The **Research & Innovation Office**'s **Research Development** team helps faculty by sponsoring and identifying funding opportunities, developing grant-seeking capacity among investigators, providing support for proposal development and facilitating multidisciplinary collaborations.

Internal Funding Opportunities

- ▶ Research & Innovation Seed Grants: Up to \$50K to catalyze new areas of research, scholarship and creative work across all disciplines.
- New Frontiers Grants: Up to \$50K in planning grants and \$200K in launch funding to stimulate new research strengths for interdisciplinary teams.
- ▶ **AB Nexus Grants**: Up to \$125K to expand collaboration between the CU Anschutz and CU Boulder campuses.
- Arts & Humanities Grants: Up to \$7.5K to foster the advancement of arts- and humanities-related scholarship, research and creative pursuits.
- Core Facilities Assistance Grants: Funding to enhance core and shared instrumentation facilities at CU Boulder.
- Faculty Conference Awards: Up to \$3K for planning and hosting conferences at CU Boulder. Matching funds required.
