a **section search** to see if there are any other sections available of that same course that fit in with your schedule. When you're denied a course, click on the word Search next to the course, and then click on the Submit button. If there are any available sections of the course that fit your schedule, you'll be given the option to add the course (just click on the Add button for the section you want). You can access web registration via PLUS at [www.colorado.edu/plus](http://www.colorado.edu/plus).

## Wait Lists

Throughout the registration and drop/add periods, if you are eligible to take a course but find it is full, you may be able to put your name on a computerized wait list. Each department determines if a wait list will be offered for a course and what type of wait list will be used. There are two types of wait lists:

- **Automatic wait lists** are set up on a first-come, first-served basis. As a vacancy occurs in a class, the person at the top of the list is automatically enrolled.
- **Resequenced wait lists** use a priority system to determine who enrolls in a course as spaces open up. Priorities are established by the department and are usually based on class standing and/or major.

Web registration informs you if a class you have requested has a wait list (as well as the number of students already on the wait list) and gives you the option of adding your name to the list. Click on the Wait List option and then select Submit and wait for verification.

**NOTE:** Web registration does not tell you what type of wait list is used for the course.

As wait-list positions constantly change during the registration and drop/add periods, it's a good idea to check your schedule frequently to find out your position on the wait list. **It is especially important to check before the drop deadline (5:00 p.m. on January 28) so you can drop the course if you are enrolled but no longer wish to take it.**

To find out your wait-list position log on to web registration via PLUS and then click on the Schedule tab at the bottom of the page. You'll be able to see your wait-list position for a course on the schedule page under Status. Wait-list positions via web registration are updated in real time.

**Important:** Placing your name on a wait list does not guarantee that you will be enrolled in that course, even if you're first on the wait list.

When a space opens up for you in a course, you are automatically enrolled in the class from the wait list. An e-mail message

notifying you of your enrollment from the wait list is then generated, but even if you don't receive the e-mail you're still responsible for knowing if you are enrolled from a wait list.

If you choose not to remain on a wait list or if you find that you have been enrolled in a course that you no longer want, drop the course as soon as possible.

**NOTE:** Wait-listed hours are included in your credit load limit (see page 33). You cannot be enrolled and wait listed for courses offered at the same time, and you cannot be wait listed for two courses offered at the same time.

**It is your responsibility to find out if you have been enrolled in a course from the wait list. If you do not attend a course you have been enrolled in, you will receive an F for that course.**

### Deadlines for Wait Lists

You may place your name on course wait lists through **5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, January 21**. At midnight on January 21, one final roll of the wait lists will occur to automatically enroll students from wait lists into any existing course openings. After this final wait list roll, all wait lists are frozen. This means that there is no automatic enrollment from wait lists beginning on January 22.

If you are still on a wait list as of January 22 and are still interested in taking that course and have been attending regularly, check with the department offering the course. You must let the department know you are still interested in the course, **should an opening occur**. In that event, the department will give you a signed special action form to add the course. (**NOTE:** After January 21, you need the signature of the instructor on a special action form to add a course.) All department wait lists are canceled at 5:00 p.m. on Friday, January 30, the deadline to add a course without petitioning your dean.

**NOTE:** If you are on the wait list as of 5:00 p.m. on January 21, and you don't get enrolled in the course (undergraduate courses only), you are eligible to reserve the course the next time it is offered through the Course Reservation Program. (See page 35.)

**NOTE:** After 5:00 p.m. on January 21, web registration is only available for dropping courses through 5:00 p.m. on January 28, the drop deadline.
- **January 28, 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (the drop deadline).**

**Need help?** Call the registrar's office for personal assistance, 303-492-6970 and press 1, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, except university holidays.

Recorded registration information is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week (press 2 to hear the recorded information).

## Dropping and Adding Courses

Complete the drop/add form on page 16 of this handbook by filling out call numbers, department abbreviations, course numbers, and section numbers of courses that you want to drop and/or add to your schedule. Because there may be many closed courses, have several alternate courses selected. (See page 14 for information about course-available lists on the Web.)

You may drop and add courses via web registration ([www.colorado.edu/plus](http://www.colorado.edu/plus)) any time after your drop/add time assignment begins. To adjust your schedule follow the registration instructions on page 14. Computer lab locations are listed on page 32.

If you have questions or concerns about your schedule, you should see your academic advisor or deans office. If you have questions about a course in particular (regarding restrictions, prerequisites, wait lists, etc.), you should see the appropriate academic department. See pages 18-19 for a listing of academic department locations and phone numbers. If you have questions or concerns about how dropping or adding a course will affect your bill, contact the Bursar's Office. (See page 7.)

## Administrative Drops

Administrative drops are initiated by departments. If you have not met all the course requirements or do not attend your courses regularly during the first few weeks, you may be administratively dropped from any course. Check with each department for policies concerning administrative drops.

## Deadlines for Adding Courses

- **Add Deadline** – The deadline to add a course, including independent study and thesis, without the instructor's signature is **5:00 p.m., Wednesday, January 21.** *To add a course after January 21 through January 30 you must have the signature of your instructor on a special action form.* In general, instructors only approve an add if you've been attending regularly, and there's space in the course.
- **Deadline to Add without Petitioning Your Dean** – The deadline to add a course without petitioning your dean is **5:00 p.m., Friday, January 30.** (**NOTE:** You must have instructor's signature on a special action form to add a course after January 21 and through January 30.) *No adds are permitted after January 21, unless there are extenuating circumstances clearly beyond your control (accident, illness, etc.).*

**January 30 (5:00 p.m.) is also the deadline to change variable-credit hours, pass/fail, and no-credit status on courses.** These changes can be made at the registrar's office in Regent 105 through 5:00 p.m. on January 30.

## Deadlines for Dropping Courses

**Drop Deadline** – The deadline to drop a course without the instructor's signature, without being assessed tuition and fees for that course, and without a *W* grade showing on your transcript is **5:00 p.m., Wednesday, January 28.**

For courses dropped after Wednesday, January 28 (5:00 p.m.), no tuition and fee adjustments are made and you will receive a *W* grade on your transcript for dropped courses.

*To drop a course after January 28 and through February 25,* you must be passing the course, and a special action form must be signed by your instructor and turned into the registrar's office. No tuition or course fees will be refunded.

**Deadline to Drop without Petitioning Your Dean** – The deadline to drop a course without petitioning your dean is **5:00 p.m., Wednesday, February 25.**

After February 25 you cannot drop a course unless there are circumstances clearly beyond your control (accident, illness, etc.). Such petitions are considered only if there is documentation of extraordinary circumstances beyond your control that are demonstrated to affect your performance in one course but not in all courses.

*To drop a course after this date,* you must have your dean's approval, as well as the approval of your instructor. Their signatures must be on a special action form or your request will not be processed.

**NOTE:** Dropping all your Boulder main-campus courses constitutes withdrawing from the university. See page 37 for withdrawal information.

**Receiving Your Bill**

If you register by January 2, your bill will be mailed to your billing address in December or early January. If no billing address is on record, bills will be mailed to the permanent address. If you register January 3-8, your bill will be mailed to your mailing address on January 9 (or to your permanent address if no mailing address is on record).

If you signed up for the E-bill option, you will be notified via e-mail that an E-bill was issued. You (or a parent or third party if you provided them access) can then view and pay your bill via the Internet. Using the E-bill option, you can also discontinue the printing and mailing of your monthly tuition and fee bill. See [bursar.colorado.edu](http://bursar.colorado.edu) for more information on E-bill and E-check.

If you need another copy of your bill, you can get a printout via PLUS.

**Tuition and Fees**

Tuition and fees are due by Wednesday, January 21, at 6:00 p.m. if paid in person or mailed, or before midnight if paid using E-check via the Internet. There are penalties for nonpayment and for late payment. See page 28. Postmarks do not constitute receipt of payment. Paying via the Internet is a great alternative!

**NEW!** Want an easy way to estimate your individual tuition and fees bill? Try the online bill estimator at [bursar.colorado.edu](http://bursar.colorado.edu)! The bill estimator provides you with a calculation of your approximate costs per semester using the most current tuition, fees, insurance, and room and board information.

**Understanding Tuition Charges**

- Drop/Add - After January 28 there are no tuition or course-fee adjustments for courses dropped. However, tuition for courses added is charged and billed.
- Credits Over 18 - Additional tuition is charged for every credit hour added over 18.
- No-Credit Courses - Tuition for a no-credit course is the same as for a course taken for credit.
- 0-Hour Courses - Tuition for a 0-hour course is charged at the rate of a 3-credit hour course.
- Double Degree Programs - Tuition charged for the college or school with the higher tuition rate.

**Graduate Research and Teaching Assistant Information**

Graduate students who receive teaching or research assistant (TA or RA) appointments are eligible for certain tuition and health insurance benefits. These include:

- \* Payment towards the cost of your tuition based on the number of hours employed per week.
- \* Partial payment towards the cost of your health insurance if you choose the Buff Limited or Buff Max Plan (no benefits for the Buff Value Plan).

RAs and TAs are responsible for paying mandatory fees, course fees, and the balance of the tuition and health insurance cost each semester. All tuition and fees, from both the department and student, are due by January 21, 2004. Late and service charges are billed if payments are not received on time. **Spring 2004 Course Fees**

Course fees are assessed to help offset the higher costs of specialized supplies, equipment, materials, and instructional and related support that are required to teach courses in certain departments. The 2003-04 course fees are listed by each department in the course listings beginning on page 40. A list is also available on the Web at [bursar.colorado.edu](http://bursar.colorado.edu) and at the Bursar's Office.

**Enrollment Deposit**

Your \$200 enrollment deposit is held for you by the university until you:

- drop all classes in a semester within established dates and guidelines (see page 37), or
- officially withdraw within established dates and guidelines (see page 37), or
- graduate.

At that time, the deposit is credited toward any outstanding financial obligations you might have, and a refund check is mailed to you or directly deposited into your bank account within approximately eight weeks. Update your permanent address at the Office of the Registrar, or via PLUS at [www.colorado.edu/plus](http://www.colorado.edu/plus), before you graduate or withdraw. Interest earned from enrollment deposits is used for student financial aid.

If you enroll at the university the semester following your graduation, your enrollment deposit remains on your account. It is then refunded to you, in accordance with established university policy, when you are no longer enrolled.

## Tuition & Fees

### **Residency**

Petitions for in-state tuition for spring 2003 are accepted between October 1, 2003, and December 29, 2003, at the registrar's office, Regent 105, University of Colorado at Boulder, 68 UCB, Boulder, CO 80309-0068. Students are advised to submit spring petitions by November 3, 2003, to insure timely processing for financial aid and billing purposes. Late petitions are accepted through January 16, 2004, but students who submit petitions after December 29 will not receive a decision by the tuition-payment deadline. Adjustments and reimbursements are made if a student's application was submitted by January 16 and is approved. Students who submit late petitions must pay full out-of-state tuition by the published deadline to avoid the late charge. For late petitions, the tuition amount and service charge is adjusted only for approved petitions.

### **Golden Buffalo Student Health Insurance Spring 2004**

It is understood that at times illness and/or injury can interrupt your studies and personal goals. Therefore, CU-Boulder sponsors the Golden Buffalo Student Health Insurance Plans: Buff Value, Buff Limited, and Buff Max to guarantee needed health care with minimal financial difficulty, if such needs arise.

The University of Colorado at Boulder has a mandatory policy statement that requires all students taking 6 or more credit hours to be covered by a health insurance plan. Students may elect coverage under their own insurance, through an employer, their parents, or the university will provide an insurance plan designed to meet most students' needs. The university requires students to take positive action in order to waive the insurance coverage provided by the university. The University of Colorado at Boulder encourages students to research various health plan options, so that they make informed health care choices.

**Students taking 6 credit hours** or more are automatically enrolled and billed by the university for the Golden Buffalo Student Health Insurance Buff Limited, unless you select or waive the health insurance by **January 21, 2004**.

To select any one of the Golden Buffalo Student Health Insurance Plans (Buff Value, Buff Limited, Buff Max), or to waive the insurance for spring 2004, go to [www.colorado.edu/plus](http://www.colorado.edu/plus). (You need your PIN number.) You may also go to the Golden Buffalo Student Health Insurance Office, located in Wardenburg Health Center 251, to enroll and pay the premium. **Your final deadline to select or waive the insurance is January 21, 2004**. The insurance selected for fall 2003 automatically extends through the spring semester and summer 2004.

### **Exceptions to Automatic Enrollment**

Enrollment is not automatic for the following:

- students taking 5 credits or less (including graduate and law students) must select a plan to be enrolled in the Golden Buffalo Student Health Insurance. The deadline for enrolling is January 21, 2004. This may be done online through the PLUS system (you need your PIN number).

- ACCESS students
- continuing education students
- spouse/domestic partner and dependents
- Semester at Sea students
- study abroad students
- Time Out students

Those in the exception category above must go to the Golden Buffalo Student Health Insurance Office, located in Wardenburg Health Center 251, to enroll and pay the premium and student fees by **January 21, 2004**, for spring 2004 insurance coverage.

### **Review of Student Health Insurance Plans**

You may go online to [www.colorado.edu/stuhealthinsur](http://www.colorado.edu/stuhealthinsur) for more complete information.

**Buff Value** (a supplemental health insurance plan) is an excellent option for those who want health services on campus at the Health Center (Wardenburg) and are covered by other insurance for services off campus. The premium is very reasonable for students, and may be less than the deductible with your current comprehensive insurance plan. Spouse/domestic partner premium charges are additional. This plan is not available for dependents.

**Buff Limited** (a comprehensive plan) may be chosen by those who want increased comprehensive coverage on campus at the Health Center (Wardenburg) and coverage off campus. Spouse/domestic partner and dependent coverage are available for an additional fee. Plan covers \$50,000 per year for each sickness or injury. (See policy for exceptions.)

**Buff Max** (a comprehensive plan) may be helpful for those needing increased comprehensive coverage, both at the Health Center (Wardenburg) and off campus. Spouse/domestic partner and dependent coverage are available for an additional fee. Plan covers up to \$200,000 maximum lifetime benefit for each injury or sickness. (See policy for exceptions.)

In order to provide the highest benefits available, the Health Center (Wardenburg) is the primary care provider (PCP). Wardenburg Health Center is accredited by the Joint Commission for the Accreditation of Health Care Organizations (JCAHO), a national accrediting body. It is a convenient, on-campus health care facility with medical expertise to handle your primary health care and pharmaceutical needs. The staff is composed of board-certified physicians (including an internist, gynecologist, and psychiatrist) nurse practitioners, health educators, and other health care professionals. ## Wardenburg Health Center

As a service of the University of Colorado Student Union, Wardenburg Health Center provides a wide range of fee-for-service medical care including women's health, mental health, sports medicine, psychological health and psychiatry, and dental. Community health education departmental programs and services are free for students. The physicians at the health center are board-certified, and Wardenburg Health Center is accredited by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organization (JCAHO). Student fees support the community health education programs and other services such as the bipolar support groups, cold-care services, diabetes support group, HIV testing, interactive theater, musculoskeletal injury clinic, sexual health, wellness, CU Rape and Gender Education (COURAGE), stop smoking classes, and peer education programs. ### State/CU-Boulder Immunization Requirements Measles, Mumps, and Rubella

All degree-seeking students (including transfer and graduate students) born on or after January 1, 1957, must provide immunization documentation for two rubeola (measles), two rubella (German measles), and two mumps immunizations. **These records must be turned in no later than February 19, 2004, at 5:00 p.m. If these records are not turned in by this deadline, the university will place a "hold" on your spring 2004 registration, and you will be assessed a \$25 fee.** A signed/stamped copy of your immunizations may be obtained from your physician, high school, previous university records, or military records. Immunizations are available at cost through Wardenburg on a walk-in basis. Medical, religious, and personal exemptions are allowed by law. Your immunization record may be faxed to 303-492-1014, mailed, or delivered in person to the Immunization Office, located in Wardenburg Health Center. ### New International Student - Tuberculosis (TB) Testing

The university requires incoming (new) international students from countries where the incidence of TB is high to be tested for TB. Wardenburg Health Center provides TB testing at minimal cost. If your test results are positive and treatment is needed, care is available through the Colorado Department of Health. If you fail to be tested, a stop is placed on your registration for the following semester. For more information, call 303-492-2005.

## Paying Your Bill

**Any student who completes registration agrees to pay the University of Colorado at Boulder according to the payment terms documented under this section.**

### Payment Methods and Locations

- **E-bill and E-check** – For information about viewing and paying bills via the Web: *Students* go to PLUS at [www.colorado.edu/plus](http://www.colorado.edu/plus). *Parents and other third parties* can go to [bursar.colorado.edu](http://bursar.colorado.edu) for more information. Web payments can be made from your personal checking or savings accounts only.
- **Cash** – All payments made by cash must be received at the Office of Cash Management in the lobby of Regent Administrative Center prior to end-of-business on tuition due dates.
- **Check** – Personal, certified, cashier's, traveler's, credit card checks, or money orders made payable to the University of Colorado. Student name and ID number must

be on the check. Mail the check and the top portion of your bill to the Denver post office box noted on the bill. *Do not use campus mail.*

If you write a bad check to the university (regardless of the amount), it is considered nonpayment and nonpayment penalties apply. You may be subject to late and service charges, and a stop is placed on your record. You may also be dropped from your classes. A \$20 returned check charge is assessed, in addition to the amount due to the university. You may also be liable for collection costs, attorney fees, and prosecution under the Colorado Criminal Statutes. Checks are most often returned because deposits have been held. To avoid charges and penalties, call the bank to guarantee immediate availability of funds.

- **Payment Drop Boxes** – Drop your payment in one of two tuition drop boxes located outside at the north and south entrances of Regent Administrative Center.

**The payment deadline is 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, January 21, 2004,** if paid in person or mailed, or before midnight if paid using the E-check option. Postmark dates do not constitute receipt of payment.

## Tuition & Fees

**Scholarship Checks** – Scholarship checks should be made payable to the University of Colorado and sent to Scholarships, University of Colorado at Boulder, 77 UCB, Boulder, CO 80309-0077.

**Do not include scholarship checks with your payment to the Bursar's Office.** If your scholarship check is not received in the financial aid Scholarship Office by the bill due date, you need to make other arrangements to pay your bill to avoid late and service charges. The scholarship is credited when it arrives and, in many cases, may generate a refund on your tuition account.

If no specific instructions are provided by the donor, the financial aid office automatically divides private scholarships of \$500 or more equally between the fall and spring semesters. Private scholarships of less than \$500 are applied in full to the current semester.

Original charges (less any adjustments) are always due by the first bill due date of the semester. Corrected bills are not sent. A second bill reflecting new charges (parking permit, classes added, etc.) is mailed on February 2 and due on February 25. Check PLUS at [www.colorado.edu/plus](http://www.colorado.edu/plus) for a current account balance.

Checks should be written on a U.S. bank and in U.S. funds in order to avoid processing delays of up to three weeks and possible bank fees. If the delay extends beyond the tuition due date, late and service charges are assessed.

**NOTE:** All checks containing restrictive endorsements are null and void and nonbinding on the university.

**If you do not receive a tuition and fee bill, you are still responsible for knowing the amount of your bill and for paying it on time.** To access account status and/or bill information, use any of the following: access PLUS at [www.colorado.edu/plus](http://www.colorado.edu/plus), access your E-bill account after signing up via PLUS, or call toll free 1-877-278-6340 (available 24/7).

The Bursar's Office hours from January 12 to January 16 are Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. On Tuesday, January 20, and Wednesday, January 21, hours are 8:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

The Bursar's Office offers additional assistance to Spanish-speaking students and students with disabilities. If you need assistance, contact the Bursar's Office.

### **Two-Payment Plan**

Besides paying your bill in full, you can pay one-half of your balance due by the first tuition due date and the remaining balance, plus a 1% finance charge, the following month. The minimum balance due is reduced by any credits (financial aid, insurance waiver, RA/TA tuition waivers, and scholarships) applied after your bill is produced. Students can sign up by accessing PLUS at [www.colorado.edu/plus](http://www.colorado.edu/plus), login, then select the Billing and Payment link, select the Two-Payment Plan, and follow the instructions. Submit the request before midnight January 21.

You must pay the balance of your bill, a 1% finance charge, and any new charges added to your bill by February 25.

A second bill reflecting this balance is mailed on February 2. Make sure your billing address is current.

### **Failure to Pay in Full by the Due Date**

A financial stop is placed on your record if you fail to pay your full tuition and fee bill by the published due date or if you fail to make half payment of the balance if you signed up for the Two-Payment Plan. This stop prevents you from:

- registering for future terms
- participating in drop/add
- receiving an academic transcript
- receiving a diploma

In addition, if you are registered for a future term and a financial stop is added to your record, you are at risk of losing those classes.

**Late and Service Charges** – If your payment is late, you are charged a late payment charge and a service charge. The service charge is 1% per month on the unpaid balance. The late charge is assessed according to the following schedule:

Balance Due .....	Late Payment Charge
\$99.99 or less .....	\$ 5
100-299.99 .....	\$10
300-499.99 .....	\$20
500-699.99 .....	\$30
700-899.99 .....	\$40
\$900 and over .....	\$50

All past due accounts are referred to the Student Debt Management (SDM) department for collection after the end of the semester. Past due service charges of 1% continue to accrue monthly, as well as a late charge each semester, as long as the debt is unpaid, and additional collection charges and attorney fees may be assessed.

To dispute a tuition debt, you must make a formal appeal to the Bursar's Office. Disputes will only be considered under extenuating circumstances, such as natural disaster (fire, flood), death in the family, medical, or unexpected financial crisis. Official documentation must be provided to substantiate the circumstances. See [bursar.colorado.edu](http://bursar.colorado.edu) for more details and how to obtain the form.

Colorado law requires the university to place all delinquent accounts with a third party collection agency. Currently, SDM refers accounts to the state's Central Collection Services (CCS) office after one year, unless there exists a satisfactory repayment agreement including a signed contract with the Student Debt Management department in the Bursar's Office. The collection agency reports all past due accounts to national credit bureaus. Financial stops remain on your record until the balance is paid in full. Establishing a repayment agreement does not result in removal of stops. If your account is referred to a collection agency, you must pay any collection costs and attorney fees allowed by the Uniform Consumer Credit Code.

### **Getting Your Refund**

If your tuition account reflects a credit balance, you are entitled to a refund. Direct deposit is the fastest way to get your refund - you avoid postal delays, incorrect addresses, and standing in line. Your account is activated the same day you sign up.

- **Direct Deposit** (preferred method) – If you are currently enrolled for direct deposit or sign up by January 6, and have a credit balance on your tuition account as of January 6, your spring 2004 refund will be deposited into your bank account on or about January 9 (processing times vary per bank). If a credit balance is due to receiving financial aid at the beginning of the semester, a refund will be released

approximately three days prior to the first day of classes. Throughout the semester, whenever your tuition account reflects a credit balance, your refund will be deposited to your bank account in approximately three business days. Sign up for this service via PLUS at [www.colorado.edu/plus](http://www.colorado.edu/plus), select the Billing and Payment link, select Direct Deposit, and follow the instructions.

- **Refund Checks**—If you do not sign up for direct deposit, and your tuition account reflects a credit balance as of January 5, a refund check will be mailed to your local mailing address on January 8. This refund cannot be picked up. Checks over \$15 are mailed to your local mailing address at the end of each month throughout the semester.

### Financial Aid

If you have not yet applied for financial aid, you may still apply by completing the 2003-04 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Students are encouraged to apply by April 1, 2003. Due to funding limitations, some forms of assistance might not be available to late applicants.

Applications are available from the Office of Financial Aid, Regent 175, or on the Web at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). Preapplication worksheets to help with web applications are available at the same web address. For more detailed information, visit the financial aid office, the web site [www.colorado.edu/finaid](http://www.colorado.edu/finaid), or call 303-492-5091.

Financial aid includes grants, scholarships, work-study, and loans, and is usually awarded based on financial need. Grants and university scholarships are automatically applied to your bill. Student and parent loans are credited to your bill after you submit signed promissory notes. Before a promissory note for a parent loan can be signed, a credit check must be completed for the parent borrower. The process for approving a parent loan can take several weeks, so plan accordingly when accepting this type of loan. If your tuition account reflects a credit balance, you are entitled to a refund (see Getting Your Refund on page 28).

### Less Than Full-Time Enrollment

Students have until **Friday, January 30** (the last day to add classes without petitioning their dean), to finalize their fall semester class schedules. **Students who are not enrolled full-time by Friday, January 30, might have their financial aid reduced to reflect their actual enrollment status.** The week of February 2, revised award letters are mailed to students whose aid has been adjusted because they are not enrolled full-time.

Students who have specific questions about how less-than-full-time enrollment affects their financial aid should contact the Office of Financial Aid.

### Short-Term Loans

Short-term loans up to \$500 are available to students during periods of enrollment and between fall and spring semesters. You must be at least 18 and enrolled at least half time on the Boulder campus to qualify (ACCESS and Continuing Education students are not eligible), and you must present your photo ID. All loans must be backed by financial aid or have a cosigner. Apply for short-term loans in the Office of Financial Aid.

### Veteran's Benefits

If you are entitled to veterans' benefits, write Veteran's Services, Office of Financial Aid, University of Colorado at Boulder, 77 UCB, Boulder, CO 80309-0077, or call 303-492-7322 for further information.

### Withdrawing and Financial Aid

The *Withdrawal Policy Regarding Tuition and Fees* states that students who pay their \$200 enrollment deposit and register for classes for any given semester are obligated to pay full tuition and fees for that semester unless they *officially withdraw* from the university. If you begin classes at CU-Boulder, receive financial aid, and then withdraw, your financial aid will be adjusted according to the following federal regulations. (See page 37 for withdrawal procedures.)

### Return of Unearned Title IV Aid

(34 CFR 668.22)

The federal rules state that you earn your aid based on the period of time you remain enrolled.

Enrolled days divided by days in the enrollment period equals the percentage of aid earned.

The Office of Financial Aid calculates the percentage of aid earned using this formula. If you remain enrolled beyond the 60% point, you earn all aid for the period. Aid earned is credited to your tuition and fee bill.

### Repayment of Unearned Aid

(34 CFR 668.22 g,h,i)

The responsibility to repay unearned aid is shared by the institution and the student.

The institution's share is the lesser of:

- the total amount of unearned aid, or
- the institutional charges multiplied by the percentage of aid that was unearned.

The students' share is the difference between the total unearned amount and the institution's share. The institution's share is allocated among the Title IV programs, in an order specified by statute. Any amount owed to a grant program is reduced by half. The same refund and repayment policy applies to state and institutional grants. Refund and repayment of institutional scholarships, athletic scholarships, private scholarships, and third party scholarships is determined by the donor. **(Financial Aid continued on next page)**

This policy applies to students with financial aid who officially withdraw. It may also apply to those who stop attending classes without formally withdrawing. Students who do not formally withdraw are required to document attendance.

Examples of refund calculations are available upon request. Visit with a financial aid counselor for more information regarding your specific situation.

#### Appeals

In the case of a prolonged illness, accident, death in the family, or other circumstances that make it impractical to complete the semester, you may submit an appeal through the Bursar's Office. The Bursar's Office reviews the information provided and determines a settlement that is reasonable and fair to both you and the university.

#### Balances Due

If your withdrawal results in a balance due, a revised tuition and fee bill will be mailed to you by the Bursar's Office. It is your responsibility to repay those funds. To ensure that you receive information in a timely manner, make sure that your address and phone information is up to date.

The following section contains general information related to registration and records.

#### Addresses

The following addresses on your student record must be kept current:

- **Billing address** (your address for tuition and fee bill mailings) – The address you want all of your tuition and fee bills mailed to throughout the year, including the first bill mailing prior to the start of each semester.  
**Exception:** Bills for new students who register at orientation in August or for students who register the second week in January are mailed to your mailing address at the beginning of the semester.  
If no billing address is given, your first bill of each fall or spring semester is mailed to your permanent address and all subsequent bills to your mailing address. If you are enrolled in summer and no billing address is given, all summer bills are sent to your mailing address.
- **Mailing address** (your address during the fall and spring semesters and during the summer months if you're enrolled in summer classes) – Registration information for future semesters, outstanding tuition and fee bills (if you don't have a billing address on record), refund checks, and financial aid information are mailed to you at this address from late August through mid-May (and throughout the summer if you're enrolled in summer classes). **Exception:** Your permanent address is used during the winter semester break.

**NOTE:** An accurate local mailing address is also important in case the university needs to reach you due to a family or personal emergency, so be sure to give the university a local mailing address.

- **Permanent address** (considered your "home-base" address) – It can be your parents' address, a Boulder address, or the address of someone who knows how to reach you. Bills are mailed to this address before the semester begins (unless you specify a billing address). This address is also used for mailings during the summer months and during the winter semester break. **Exception:** If you're enrolled in summer classes, your mailing address is used during the summer months.

You can look up any of your addresses on the Personal Look-Up Services (PLUS) at [www.colorado.edu/plus](http://www.colorado.edu/plus) (see page 34) and, if needed, update your addresses via PLUS. (**Exception:** Foreign addresses cannot be updated via PLUS.) Or you can fill out a change-of-address form at the Office of



**Advising**

Check your invitation to register or registration status on the Web (see page 9) for advising requirements. If advising is required or if you wish to speak with an advisor:

- **Arts and sciences students** – Schedule an appointment to meet with your academic advisor well in advance of registering. To schedule an advising appointment, visit [aac.colorado.edu](http://aac.colorado.edu). Be sure to bring a printout of your degree progress report from PLUS as well as a completed registration form (see page 14), including alternate course selections, to your advising appointment. Remember that advisors' schedules fill very quickly during registration. Make your appointment immediately. If you are planning to change your major, you should do so well in advance of the beginning of the registration period for the following term.
- **Engineering students** – Call your faculty advisor, your major department, or your dean's office for advising.
- **Students in any other college or school** – Call your dean's office.

the Registrar in Regent 105, in the Office of Financial Aid in Regent 175, or by calling 303-492-6970 and pressing 1.

Other offices, such as the library, housing, payroll, and Wardenburg, have separate address systems and changes must be made there as well.)

**NOTE:** The address that appears on your student record (and PLUS) also appears on the directory on CU-Boulder's home page on the Web. When you make a change to any of your addresses, the change is normally updated on your student record within 24 hours. **Exception:** If you update your address via PLUS, your addresses are updated on your student record immediately (real time). Addresses on the web directory are updated within 36 hours.

- **If you do not want your address to be part of directory information**, you may request that limited privacy be put on your record. See pages 32-33 for more information about limited privacy as well as other privacy options under Confidentiality of Student Records.

**Address Rules for International Students**

**Billing Address** – This can be a P.O. Box or local home/residence address. . . .whatever address you want to receive your bills at.

**Mailing Address** – Local home/residence address. International students cannot use a P.O. Box address for the mailing address, but instead must use their actual physical residence.\* This must be the same address that appears on your SEVIS record. If you change your mailing address, you must notify ISSS (International Student and Scholar Services) within ten days.

## General Information

### **Photo ID / Campus Card Program**

The Buff OneCard™ is your official CU-Boulder student ID to be used for your entire career at CU-Boulder. The card is required as official verification of eligibility for many student privileges, including access to the Student Recreation Center, all campus libraries, Wardenburg Health Center, access to housing dining centers, purchasing tickets for athletic events, and riding on local and regional RTD buses.

**Buff OneCard™ Features** – The Buff OneCard™ also offers many convenient, optional programs.

- **Buff Gold™** – links your card to the U of C Federal Credit Union to make it an ATM/Debit card.
- **Buff Points™** – show your card to earn points when purchasing off campus. Points are collected and can be redeemed for special discounts and free merchandise.
- **Buff CallingCard™** – lets you use your card as a long distance calling card that bills you only \$.08/minute, 24 hours a day, nationwide on all your calls.

- **Replacement ID** – If you lose your card or believe it has been stolen, call 303-492-1212 immediately to have the card deactivated. This prevents anyone who finds it from using your card. You can report your card lost or stolen 24 hours a day. You can also deactivate your Buff OneCard at our web site [BuffOneCard.com](http://BuffOneCard.com) using our Online Card Office. You can purchase a replacement Buff OneCard for \$20 at the Campus Card Office.
- **Campus Card Office Location** – The Campus Card Office is located downstairs in the Department of Housing Administrative Area in Hallett Hall, and is open from 8:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, when classes are in session. Office hours and card prices are subject to change.

### **Changing Your College or Major**

If you want to transfer into another CU-Boulder college or school, check with the new dean's office for admission criteria and information on enrollment levels, application procedures, and deadlines. If you are an undergraduate student and have already submitted an IUT (intrauniversity transfer) application, register as if you have been accepted into the new college or school.

#### **NOTE:**

- You might not be able to register for some courses until you have been accepted into your new college or school. Once you are accepted, you may change your schedule through the drop/add deadline. If you want to change or declare a major, go to the new major department for the required procedures.
- If you are receiving financial aid and are working on two majors (same degree) or a major and a minor and don't plan to graduate from both programs at the same time, your financial aid might be affected. For more information, contact the Office of Financial Aid in Regent 175, or call 303-492-5091.

### **Computer Labs**

You can use any of ITS' or housing's computing labs to access the Internet and register online. Labs that are maintained by housing are in every residence hall. ITS labs are located in other buildings across campus including Business, Clare Small

Arts and Sciences, Duane Physics, Economics, Education, Ekeley Sciences, Engineering, Environmental Design, Fleming Law, Hellems, Macky, Muenzinger, and Norlin Library. See the ITS web site at [www.colorado.edu/its/labs](http://www.colorado.edu/its/labs) for a complete list of ITS computer lab sites.

You can also access the online registration page from your residence hall room using Ethernet connectivity (go to [www.colorado.edu/totalcomm](http://www.colorado.edu/totalcomm) for further details) or from off-campus locations by dialing into the modem pool (go to [www.colorado.edu/its/docs](http://www.colorado.edu/its/docs) for instructions).

### **Confidentiality of Student Records**

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords you certain rights with respect to your education records. They are:

- 1) The right to inspect and review your education records within 45 days of the day the university receives a request for access.

You should submit to the registrar, dean, head of the academic department, or other appropriate official, a written request that identifies the record(s) you wish to inspect. The university official will make arrangements for access and notify you of the time and place where the records may be inspected. If the records are not maintained by the university official to whom the request was submitted, that official shall advise you of the correct official to whom the request should be addressed.

- 2) The right to request the amendment of your education records that you believe are inaccurate or misleading. You may ask the university to amend a record that you believe is inaccurate or misleading. You should write the university official responsible for the record, clearly identify the part of the record you want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading.

If the university decides not to amend the record as requested by you, the university will notify you of the decision and advise you of your right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to you when notified of the right to a hearing.

- 3) The right to consent of disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in your education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent. One exception that permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the university in an administrative, supervisory, academic, or research or support staff position (including law enforcement unit personnel and health staff); a person or company with whom the university has contracted (such as an attorney, auditor, or collection agent; employment or degree verification agencies such as the National Student Loan Clearinghouse and Credentials, Inc.); a person serving on the Board of Regents; the Alumni Association and Foundation on the Boulder campus; a student employee; or a student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or one assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks. In addition, your records may be disclosed to your parent(s) upon request if your parent(s) claim you as a dependent for income tax purposes.

A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.

Upon request, the university discloses education records without consent to officials of another school in which a student seeks or intends to enroll.

- 4) The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the university to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the office that administers FERPA is:

**The following items of student information have been designated by the University of Colorado at Boulder as public or "directory" information:** name, mailing and permanent addresses, local telephone number, campus e-mail address, dates of attendance, registration status, class, previous educational institutions attended, major field of study, awards, honors, degree(s) conferred, past and present participation in officially recognized sports and activities, physical factors (height, weight) of athletes, date and place of birth, and names of student tutors and teaching/research assistants. Such information may be disclosed by the institution at its discretion. Buff OneCard photos and numbers (not social security numbers) are not considered directory information but are shared with other campus departments and associates of the Buff OneCard program.

#### **Privacy Designations**

You have the right to withhold directory information from inquirers by selecting a privacy or limited-privacy option. The privacy option will prevent all directory and enrollment information from being released to all who do not have a clear educational interest for access to this information. The limited-privacy option will prevent the release of directory information to off-campus vendors requesting release of names and addresses for bulk mailings and to campus directory services, but is not as restrictive as the privacy option. Requests for either privacy or limited-privacy designation on the educational record can be made at the Office of the Registrar, Regent 105, between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Students also have the option to complete a form that gives parents, as listed as mother or father only on the Student Information System, access to educational records. This form is available in the Office of the Registrar. Students must bring in proper identification when making any of these requests. For more information, go to [www.registrar.colorado.edu/support/privacy.htm](http://www.registrar.colorado.edu/support/privacy.htm).

#### **Release of Disciplinary Information**

Provisions of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, as amended by the Higher Education Amendments of 1998, govern access to a student's disciplinary file. The student and/or those university officials who demonstrate a legitimate educational need for disciplinary information may have access to the student's disciplinary file. Parent(s), who provide proof that a student is a dependent as defined in Section 152 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (i.e., a copy of the last federal income tax return listing the student as a dependent), can have access to the student's disciplinary file

without written consent of the student. In this case, parents may also have access to a disciplinary file, even if the student has requested otherwise.

In addition, parent(s) may be notified if a student under 21 is found responsible for a violation involving use or possession of alcohol and controlled substances.

The Campus Security Act permits higher education institutions to disclose to alleged victims of any crime of violence (murder, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, motor vehicle theft) the results of the conduct proceedings conducted by the institution against an alleged perpetrator with respect to such crime. The Campus Security Act also requires that both the accused and the accuser be informed of campus conduct proceedings involving a sexual assault.

Additionally, the Higher Education Amendments of 1998 permit disclosure of the final results of disciplinary cases in which a student has been found responsible for a violation involving violence or for a sex offense.

#### **Credit-Hour Limits and Course-Load Definitions**

During the registration period (which begins November 3), undergraduate students can register for a maximum of 19 credit hours (15 credit hours for graduate students and 16 credit hours for law students), including wait-listed courses.

**During the final drop/add period** (beginning January 9), undergraduates are allowed to register for up to 21 credit hours, including wait-listed courses. **NOTE:** A tuition surcharge is assessed for every credit hour added over 18.

For undergraduate students, 12 credit hours is considered a full-time load for financial aid and for enrollment verification purposes. Graduate students qualify for full-time status for enrollment verification purposes if they are enrolled for 5 or more hours or any number of thesis hours. Law students need 10 or more hours for full-time status. Check with the Office of Financial Aid for full- and part-time status definitions for graduate students.

#### **Credit and Grading Options**

You can select the following credit and grading options via web registration when you register for courses. To make changes to credit and grading options on a course in which you are already enrolled, go to the registrar's office in Regent 105 by **5:00 p.m. on Friday, January 30.**

**NOTE:** If you want to change the status of a course from or to pass/fail or no credit you should come to the registrar's office in Regent 105 to fill out a credit-option change form by the deadline. If you attempt to make the change via web registration, you will not be able to re-enroll in the course if it is closed or a wait list exists for the course. By filling out the credit-option change form in the registrar's office, you can make this change without jeopardizing your enrollment in the course.

- **No Credit** – To register for a course on a no-credit basis, select the no-credit option when registering via the Web. You still pay full tuition for a no-credit course, but you do not receive a grade. An *NC* appears on your transcript in place of a grade. Check with your college or school for policies on no-credit status and how it may be used. No-credit courses do not count toward full-time enrollment for financial aid purposes. **The deadline to designate or remove no-credit status on courses is 5:00 p.m. on Friday, January 30. (See NOTE above.)**
- **Pass/Fail** – Check with your college or school for the restrictions on the number and types of courses that can be

taken pass/fail. To register for a course pass/fail, select the pass/fail option when registering via the Web.

Once you have signed up for a course on a pass/fail basis, it is not noted on class rosters or final-grade lists, nor should your instructor be notified that you are taking the course pass/fail. You are assigned a grade for the course. A grade of *D-* or above is converted to a *P*; an *F* remains an *F*. Only the *F* is calculated as part of your GPA; a grade of *P* is not counted. **The deadline to designate or remove pass/fail status on courses is 5:00 p.m. on Friday, January 30. (See NOTE on page 33.)**

- **Variable Credit** – All independent study courses and some regular courses are offered on a variable-credit basis (that is, they have a range of minimum and maximum credits). When you register via the Web for a variable credit course, enter the number of credit hours you want to receive for the course when prompted. The number of credits can be changed at the registrar's office during the registration and drop/add periods through **5:00 p.m., January 30.**

### **Degree Progress Reports**

Degree progress (degree audit) reports are available for most students on the Web at [www.colorado.edu/plus](http://www.colorado.edu/plus). You will need to enter your PIN to access your report. A degree progress report tracks progress for a specific major, program, or degree. Your report will list requirements you still need, as well as all requirements that you have successfully completed, showing courses and their grades. The information in your report is real-time and is revised as information on the official student database is updated. Note that your report may not include special circumstances such as substitutions, waivers, etc.

### **E-Mail Policy**

E-mail is an official means of communication from CU-Boulder administrators and faculty to students. All students have an official CU-Boulder e-mail address. Students are expected to check their CU-Boulder e-mail on a frequent and consistent basis in order to stay current with university related communications.

### **Grade Information**

To see your grades at the end of the semester:

- Look up your grades on PLUS on the Web at [www.colorado.edu/plus](http://www.colorado.edu/plus).

**NOTE:** Spring semester 2004 grades will be available on PLUS beginning May 7.

#### **Order official transcripts by:**

The above methods for ordering official transcripts are free of charge and are normally processed within four business days and sent by first class mail. Contact 303-492-8987, or visit our web site at [www.registrar.colorado.edu/support/transcripts.htm](http://www.registrar.colorado.edu/support/transcripts.htm) for rush service information.

**Order an unofficial transcript** for \$1 (next-day service) or \$5 (same-day service) at the transcript window, Regent lobby. Unofficial transcripts are not mailed off campus.

## **Graduation**

If you plan to graduate within the next year, you must check with your dean's office for graduation application deadlines and notification procedures.

Graduating students with Federal Perkins/NDSL loans must complete a loan exit interview before leaving the university.

**NOTE:** If you are receiving financial aid and are working on two majors (same degree) or a major and a minor and don't plan to graduate from both programs at the same time, your financial aid might be affected. For more information, contact the Office of Financial Aid (Regent 175), or call 303-492-5091.

You can view the following information on PLUS (Personal Look-up Services) on the World Wide Web by using your university student number and personal identification number (PIN):

**You can also update your addresses, change your PIN, order a transcript, and select or waive your health insurance.**

### **Registrar's Home Page**

### **Student Portal Available in the Spring**

CU Connect, the new CU-Boulder student portal, will be available spring semester 2004. CU Connect will offer a single, secure entry point for most of the information and services that you need as a CU-Boulder student. Features within the CU Connect student portal include: vital announcements, PLUS services, the current semester academic calendar, your student schedule, a course lookup tool, a gpa calculator, Web Mail, campus news, student employment listings, links to student services offices and much more. CU Connect will be available at <https://cuconnect.colorado.edu>



A number of different registrations are held each semester for specific categories of students. If you have questions about any of these registrations, call the number listed in that section or see the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog*.

### **ACCESS Registration**

Individuals not enrolled in a degree program at CU-Boulder (nondegree students) may take Boulder main campus classes through ACCESS (Available Credit Courses for Eligible Special Students). Interested students should visit the ACCESS web site at [colorado.edu/conted/access.htm](http://colorado.edu/conted/access.htm), stop by the Division of Continuing Education at 1505 University Avenue, or call 303-492-5148 for information on ACCESS eligibility and registration. Registration begins Friday, January 9, 2004, and classes begin Monday, January 12. Nonresident, nondegree students may register for 3 credit hours or less through ACCESS and be assessed a rate less than regular nonresident tuition.

### **Audit Card Program**

Individuals aged 18-54 who wish to attend regularly scheduled classes and who are not registered students must obtain an audit card. Auditors, in-state or out-of-state, pay in-state tuition for 3 semester hours per term (regardless of the number of class hours taken) and receive class instruction and library privileges only. An auditor's card must be presented to the instructor on the first day of class. Auditors must get permission from the professor to audit a class prior to purchasing the audit card. Once an audit card is purchased there can be no refund. Cards may be obtained from Student Billing in the Bursar's Office in Regent Administrative Center on the first day of classes. For more information, call Student Billing at 303-492-5381 or 1-877-278-6340.

### **Concurrent Registration**

If you plan to take at least one course at CU-Boulder in the spring and cannot register for all courses required for your degree program, you might be able to register concurrently on another CU campus. The course(s) must be required for your degree program, you must have your dean's permission, and enrollment levels must not have been reached on the other campus. Graduate students must have their advisor's approval. If all these conditions are met, you may register on another CU campus for up to two courses or 6 credit hours, whichever is greater.

You cannot register concurrently until the final drop/add period has begun on the other campus. Boulder students pay Boulder tuition rates for all courses.

Concurrent registration forms and instructions are available at the registrar's office in Regent 105 beginning December 1. For information, call 303-492-5747.

**NOTE:** Graduate students should check with the Office of the Registrar for exceptions to the home-campus registration requirement and limitation on credit hours at the host campus.

### **Course Forgiveness**

The course forgiveness pilot program will undergo a four-campus vote by university faculty during the fall semester 2003 to determine if the program will continue. At the time of printing of this registration handbook, we have no information available as to whether or not this program will be available after fall semester 2003. Continue to check the registrar's web site to determine the status of this program ([registrar.colorado.edu/Support/courseforgiveness.htm](http://registrar.colorado.edu/Support/courseforgiveness.htm)).


### **Course Reservation Program**

The course reservation program allows you reserve space in a course you need to graduate, and enroll in that course for the next semester, before the next registration period begins. All undergraduate courses offered at CU-Boulder that use wait lists, except controlled enrollment courses, are included in the course reservation program.

You are eligible to participate in the course reservation program for **fall semester 2004** if your name is on a wait list for a course as of 5:00 p.m. on January 21 (the spring semester wait list deadline), and you don't get enrolled in the course.

**NOTE:** This applies only to course wait lists on the Student Information System (SIS), not wait lists that might be kept manually by a department.

If you are on a course wait list as of 5:00 p.m. on January 21 and don't get into the class, you should plan to come into the registrar's office, Regent 105, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., March 15-25, to register for the course for fall 2004. Registrations are not honored through the course reservation program after March 25. In addition, all restrictions are honored, and you must clear up any "stops" before registering. You register for all other fall 2004 courses during your regular registration time assignment.

## Other Registration Programs

### **Faculty and Staff Tuition Benefit**

If you are a permanent faculty or classified staff member at the university, an instructor, a professional research assistant, a professional exempt, or professional research associate employed on a continuous basis for 12 months, and are half time or greater, you may take up to 6 free credit hours each year; however, you are charged any applicable course fees. The academic year begins with summer session. The number of free hours is prorated based on full-time employment status. Enrollment is on a space-available basis beginning the Sunday before the first day of classes. **If you register before Sunday, January 11, you are charged full tuition and fees.**

### **Tuition Benefits and Registration Procedures**

All permanent faculty and classified staff who wish to use their tuition benefits must complete tuition waiver forms signed by their supervisors, verifying the course is job related or career enhancing. All students except continuing students (i.e., students who were enrolled in the fall or summer semester) must also turn in the appropriate application to the Bursar's Office. Submit forms by December 17, 2003. **Applications and waivers received after this date cannot be guaranteed registration on Sunday, January 11.** Registration information is available on the web site at [bursar.colorado.edu](http://bursar.colorado.edu) under the Faculty/Staff Information link. You may also call 303-492-5381.

### **High School Concurrent Program**

High school students interested in the challenge of university course work may enroll in credit courses at the University of Colorado at Boulder through the High School Concurrent Program. In addition to earning college credit, students may also earn credit toward high school graduation requirements. Registration is available through the Division of Continuing Education. For information on eligibility and registration, call 303-492-5148, or visit the high school concurrent web site at [www.colorado.edu/conted/hsconcur.htm](http://www.colorado.edu/conted/hsconcur.htm).

### **Intercampus Registration**

If you want to take course work on another University of Colorado campus but not go through the concurrent registration program, apply for admission to that campus, and follow its registration procedures. Check with your dean's office for approval. (Students in the College of Arts and Sciences may not register at the Denver or Colorado Springs campus except in the summer.)

### **Late Registration**

To be guaranteed enrollment for spring 2004, you must complete registration by **6:00 p.m. on January 8**. If you do not register by this deadline (this includes graduate students), you are subject to late registration. Only students in open categories are eligible for late registration. In addition, a lower registration priority and a **\$50 late fee** are applied.

If you are a continuing student, call 303-492-6970 on January 9 to see if you are eligible for late registration. If you are a new or readmitted student, go to the Office of Admissions in Regent 125 (303-492-6301) on January 9 to check for eligibility. Students who are eligible for late registration must go to the registrar's office in Regent 105, to be set up for late registration.

### **Parking Permits and Bicycle Registration**

For information concerning the Spring 2004 Student Parking Permit Sale, visit our web site at [ucbparking.colorado.edu/students](http://ucbparking.colorado.edu/students).

Semester permit rates are \$89.25, \$114.75, \$136, and \$144.50. Motorcycle permits for the semester (January through May) cost \$48. You can pay with cash, check, credit card (VISA, MasterCard, or American Express) or charge it to your student bill. All prices are subject to change.

### **Bike Registration**

- Many homeowners and renters insurance policies will cover your bike if it's stolen and has been registered.
- Bicycle registration is good for 4 years and only costs \$5.
- Money from bicycle registration helps build bicycle facilities, including bike racks and paths.
- Bicycle registration is mandatory at CU-Boulder.

To register your bicycle on campus, visit the Bike Booth or call 303-735-2705. Bring your bicycle and a photo ID to register.

### **Consider Other Alternatives to Driving**

Buses and shuttles on many routes throughout Boulder, to outlying cities, and even between Boulder and the airport, make it easy to get around without a car. Your student bus pass allows you to ride free throughout the Regional Transportation District's system.

### **Senior Citizens Auditors Program Registration**

All Colorado residents 55 and older can register in this tuition-free, noncredit program to audit classes on a space-available basis. This program is sponsored by the CU-Boulder Alumni Association. Registration for senior auditors is at Koenig Alumni Center, Tuesday, January 20, 9:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m., and Wednesday, January 21, 9:00 a.m.-noon. Call 303-492-8484 for information.

### **Time Out Program**

The Time Out Program (TOP) provides an opportunity for you to take a leave from the university for a semester or a year without losing your place in your current college or school. You must be in good academic standing and have your dean's approval. As a TOP student, you are guaranteed a place in your current college or school and major, provided you meet registration and deposit deadlines. When you register for your return semester, you will be given the same registration priority as other continuing students. A nonrefundable \$40 application fee is charged for the TOP program. **The TOP early application deadline** (the deadline to be assured a continuing student registration time assignment for spring semester) is **February 25**. The last day for students to apply for spring semester is **April 30**. More information is available from the Office of the Registrar, Regent 105, 303-492-8673, or e-mail [timeout@colorado.edu](mailto:timeout@colorado.edu). The TOP application and brochure are available on the Web at [registrar.colorado.edu/support/timeout.htm](http://registrar.colorado.edu/support/timeout.htm).

**NOTE: TOP is not a method of withdrawal from the university.** If you are registered for the semester you plan to begin TOP, refer to the information under Withdrawal Procedures. (See page 37.)

## Withdrawal Procedures

If you need to withdraw from all of your courses for spring semester 2004, you can do one of the following. (**NOTE:** In all withdrawal correspondence, be sure to include your name, student ID number, the semester from which you want to withdraw, your signature, and forwarding address.)

- Fill out a withdrawal form in the registrar's office in Regent 105.
- Write a letter to the Withdrawal Coordinator, Office of the Registrar, University of Colorado at Boulder, 20 UCB, Boulder, CO 80309-0020.  
(Exception: Nondegree students withdraw through Continuing Education, 1505 University Ave., University of Colorado at Boulder, 178 UCB, Boulder, CO 80309-0178.)
- Fax a letter of withdrawal to 303-492-8748.
- E-mail a statement of withdrawal (if the e-mail account is in your name) to [withdraw@colorado.edu](mailto:withdraw@colorado.edu).

You need not drop your courses; this is done for you. Also, be sure to refer to the withdrawal Refund or Assessment Schedule on this page.

If you are registered for courses and do not officially withdraw from the university by contacting the registrar's office, failing grades are recorded for all of your courses.

### NOTE:

- Deadlines and rules for withdrawing may vary within each college and school. Check with your dean's office concerning withdrawal rules.
- If you drop all your courses and don't reregister, you are considered withdrawn from the university and you should notify the registrar's office. (See withdrawal procedures on the previous page.)
- If you withdraw from CU-Boulder but plan to return to the Boulder main campus in the future, you must either go on the Time Out Program or reapply through the Office of Admissions. (Students remaining enrolled in only Continuing Education classes must still either reapply or go on TOP to return to Boulder main campus.)

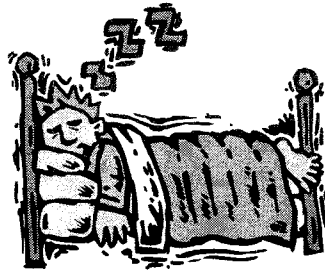
**Withdrawing students who have financial aid** should refer to pages 29–30 for tuition assessment information.

Withdrawing students (including students applying for the Time Out Program) with Federal Perkins/NDSL loans must complete a loan exit interview before leaving the university. Failure to do so results in a stop on your record. This stop prevents you from receiving a diploma or an academic transcript of work at the university and from registering for any future terms. In order to complete a loan exit interview, contact the Student Loan Department in the Bursar's Office at 303-492-5571 or 1-800-925-9844.

January 2	Full refund of the \$200 enrollment deposit (continuing students only). Note: The deadline to withdraw and receive a deposit refund also applies to students planning to go on the Time Out Program. New, readmitted, and transfer students are not eligible for a refund.
January 3–28	\$200 in tuition and fees are assessed. (The enrollment deposit is applied to this charge.) Note: Nondegree students are not assessed a financial penalty if they withdraw by January 28.
January 29–February 11	40 percent of tuition and fees* is assessed or the \$200 enrollment deposit, whichever is greater.
February 12–25	60 percent of full tuition and fees* is assessed or the \$200 enrollment deposit, whichever is greater.
February 26 through the last day of classes.	No refund: 100 percent of tuition and fees due.

## Understanding Course Numbers

Courses are numbered according to the following guidelines:

- 1000-2999 Lower-division courses
- 3000-4999 Upper-division courses
- 5000-5999 Courses intended for graduate students and qualified undergraduates
- 6000-8999 Courses open to graduate students only

Enrollment in courses with a 700-, 800-, or 900-level section number is controlled by each department. The department staff will either give you the five-digit course call number that will permit you to register for the course directly via web registration, or they will give you a special action form to take to the registrar's office.

## Understanding Course Listings

The headers at the top of each column of the course listings include:

**Core Diamonds**—A diamond (◆) appears to the left of courses that fulfill a College of Arts and Sciences core curriculum requirement. (Refer to the Leeds School of Business degree requirements brochure for information on courses that fulfill the business core curriculum requirements.)

**Course Title**—Often abbreviated; refer to the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog* for the complete title and course description.

**Section Number**—This three-digit number refers to the specific meeting pattern of the course. A single three-digit number is the lecture number. When an R, L, P, or S precedes the section number, it indicates that the section is a recitation (R), a laboratory (L), a practicum (P), or a studio (S), which must be taken in addition to the lecture. Some courses might have three: lecture, lab, and recitation.

**Call Number**—The five-digit number, specific to a particular term, that is used for requesting a specific section of a course via web registration.

**Time/Days**—Meeting time and days of the class (M—Monday; T—Tuesday; W—Wednesday; R—Thursday; F—Friday; S—Saturday; and U—Sunday).

**Building/Room**—The building name and room number where the class meets; this is subject to change. (See page 45 for the building abbreviations.)

**Maximum Enrollment**—The maximum number of students allowed to enroll in the course.

**Notes**—When a course has a prerequisite and/or a corequisite, a note (in italics) appears just after the course title. Additional course notes are inserted into each course listing, as needed, e.g., exam dates, etc.

**Department Headings**—These include the phone number and the department location.

**Service Learning**—An (SL) next to the title designates a Service Learning course. Students might be expected to complete curriculum-relevant service in the community that will be incorporated into the final grade. For more information, see Service Learning Program in the CU-Boulder catalog.

The core curriculum must be satisfied by all students in the College of Arts and Sciences who began their undergraduate study in the summer of 1988 or later. Those students who finished high school in the spring of 1988 or later must also meet the college's minimum academic preparation standards, or MAPS (see page 125). You must take one course per MAPS deficiency per term. **Please note the following change in policy: if you complete a course approved to fulfill a MAPS deficiency and that course is also approved to fulfill a Core area, that course can be used to fulfill both the Core requirement and the MAPS deficiency. This change in policy applies to all Arts and Sciences students who are subject to MAPS. Please contact your academic advisor for additional information.**

There are eleven requirements of the core curriculum—four in skills acquisition and seven in the content areas of study. The requirements are all listed here, with instructions and lists of courses that will fulfill each requirement. For a complete explanation of graduation requirements in the College of Arts and Sciences, see the University of Colorado catalog.

Selected majors and the EPOB minor are exempt from portions of the core curriculum (see sections 6, 8, 9 and 10 of the content areas of study). Content area exemptions may be used cumulatively if you are graduating with more than one eligible major or the EPOB minor. Although a single course may appear in several areas, you may use it to meet only one core requirement.

## Skills Acquisition

### 1. Foreign Language

While in high school, all students are required to demonstrate third-level proficiency in a single modern or classical foreign language. If you have not met this requirement at the time you enter the college, you are required to meet the deficiency by passing an appropriate third-semester college course or by passing a CU-Boulder-approved equivalency examination. No more than two lower-division courses may be taken from any single department (1-credit-hour laboratory/field experience courses are excepted).

Students who graduate with a major in the natural sciences (Biochemistry, Chemistry, EPOB, Geology, Kinesiology, MCDB, or Physics) or students who graduate with a minor in EPOB are exempt from completing the natural science requirement.

### Minimum Academic Preparation Standards

All new students entering the University of Colorado who finished high school in the spring of 1988 or later must meet the Minimum Academic Preparation Standards (MAPS) specified by their school or college. The purpose of these standards is to assure that all students have some core knowledge in common.

The College of Arts and Sciences has adopted the following standards for admissions. These standards are defined in high school years.

English	4 high school years (including 2 in composition)
Mathematics	3 high school years (2 in algebra and 1 in geometry)
Natural Science	3 high school years (including 2 in lab science, one of which must be chemistry or physics)
Social Science	3 high school years (including one of U.S. or world history and one of geography. A student who has U.S. history may use 1/2 year of world history and 1/2 year of geography instead of one year of geography.)
Foreign Language	completion of a third-year-level course (level III) in a high school foreign language sequence

### Policies Concerning the Completion of MAPS

If you were admitted to the College of Arts and Sciences with missing MAPS courses, you are subject to the following policies:

1. Each year of missing high school work can be made up by one semester of appropriate CU-Boulder course work.
  2. All course work taken toward fulfillment of the MAPS must be taken for a letter grade, and you must receive a passing grade.
  3. You are required to enroll in and complete at least one MAPS course each term, beginning in your first term of enrollment, until such time as all MAPS requirements are completed. This policy applies to new freshmen, transfer students, and students transferring from other colleges or schools on the Boulder campus and from other campuses of the University. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in suspension at the end of the term in which you cease to complete missing MAPS courses.
  4. All students who first enroll in one college or school at CU-Boulder and who subsequently transfer to another college or school are required to meet the MAPS specified for the new college or school, whether or not they have completed their MAPS courses in their previous college or school.
  5. Double-degree students must meet MAPS requirements of both degree-granting colleges or schools.
  6. During the arts and sciences orientation, students must consult with a CU-Boulder academic advisor to determine which specific courses may be used to meet a MAPS requirement.
  7. If you complete a course approved to fulfill a MAPS deficiency and that course also is approved to fulfill a core area, that course can be used to fulfill both the core requirement and the MAPS deficiency. This change in policy applies to all Arts and Sciences students who are subject to MAPS.
